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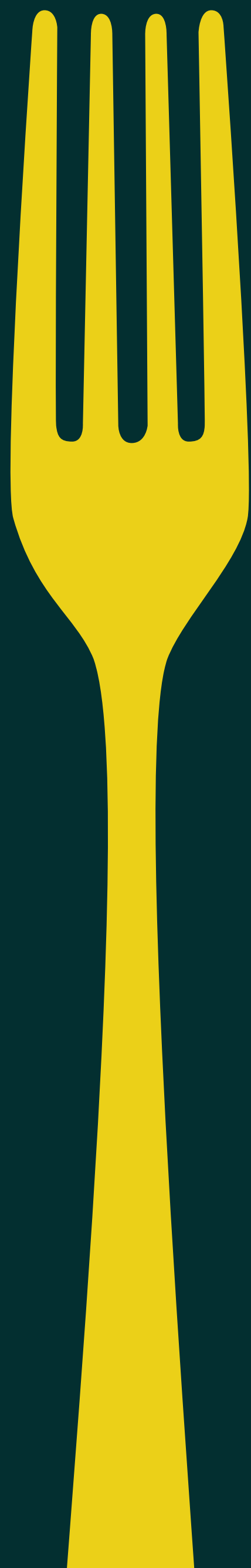

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HOLLYWOOD STUDIOS— RESTAURANT OVERVIEW

Welcome to the “Hollywood that never was—and always will be.” As a tribute to the Golden Age of Hollywood, Disney’s Hollywood Studios boasts eating establishments that are uniquely themed.

Although this park might be best known for exciting roller coasters and immersive lands, that doesn’t mean you should sleep on the eats here! At the very least, you’ll need some energy to get you from Rock ‘n’ Roller Coaster to Star Wars: Rise of the Resistance to The Twilight Zone Tower of Terror to Slinky Dog Dash...you get the picture.

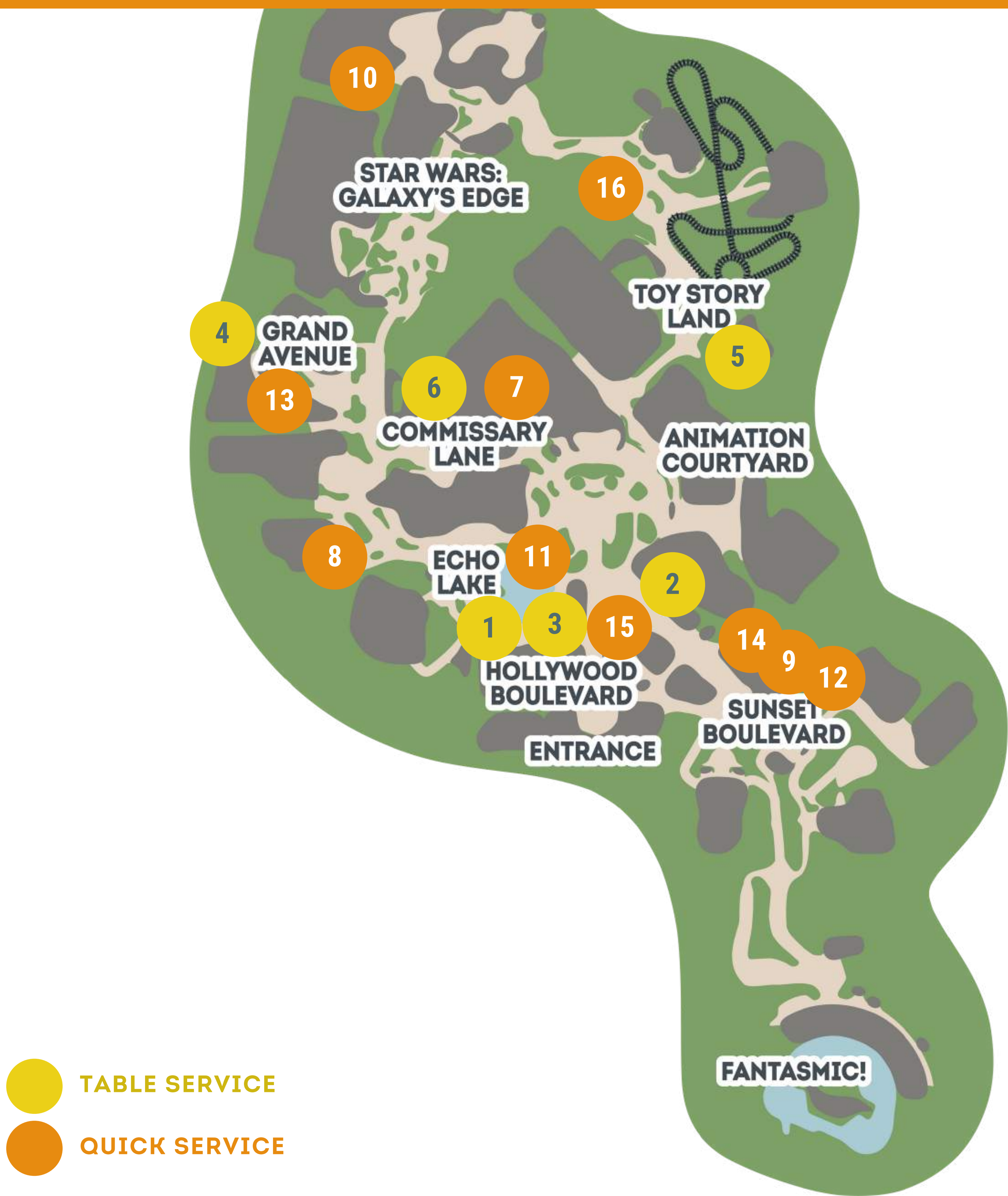

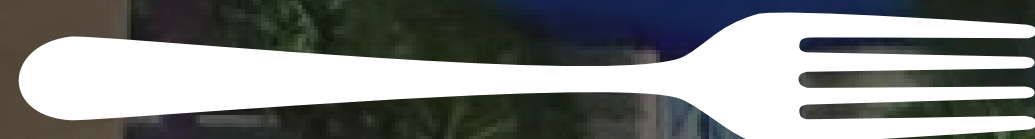


RESTAURANT MAP

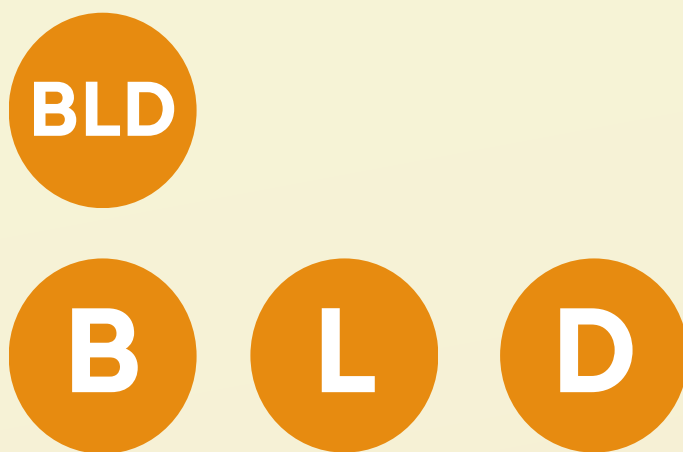

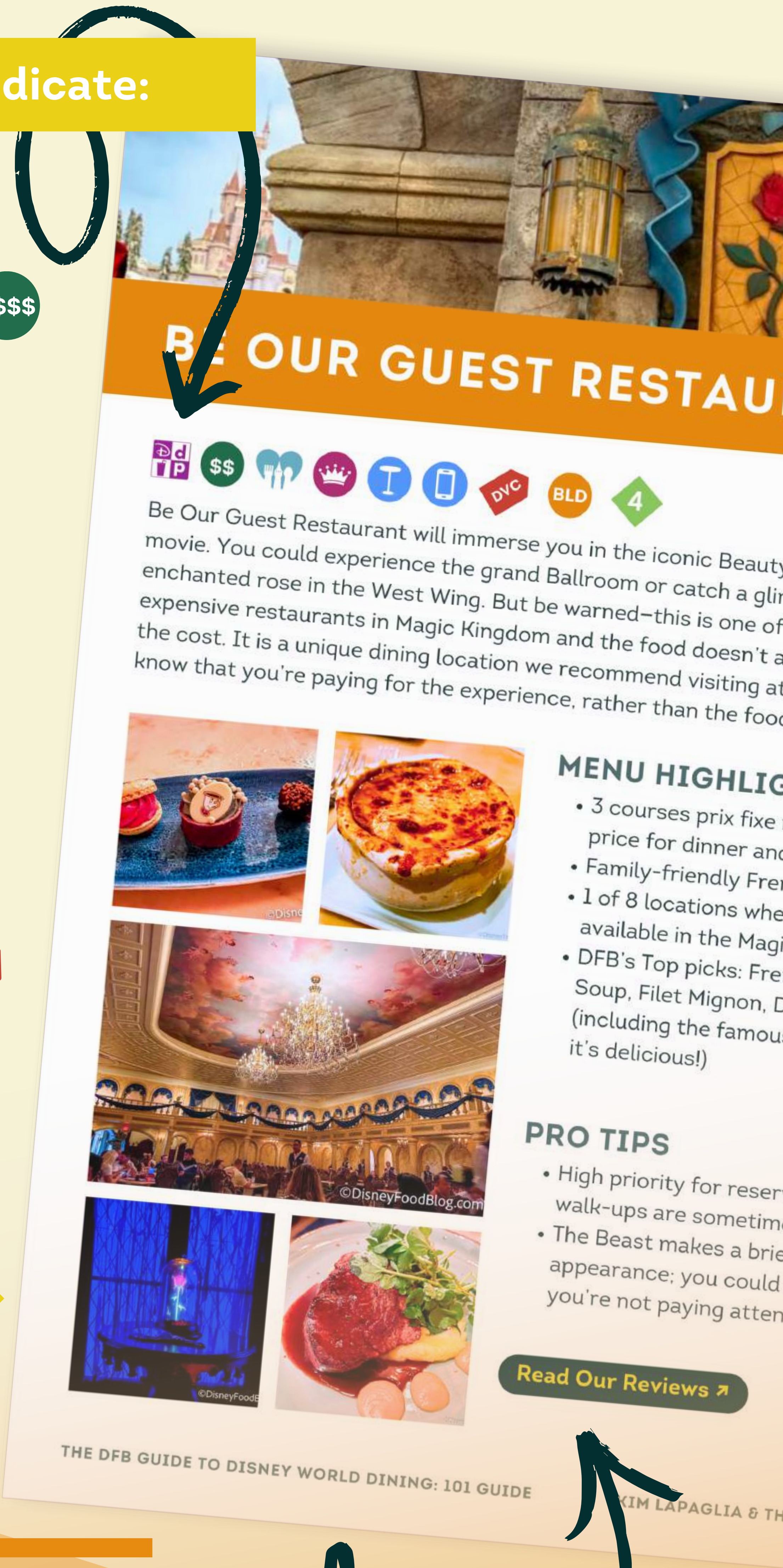

HOW TO USE OUR GUIDE

There is a LOT of information about Disney food and dining options out there, but we've broken down some of the key details you need to know to make the best dining choices for your group. So, let's dive in!

First, you'll notice that we have a smattering of symbols at the top of the restaurant and other dining location pages. These are quick indicators of what you need to know. Most of them are self-explanatory, but we'll give you a rapid rundown of them.



Disney Dining Plan Accepted

- This indicates that the restaurant accepts credits from the Disney Dining Plan. **IMPORTANT:** The location might accept Snack Credits, Table Service credits, Quick Service credits, or a mix. This symbol only indicates that **the location accepts some form of Disney Dining Plan credits**, but you'll want to verify what type of credits are accepted, how many might be needed, and if there are any specific restrictions as to what dishes qualify.
- **PRO TIP:** For locations accepting Mobile Order via the My Disney Experience app, use the app to create a sample mobile order. That can let you see what might qualify as a snack credit.

If you're paying out of pocket, this will help you know approximately how much to budget if you plan to dine at this location.

DFB Favorite

We've eaten it ALL, and there are some spots we keep coming back to because they are just THAT GOOD! If you want to know our favorites, just be on the lookout for this symbol. Keep in mind that while restaurants marked with this symbol might be our favorites, that doesn't mean that the other restaurants are bad. Other spots might have some seriously delicious eats too! Or those other spots might have more standard eats that are just what your group needs. It's all about finding what suits you best. We've got our favorites, but we can't wait to hear all about yours.



Character Meal

Dining with the characters is a unique and quintessential Disney World vacation experience.



Mobile Order

Mobile Order allows you to pre-order and pre-pay for your food via the My Disney Experience app (which you'll use on your mobile device) for participating Quick Service restaurants around Disney World.



HOW TO USE OUR GUIDE

SERVICE TYPE

Disney offers three primary dining service types: Snack, Quick Service, and Table Service.



Snack: This is typically the category for those little carts or kiosks you'll find around the parks. Think popcorn or ice cream carts.



Quick Service: For these spots, you'll typically order at a counter (or on your mobile device), collect your own food, and seat yourself. Think fast food, but Disney-fied.



Table Service: At these restaurants, you'll be seated for your meal and waited on by servers. This service type includes buffets, character meals, and fancy signature dining spots.

DISCOUNTS

Some restaurants offer discounts if you are a member of a certain group. Those discounts tend to range from 10%-20%. There may be restrictions on the discounts in terms of what is included, whether it applies to just one meal time or another, and whether there are blackout dates. You can check on the [Disney World](#), [Annual Passholder](#), [Disney Vacation Club](#), and [Disney Visa websites](#) for details. The red tags indicate which groups get discounts at these locations:



DVC: Disney Vacation Club members

HOW TO USE OUR GUIDE

Meal Times Available

Not every location is open for every meal. We'll indicate which meal each location serves with these letters:

- B Breakfast** (we'll typically use this for any spot that is open any time before 11AM)
- L Lunch** (we'll typically use this for any spot that is open between 11AM-4PM)
- D Dinner** (we'll typically use this for any spot that is open 4PM and on)

Some restaurants may serve brunch (every day or only on select days) in addition to other meals (particularly a few restaurants in Disney Springs). We have not specifically noted brunch in these icons, but it's something to keep in mind. You'll typically find notes about brunch in our pro tips or menu highlights sections! You'll want to check the Disney World website or My Disney Experience app for updates.

1 Advance Dining Reservation (ADR) Rating

Dining reservations are strongly recommended for all Table Service locations at Disney World, and some are more challenging to secure than others. We've ranked each Table Service location from 1-5 with color coding, with 1 being the hardest to get, and 5 being the easiest to get.

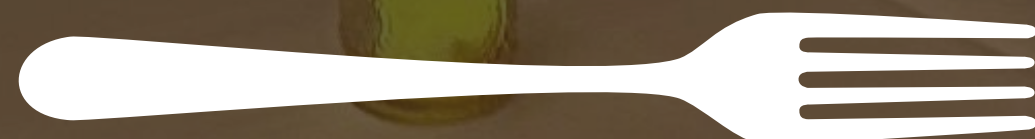


TABLE SERVICE



50'S PRIME TIME CAFE



Offering comfort food in a fun atmosphere, 50's Prime Time Cafe transports you to Mom's Kitchen. Servers have a great time acting like your long-lost cousins. If you want to joke with your servers, laugh with your family, and watch a lot of wild shenanigans, this is the place for you! The menu here is full of classic American comfort food—from fried chicken and mashed potatoes to old-fashioned pot roast and pot pie. The atmosphere is the real draw here—with the 1950s decor, and the servers who REALLY put on a good show.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- American comfort food—plenty of choices, from soup and salad to various entrees, desserts, kids' choices, and more
- You can get flavored Cokes here!
- Things we've enjoyed: Fried Chicken, Meatloaf, Peanut Butter & Jelly Milk Shake (the signature flavor & a BIG favorite), Dad's Favorite Chocolate-Peanut Butter Layered Cake, Grasshopper Bar

PRO TIPS

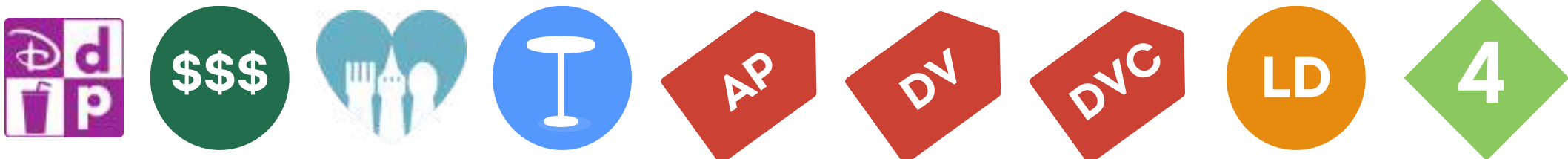
- Ask for one of the TV tables when you check in!
- The antics here can be hilarious but a bit much for some. If you'd rather not partake in the fun, let your server know.



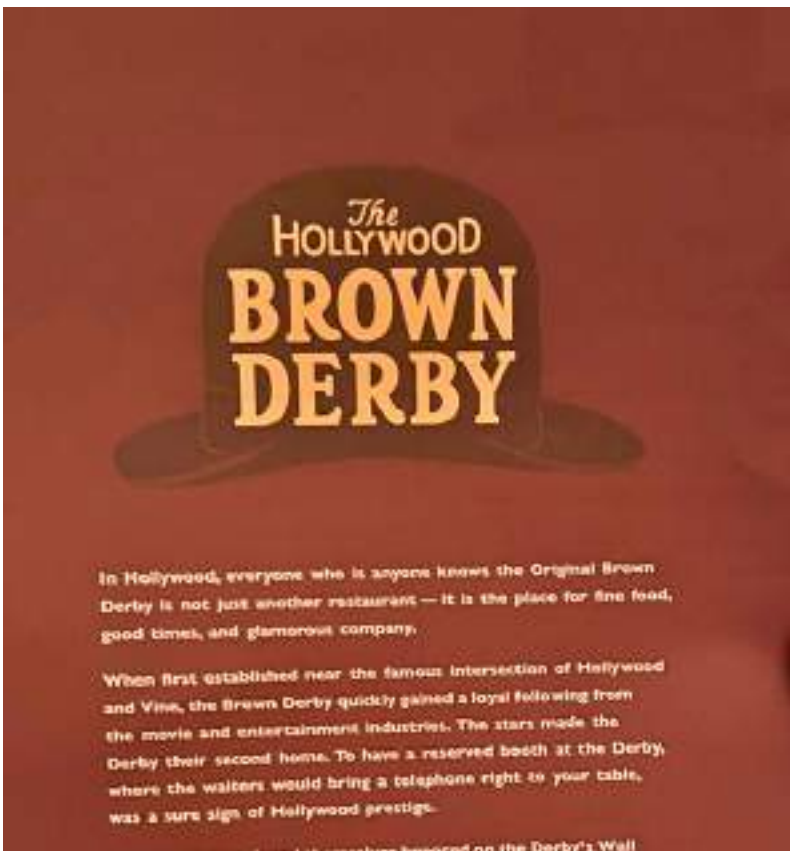
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THE HOLLYWOOD BROWN DERBY



An iconic spot, The Hollywood Brown Derby is an authentic replica of the famous Brown Derby in Hollywood, California. With walls covered in celebrity caricatures, fancy white table cloths, and even a celebrity guest book (signed by REAL celebs!), you'll feel like you've stepped back into the Golden Age of Hollywood. The menu is made of contemporary American eats. If you want a relaxing meal, this is a great spot with absolutely delicious dishes, but prepare for a BIG price tag.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Menu features American cuisine, including (typically) things like a charcuterie board, escargot, shrimp cocktail, filet mignon, the famous Cobb salad, the iconic grapefruit cake, wines, flights, and more
- Things we've enjoyed: Cobb Salad, Grapefruit Cake, Filet Mignon, Grapefruit Cake Martini

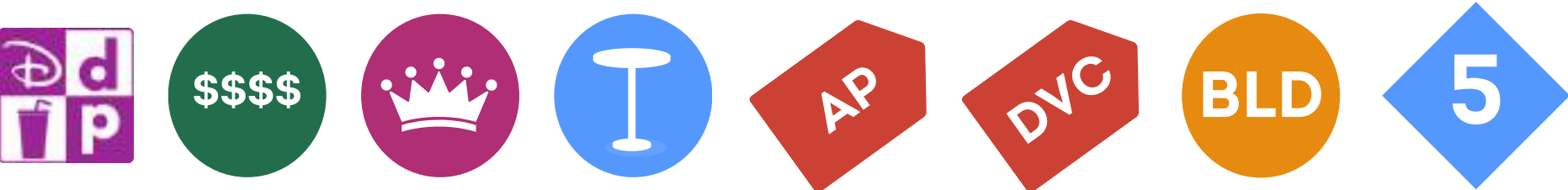
PRO TIPS

- Although this is a Signature dining location, your park attire is acceptable.
- It will cost 2 Table Service Dining Plan credits to eat here.

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HOLLYWOOD & VINE



Hollywood & Vine (designed to look like an old diner) is THE spot for character dining in Hollywood Studios. Time your visits here CAREFULLY. Breakfast has Disney Junior characters like Fancy Nancy and Doc McStuffins. Lunch and dinner have characters like Minnie and Mickey. Food is served buffet-style with a large variety of fairly standard, family-friendly, American eats. If you love characters and want a safer meal that’s good for picky eaters, this could do the trick! Just be aware that it isn’t exactly cheap.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Things we’ve enjoyed: Herb Crusted Tenderloin Steak with Horseradish Cream, Mexican Street Corn, Herbed Focaccia, Olive-Oil Roasted Potatoes, Roasted Mushroom Farro Risotto, Blueberry-Lemon Tart, and Candy Magic Bar (Lunch and Dinner), Spicy Chicken & Doughnut, Bananas Fosters French Toast (Breakfast)

PRO TIPS

- Can get pretty loud, so consider coming at an odd time.
- Breakfast (\$\$\$) is the cheaper option. Lunch and dinner are priced the same (\$\$\$\$). All meals, however, are 1 Table Service credit on the Disney Dining Plan.

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MAMA MELROSE'S RISTORANTE ITALIANO



Mama Melrose’s serves Italian eats with California charm. The theming is fun, with twinkling lights, greenery, and all kinds of signs and photos in the dining room. The food can be inconsistent—sometimes it has been...just alright. Other times, especially with some of the newer menu changes, we’ve been really impressed. Typically, what you can expect is good, standard Italian fare (think: Olive Garden) in a fun environment with a few stand-out dishes.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Standard Italian eats with some more unique items mixed in
- Things we’ve enjoyed: Mushroom, Artichoke, Cheese Dip, Rigatoni Bolognese, Chicken alla Parmigiana (we’ve had mixed experiences with it), Goat Cheese Mousse Tart, Cherry-Chocolate Cake, Tiramisu
- The Polenta Cake, Mushroom, and Herbed Cauliflower dish is a stand-out for plant-based eaters.

PRO TIPS

- Confused about the theming here? According to the story, a woman named Mama Melrose traveled to California to become an actor, but her Italian cooking was the real star. So, she opened a restaurant in an empty backlot warehouse and it draws from both worlds.

ROUNDUP RODEO BBQ



Roundup Rodeo BBQ is absolutely COVERED in Toy Story theming. There are larger-than-life toys, displays, and more featuring your favorite Toy Story friends covering every inch! The food here is served family-style and is American BBQ fare (smoked meats, sides like mac and cheese, dessert, and drinks). The food is good backyard BBQ food (like the very best your family might make at home) but not terribly unique or mind-blowing. Ultimately, the star of the show is the theming!



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- American BBQ served family-style—for one price, you'll get a variety of things like bread, salad, meats, sides, and dessert.
- There is a plant-based option.
- Things we've enjoyed: Prospector's Homemade Cheddar Biscuits with Sweet Pepper Jelly, Evil Dr. Smoked Ribs, Slinky Dooooooooog's Mac & Cheese, Bo's Lemon and Blueberry Cheesecake

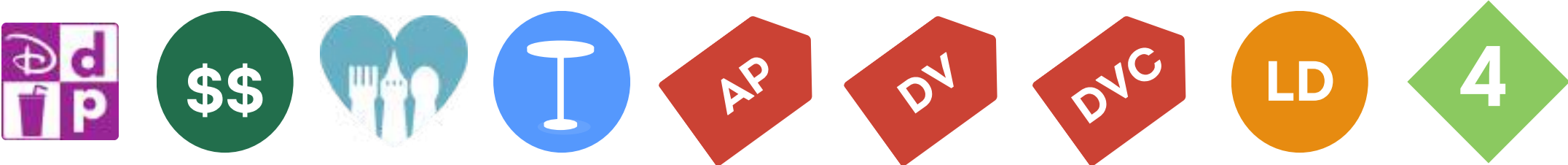
PRO TIPS

- IMPORTANT! This is NOT a character meal. The Toy Story characters do NOT appear during your meal.
- There are two main dining rooms—one themed to Jessie and one themed to Bo Peep and each has a different vibe. Take time to really explore all the details in here!

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SCI-FI DINE-IN THEATER RESTAURANT



Sci-Fi Dine-In Theater is one of the MOST themed and immersive Disney restaurants. The entire space is designed to look like a retro drive-in theater, and you'll even sit in replica convertible CARS while you dine! To top it all off, there's a GIANT screen showing sci-fi mid-century movie clips under a twinkling night sky. The food might not blow you away, but the atmosphere makes this a favorite for many and a great spot for first-time visitors looking for a restaurant that's got a BIG entertainment factor.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

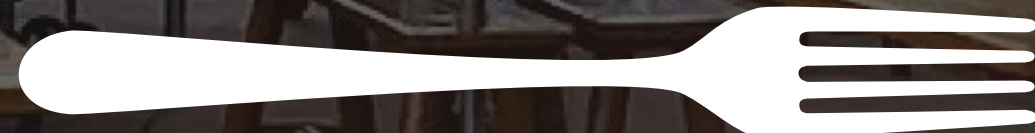
- Classic American food with a few unique options thrown in
- Things we've enjoyed: Burgers (Drive-In BBQ, Beamed-Up, and Classic American are good—ask about the ever-changing Feature Film Burger), Sci-Fi Impossible Nachos (we recommend these to anyone—not just plant-based eaters), Oreo milkshakes (available with Godiva Chocolate Liqueur!)

PRO TIPS

- Pretty dark inside.
- Mostly car-themed seating (splits parties into different rows) and some picnic tables in the back.
- Swap your fries for onion rings for a crunchy and delicious option!

ABC COMMISSARY



ABC Commissary is themed to look like a movie studio cafeteria, complete with posters of and props from ABC shows all around. You might not expect much from ABC Commissary, but some of the dishes might really surprise you! You'll find American eats here, but the options are more unique than your typical burger and fries. Despite past mixed feelings about this spot, we've been really impressed by some of the newer items. If you want a quick but versatile selection of meals, this is the place for you!



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- American cuisine with some more unique options than standard theme park eats
- Adult entrees have a mix of things for everyone, even plant-based eaters.
- Watch for seasonal items.
- Things we've enjoyed: Pork Carnitas Tacos, Shrimp Tacos, Buffalo Grilled Cheese Sandwich (though we've had mixed experiences)

PRO TIPS

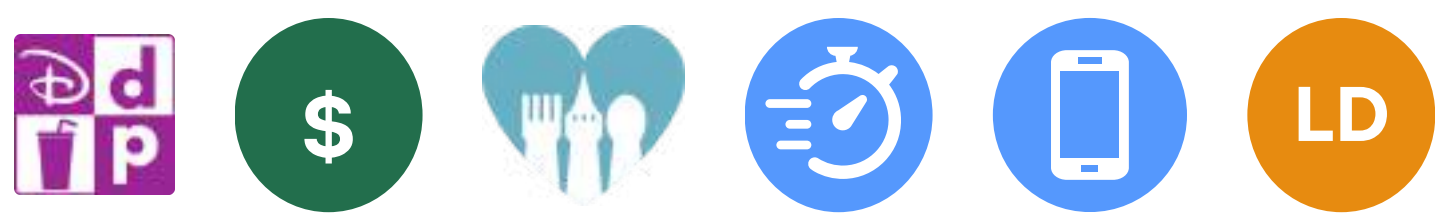
- There is a PLENTY of air-conditioned seating.
- The idea behind this spot is that you're on the production team for a project at the studio, and you're taking a break from the show biz to grab lunch with your fellow workers.



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BACKLOT EXPRESS



Backlot Express is designed to make you feel like you’re in a Hollywood backlot, full of props and backdrops. The menu here is mainly made up of more basic theme park food options (think burgers, chicken tenders, and fries), but you will find a few more uniquely flavored options too. With a good amount of seating indoors and outdoors, this is a popular spot for many. The eats aren’t the most exciting or unique, but it’s a good choice for picky eaters and those looking for one spot that’ll satisfy the whole family.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Classic theme park eats—chicken strips, mac and cheese, burgers, french fries—with some more unique options (like a BBQ pulled pork burger, teriyaki chicken bowl, and Cuban sandwich)
- The Wookiee Oatmeal Cookie Sandwich has been a big favorite of ours in the past, but more recent changes have been a downgrade in our opinion.
- Things we’ve enjoyed: Smoked BBQ Pulled Pork Burger, Teriyaki Chicken Bowl

PRO TIPS

- It’s well worth taking a look around to scope out all the little details tucked in the backlot.
- It can get busy here, so we recommend placing those Mobile Orders well in advance!

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CATALINA EDDIE'S



Named after a California weather phenomenon, the eats at Catalina Eddie's mainly consists of basic pizzas (the circular, puffy kind), a meatball sub, and a classic Caesar salad. The food here is...average. The eats are not particularly exciting, but they will likely appeal to kiddos and those wanting a basic and safe meal. The one big reason to come here, however, is to try the Toffee and Coconut Blondie—an absolutely DELICIOUS, must-get dessert. Aside from that, this is probably not going to be the best meal you could have at Disney World, but if you want fast eats and lots of seating, this could fit the bill.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Sometimes seasonal items pop up that can provide some fun finds.
- The pizza here comes with a side of Caesar Salad, making it a decent portion size for adults.
- Things we've enjoyed: Toffee and Coconut Blondie (Goosey Toffee and Toasted Coconut Blondie topped with Salted Caramel Buttercream!)

PRO TIPS

- Outdoor seating only; however, many tables are covered by an overhead pergola or table umbrellas.

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DOCKING BAY 7 FOOD & CARGO



This restaurant (located in Star Wars: Galaxy's Edge) serves up unique eats in a spot themed to look like a working hangar bay (it's even topped with a Delivery Shuttle)–hence the name “Docking Bay 7 Food and Cargo!” The food here is more unique than your standard burger and fries–but you’ll also find a few “safer” eats, particularly in the form of crispy chicken and mac and cheese. It’s on the pricier side for quick eats, but if you want more adventurous food in a Star Wars-themed space, this could be a good choice.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- More unique quick eats featuring beef, chicken, pork, plant-based options, and more
- We’re fans of the Mac and Cheese–consider grabbing it as the side for your meal
- Things we’ve enjoyed: The Pirjanad Hot Chicken Tip Yip is one we’d get again (with a side of mac and cheese), Ronto Wrap (after 3PM)

PRO TIPS

- According to the story, Proprietor Chef Strono “Cookie” Tuggs runs the kitchen, having honed his skills in the kitchen of Maz Kanata.
- This spot can get busy and the atmosphere is a little hectic. Finding a table inside can be a challenge at times, but there’s outdoor seating too.



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DOCKSIDE DINER



Looking for Dockside Diner? Search for the rustic “S.S. Down the Hatch” ship on Echo Lake (it’s themed in a way to pay homage to 1950s “California-Crazy architecture”)! If your ideal meal consists of hot dogs, macaroni and cheese, and milkshakes, this restaurant is good for a fast bite. Some of the hot dog creations are a bit more unique, but the eats aren’t all that memorable. It’s a middle-of-the-road spot in terms of flavor but reliable enough to fill your belly if you need something quick.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Menu typically features unique hot dog creations, along with a basic hot dog, house-made potato chips, cheese sauce, milkshakes, and drinks (alcoholic and not).
- Be sure to check the menu as some offerings can change frequently.
- Things we’ve enjoyed: Seasonal Milkshakes, Bacon Macaroni & Cheese Hot Dog, Chocolate Shake with Baileys Irish Cream and Kahlúa Liqueur

PRO TIPS

- This spot often closes earlier than you might expect (around 5PM).
- This restaurant is entirely outdoors with some umbrella-shaded tables.

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FAIRFAX FARE



Ever wondered what it would be like to eat chicken nuggets covered in buffalo sauce on top of mashed potatoes all thrown inside a...WAFFLE BOWL?! Well, NOW YOU CAN! For lunch/dinner at Fairfax Fare, you'll currently find a unique menu featuring different meats (from barbecued beef brisket to pork belly) and sides, all served in waffle bowls. The options are limited here and on the heavier side. BUT if you're in a rush, looking for a hearty meal, and are a meat-and-potatoes kind of person, this could be a good pick.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Breakfast: Mickey Waffles (a surprisingly harder find at quick service locations in the parks).
- Lunch/dinner: Waffle bowls with meats + mashed potatoes (or soba noodles for the plant-based option)
- The Enchanted Rose dessert has a great design and is worth it for chocolate fans.
- Things we've enjoyed: Buffalo Chicken Waffle Bowl, BBQ Beef Brisket Bowl, Enchanted Rose dessert

PRO TIPS

- Seating is open-air—while it offers plenty of shaded spots, it provides limited protection from inclement weather.
- This restaurant is part of the Sunset Ranch Market, so seating is shared with other restaurants nearby. During peak meal times you'll find this area gets quite busy.

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PIZZERIZZO



PizzeRizzo is your standard Quick Service pizza joint, albeit run by a RAT from The Muppets named Rizzo. The atmosphere is ridiculously fun—especially for Muppets fans (there are SO many details to hunt for here)—and it offers a ton of indoor and outdoor seating. If you’ve got kids/picky eaters in the group who love a basic pizza pie, you’re looking for budget-friendly filling eats, and you want a place with plenty of seating (in the A.C.), PizzeRizzo might be for you.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Basic Italian-inspired eats with pizza (the circular, puffy kind), salad, and meatball subs
- The plant-based “sausage” sub is a good pick here for those seeking a meatless option.
- The pizza cookie is a fun and sweet dessert if you like jam!
- Things we’ve enjoyed: The Antipasto Salad (fresh tossed-to-order and quite tasty!) and Meatball sub (meatballs are seasoned well, and it’s a decent size!) are pretty good choices.

PRO TIPS

- PLEASE take the time to walk around and look at all the details in here on the first and second floors.

ROSIE’S ALL-AMERICAN CAFE



If you’re looking for classic theme park eats—cheeseburgers, hot dogs, chicken nuggets, french fries—Rosie’s is THE place for you. BUT that doesn’t mean there aren’t a few unique items here too. There’s a plant-based lobster roll that is surprisingly good, and the Peanut Butter Cookie Sandwich here is a super tasty sweet treat for PB&J fans. The menu is fairly simple, but if you’re looking for a place with basic eats that’ll satisfy picky eaters in the group, this could be a good pick!



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Basic theme park eats make up this menu, with a few unique items
- Grab a side of plastic cheese for \$1
- Don’t miss that Peanut Butter Cookie Sandwich—pretzel shortbread cookie sandwiched with strawberry jam and peanut butter-chocolate fudge!
- Things we’ve enjoyed: Plant-based Lobster Roll, Rosie's All American Salad (with mojo pulled pork), Peanut Butter Cookie Sandwich

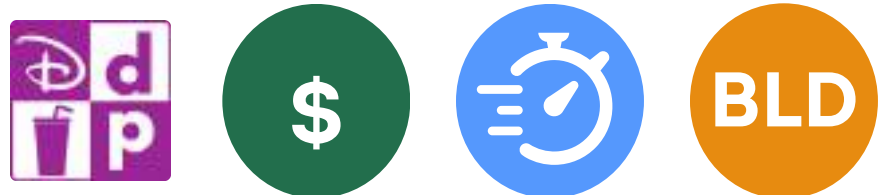
PRO TIPS

- Look for the cool Rosie's “V for Victory” vegetable garden over to the side—Disney's tribute to Hollywood in the 40s

THE TROLLEY CAR CAFE



The Trolley Car Cafe is the Starbucks location in Hollywood Studios, so lines here can get VERY long. On the menu you can expect to find your favorite drinks and even quite a few breakfast sandwiches and snacks that you'll recognize from your local Starbucks. BUT this is also the home of the FAMOUS Carrot Cake Whoopie Pie—one of the MUST-TRY snacks in Hollywood Studios.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Starbucks drinks + snacks, plus a few unique-to-Disney offerings
- Watch for seasonal Disney treats. During the holiday season and Valentine's Day, the Carrot Cake Whoopie Pie may be swapped out for a Red Velvet version.
- Things we've enjoyed: Your favorite Starbucks drink, Carrot Cake Whoopie Pie

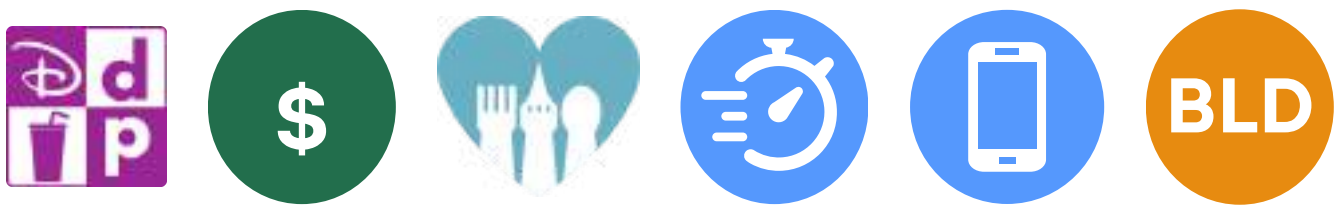
PRO TIPS

- Stay hydrated—You can typically grab a free cup of ice water here.
- Your Starbucks coffee order is a Snack Credit on the Disney Dining Plan, no matter the size or the flavor, so go wild! Get the Venti. You're on vacation!
- There is no seating indoors, but there are a few tables outside.

WOODY'S LUNCH BOX



When you walk up to this restaurant, it looks like you're walking right into Andy's lunch box—propped up with a Woody's Roundup-themed thermos on the side! The theming is playful and immersive, with giant-sized toys and props surrounding the area. On the menu you'll find fun twists on American dishes, some of which have become BIG fan favorites—like the totchos (nachos but with tater tots) and the Lunch Box Tarts! The food is simple but satisfying, tasty, and fun (there's a reason why this spot is always packed!).



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Look for seasonal versions of the Lunch Box Tart.
- There are plant-based versions of the totchos and cheddar sandwich.
- This is a good spot for a quick breakfast—grab a bowl with potato barrels smothered in gravy or a Lunch Box Tart.
- Things we've enjoyed: Lunch Box Tarts, Grilled Three Cheese Sandwich with tomato-basil soup, Totchos, BBQ Brisket Melt

PRO TIPS

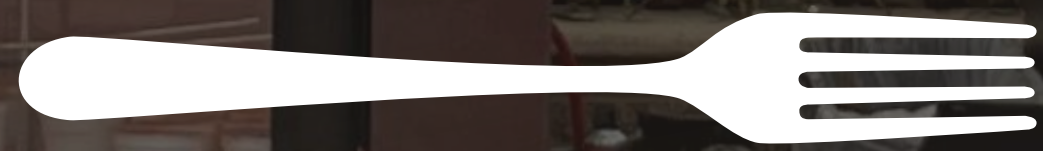
- Go early or late (or better yet, Mobile Order!)—this place gets very busy!

EPIC EATS

Epic Eats serves up funnel cakes, soft-serve ice cream, and cold beverages near the Indiana Jones Epic Stunt Spectacular! - Things we’ve enjoyed: The funnel cakes (we’ve especially liked the cookies ‘n cream and strawberry topping versions)!

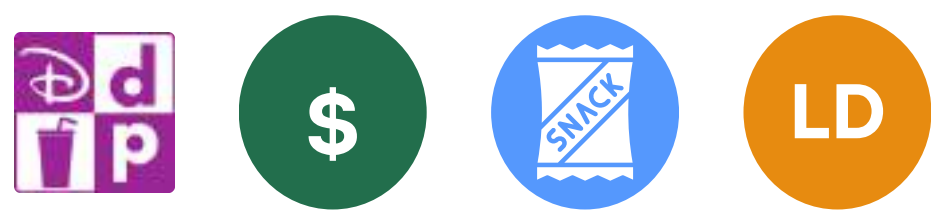

The menu features sundaes, ice cream cups or cones, and some surprisingly over-the-top seasonal shakes.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Snack menu typically features hand-scooped ice cream, sundaes, plant-based frozen desserts, and bottled water
- Look for specialty shakes (like a Candy Cane Milk Shake!) to be offered seasonally.

PRO TIPS

- Ask the Cast Member to serve your ice cream cone with a cup—it helps with the quick melting in the Florida heat!

- Some folks LOVE the Outpost Popcorn Mix (a mix of sweet and spicy flavors) but others find the combo of flavors a little offputting.
- Blue Buttered Grains is a “safe” pick that tastes pretty much like standard popcorn, but it's been tinted blue.

MENU HIGHLIGHTS

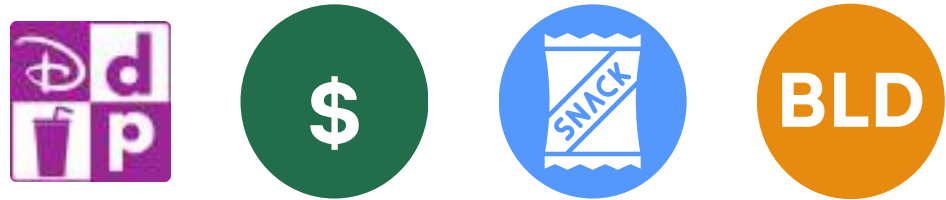
- Breakfast menu typically features a Ronto Morning Wrap, Triple Suns Breakfast Wrap, and other snacks.

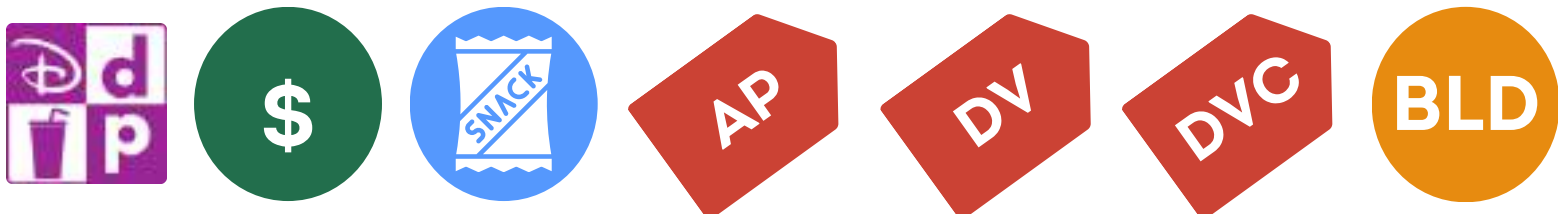

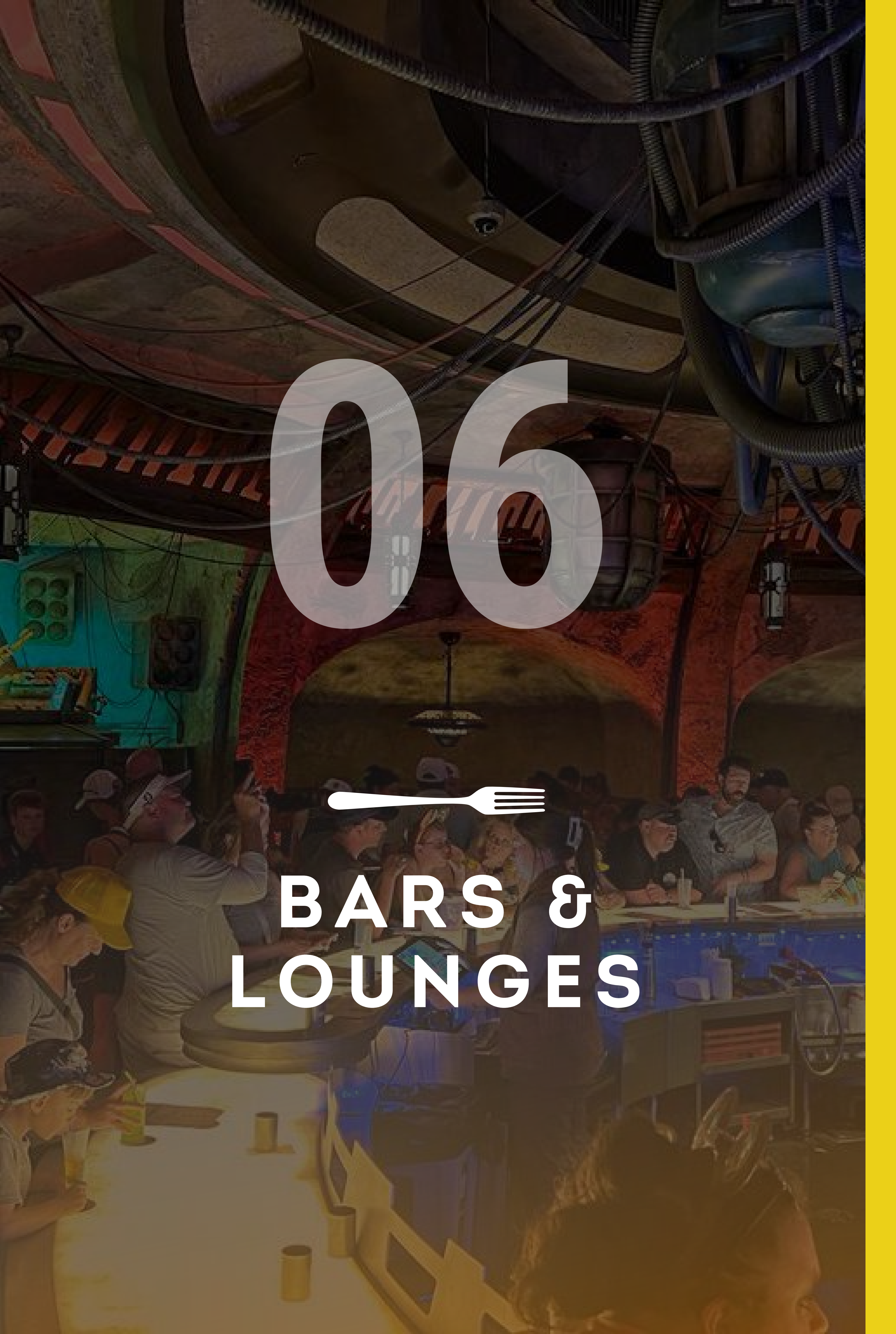
- Most of the small soda bottles here are designed to look like thermal detonators and they have unique Star Wars-themed lettering on them.

BASELINE TAP HOUSE



Located on Grand Avenue (a nod to Los Angeles, CA), BaseLine Tap House offers California beers and wine, as well as specialty cocktails, spirits, and a small bites menu. Don't overlook this spot! Food options are limited, drink options are mostly alcohol-focused, and it can get crowded. But if you want a cold beer (or other alcoholic drink), some seriously tasty snacks (there's a Bavarian pretzel with beer-cheese fondue that's a BIG favorite), and a relaxing vibe with nice seating outside so you can people-watch, this is a great spot to visit.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Try a Create-Your-Own Beer Flight to sample a few options.
- The non-alcoholic Barrilitos Strawberry Hibiscus Soda is AWESOME.
- Beer options on tap rotate.
- Things we've enjoyed: Bavarian Pretzel with Beer-Cheese Fondue, Create-your-own beer flight, California Cheese and Charcuterie Plate

- Indoor and outdoor seating is available. All ordering takes place inside, at the bar.

The Hollywood Brown Derby Lounge (located right outside the main restaurant) is a hidden gem. This spot doesn't take reservations—instead, it operates on walk-up availability (first-come, first-serve). The outdoor lounge (great for people-watching!) lets you indulge in the flavors of the iconic Hollywood Brown Derby Restaurant (high-quality eats) without the hassle of booking ahead. If you want to try the LEGENDARY Cobb Salad or grab a few cocktails but couldn't lock in a reservation to the Brown Derby Restaurant, this is your go-to spot.



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Order from the full Brown Derby Restaurant menu—American cuisine including appetizers (like a charcuterie board), entrees (like filet mignon), and desserts (like the famous Grapefruit Cake).
- Plenty of drinks—wines, flights, ports, cognacs, and more.
- Things we've enjoyed: Cobb Salad, Grapefruit Cake, Filet Mignon, Grapefruit Cake Martini

PRO TIPS

- Lunch and dinner are 2 Table Service credits per person on the Dining Plan.

- Full bar outside—walk up and order a drink.

OGA'S CANTINA

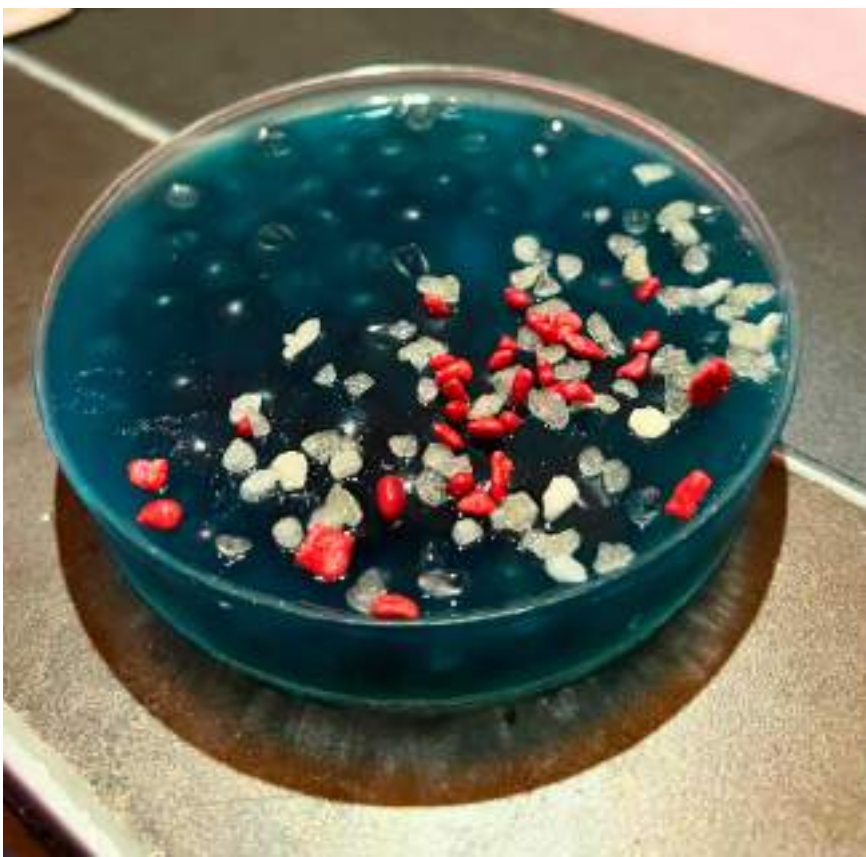
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For many Star Wars fans, this is a MUST-DO! Oga's Cantina is a spaceport bar in Star Wars: Galaxy's Edge (with the feeling of a Mos Eisley watering hole). Live your far, far away fantasy as you sip a bubbling brew and listen to beats provided by DJ-R3X (the former pilot droid from Star Tours). This place is ALL about the theming/vibes and drinks. There are some snack items but do NOT go in expecting a big meal. It's popular and tiny (mostly standing room), but if you want a really immersive Star Wars bar experience, this is a fun spot with some unique drinks!



MENU HIGHLIGHTS

- Specialty alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks, beer, cider, and wine. Mixed drinks are pre-made.
- Snacks: treat that looks like growing bacteria (fun & unique), bits with spiced dip, and a charcuterie board (has improved recently). Newer items (flatbread & cheese roll) arrived in 2024—check to see what's available when you go!
- Things we've enjoyed: Alcoholic—Fuzzy Tauntaun (Makes your mouth NUMB!), T-16 Skyhopper, Yub Nub (comes in a souvenir mug); Non-alcoholic: Blue Bantha (topped with a cookie!), Jabba Juice

PRO TIPS

- Advance Dining Reservations are accepted & highly encouraged.
- Small, enclosed space with low lighting levels and high activity.
- Limit of around 45 minutes per party (don't expect to sit back and relax too long).
- Mainly standing room, with limited seating. Seating is NOT guaranteed upon entry. Be prepared to stand or even share a seating area with another party.

TUNE-IN LOUNGE



Tucked inside the entrance to 50's Prime Time Cafe (and often overlooked), Tune-In Lounge is a well-kept secret and a great watering hole to visit, especially mid-day. The theme here is especially fun—you'll travel back to the mid-20th century (complete with knick-knacks and tchotchkes) while sipping on '50s-themed cocktails. You won't find food items here currently (though that has been different in the past) and it is small, but the retro vibe is fantastic and some of the more unique drinks make it worth a visit!

- Wine, beer, hard cider, and a full bar are also available.

PRO TIPS

- It can get crowded in here with diners waiting to be seated for the main restaurant, so go at "off" dining hours whenever possible.
- The crowds tend to empty out when Fantasmic! starts, so if you prefer a cocktail to end your night, that's a good time to head here.

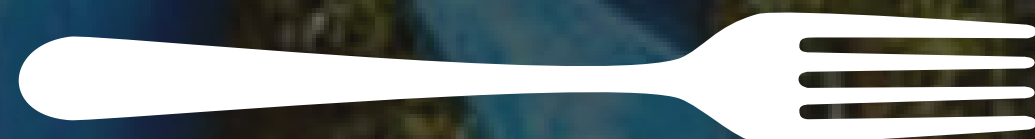

DINING PLAN TIPS & TRICKS

So you're thinking about using the Disney Dining Plan at Hollywood Studios? Great! There are some things you might want to consider, and we'll break it all down for you.

First, a bit of basic information. The Disney Dining Plan is a way to basically pre-pay for all or most of your meals ahead of your trip. Plans are an optional add-on to your vacation. If you decide to pay for the Dining Plan, you'll receive a certain number of credits that you

can then use at participating restaurants in Disney World to get your food.

This is such an important topic that we have an entire Guide for it—[Disney Dining Plan: The DFB Guide to Maximizing the DDP](#)—if you'd like to explore it in more detail. For now, let's chat about some important things to know about the Disney Dining Plan specifically when it comes to dining in Hollywood Studios.





When on the Disney Dining Plan, one thing you'll want to think about is using your credits in places/for items that'll really give you the best value. Here are a few at-a-glance options to **maximize your credits** in Hollywood Studios!

Best Breakfast:

Quick Service: Woody's Lunch Box, Ronto Roasters

Table Service: Hollywood & Vine (Character Buffet)



Best Lunch/Dinner:

Quick Service: Backlot Express, Docking Bay 7

Table Service: 50's Prime Time Cafe, Roundup Rodeo BBQ



Best Snack Credit Value:

- Funnel Cakes at Epic Eats
- Sweet Cream or Jalapeno Cheese Pretzel at Pretzel Palooza
- Mickey Brownie Sundae or Ice Cream Cone at Hollywood Scoops
- Bouncin' Mini Churros at Ice Cold Hydraulics
- Any size Starbucks drink at Trolley Car Cafe



TABLE SERVICE DINING

You can have one of the best meals in Hollywood Studios at the **Hollywood Brown Derby**—the park’s only Signature restaurant. But, this glamorous meal comes at a price, requiring **TWO Table Service meal credits** per person to dine. All other Table Service restaurants in Hollywood Studios only require one. Some feel that using those two credits for a meal at the Brown Derby is well worth it, but it is something to be aware of as

you make your own dining decisions.

By comparison, all meals at Hollywood & Vine—a buffet featuring Disney characters—are only 1 Table Service credit per person, BUT the food quality (and vibe) is very different than what you’ll find at the Brown Derby. It’s all about focusing on what’s important to and best for you!





QUICK SERVICE DINING

To make the most of your Quick Service credits, having a large appetite and ordering an alcoholic beverage or specialty drink can help.

Each Quick Service meal credit on the Dining Plan comes with a drink—those 21+ can choose a single-serving mixed cocktail, beer, or wine. Considering how expensive alcoholic drinks can be, ordering an alcoholic drink can help you get more value

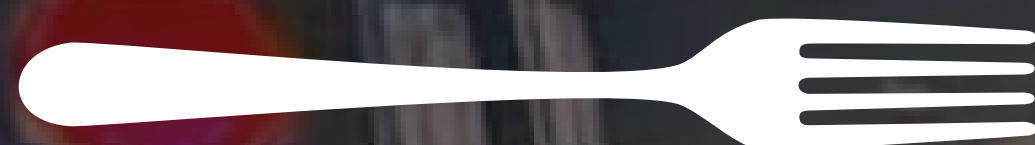
out of your meal credit. Check to see what beverages qualify for the Dining Plan when ordering your meal to get the most out of your credits.

Keep in mind that those with lighter appetites who typically opt for salads or kids' meals may not find the dollar-for-dollar value of the Dining Plan here, but that doesn't mean they can't still enjoy the convenience of it.

DFB TOP PICKS

Hollywood Studios is an interesting park when it comes to food. You'll find some of the most immersive restaurants here—dine in a convertible car under a starry night sky, get heckled by your “cousins” while watching retro TVs, step into a space bar, and sit inside a “cheesy” banquet room for a wedding reception inside a pizza restaurant run by a rat from the Muppets!

Some of the food itself, however, might not necessarily blow you away. There **are** delicious (and unique!) eats in this park—you just have to know where to find them!

So what should you consider trying? We've got a list to help.

But first, a quick disclaimer! Everyone's tastes will differ. What we love might not be your favorite—and what you love might be another person's least favorite snack. And just because we don't include a specific treat on this list doesn't mean it isn't worth checking out. But if you want to know what our top picks are for Hollywood Studios, let's dive in.





Best Table Service:

The Hollywood Brown Derby—one of the most delicious and historic dining experiences in Disney World, home to the FAMOUS Cobb salad and iconic grapefruit cake, fantastic old Hollywood vibes, and consistent top-notch gourmet eats (cons: pricey and not always great for a light meal in between thrill rides) (Pro tip: Can't get a reservation? Check out the Brown Derby Lounge for walk-up availability.)



Sci-Fi Dine-In Theater Restaurant—

incredibly immersive environment (car-shaped booths underneath a night sky with a giant screen showing retro sci-fi clips), and decent diner-style food (cons: seating design can be a little tight and makes it difficult to talk to your group, not tremendously adventurous eats)

Roundup Rodeo BBQ—really detailed Toy Story theming (lots to look at), all-you-care-to-eat family-style meal that'll really fill you up, and cheddar biscuits that are so good you have to be careful not to fill up before the meal comes (cons: no character appearances, can be a heavy meal, not great if you don't like barbecue food, not all that adventurous/special if you're used to barbecue-type eats)

Honorable Mention: 50's Prime Time Cafe





Best Quick Service:

Ronto Roasters—home to the DELICIOUS Ronto Wrap (one of our favorite things to eat in this park), there are a variety of Ronto Wrap versions (a breakfast one, and plant-based ones) that are quite good and worth trying, quick eats, a little more adventurous than standard chicken tenders (cons: limited menu, potentially too adventurous for some, limited seating)



Woody's Lunch Box—a good mix of sweet and savory options—totchos (nachos but with tater tots), BBQ brisket melt, and lunch box tarts (to name a few), affordable eats (cons: limited menu, all seating is outdoors)

ABC Commissary—LOTS of indoor seating, some good options that are more unique (like the pork carnitas tacos), good portions for what you pay (cons: the setting isn't particularly fun or immersive, there are more unique options elsewhere, and there are also more "safe" options elsewhere—it all depends on what you're looking for)



Backlot Express—plenty of seating (indoors and outdoors), classic theme park eats with a few slightly more unique items thrown in there, good for the whole group to pick from (cons: there are more adventurous options elsewhere)

Honorable Mentions: Docking Bay 7 Food & Cargo



Best Sweet Snacks:

- **Carrot Cake Whoopie Pie** from Trolley Car Cafe—MASSIVE & moist carrot cake pieces + rich cream cheese frosting make this perfection for those with a sweet tooth
- **Lunch Box Tart** from Woody's Lunch Box—essentially a homemade Pop-Tart with different fillings, look for seasonal varieties!
- **Jack-Jack's Num Num Cookie** from The Market or Neighborhood Bakery—a GIANT chocolate cookie with chunky chocolate chips, it's a can't-miss dessert
- **Fantasmic! Peanut Butter Cookie Sandwich** from Rosie's All-American Cafe—if you love PB&J sandwiches, consider giving this a try—you'll get pretzel shortbread cookies with strawberry jam and peanut butter-chocolate fudge (some of our team has hated a previous version of this, but others loved it—where will you fall?)
- **Tower Cookie** from Tower of Terror Joffrey's Coffee Location—doughy, soft, and a delightful cinnamon sugar flavor
- **Toffee and Coconut Blondie** from Catalina Eddie's—ooey-gooley goodness, awesome balance of sweetness with toffee and salted caramel buttercream
- **Wookie Cookie** from Backlot Express—oatmeal cookies + fluffy whoopie-pie cream filling (recent changes have made been a bit of a downgrade than the original though)
- Honorable mention: Funnel Cakes from Epic Eats



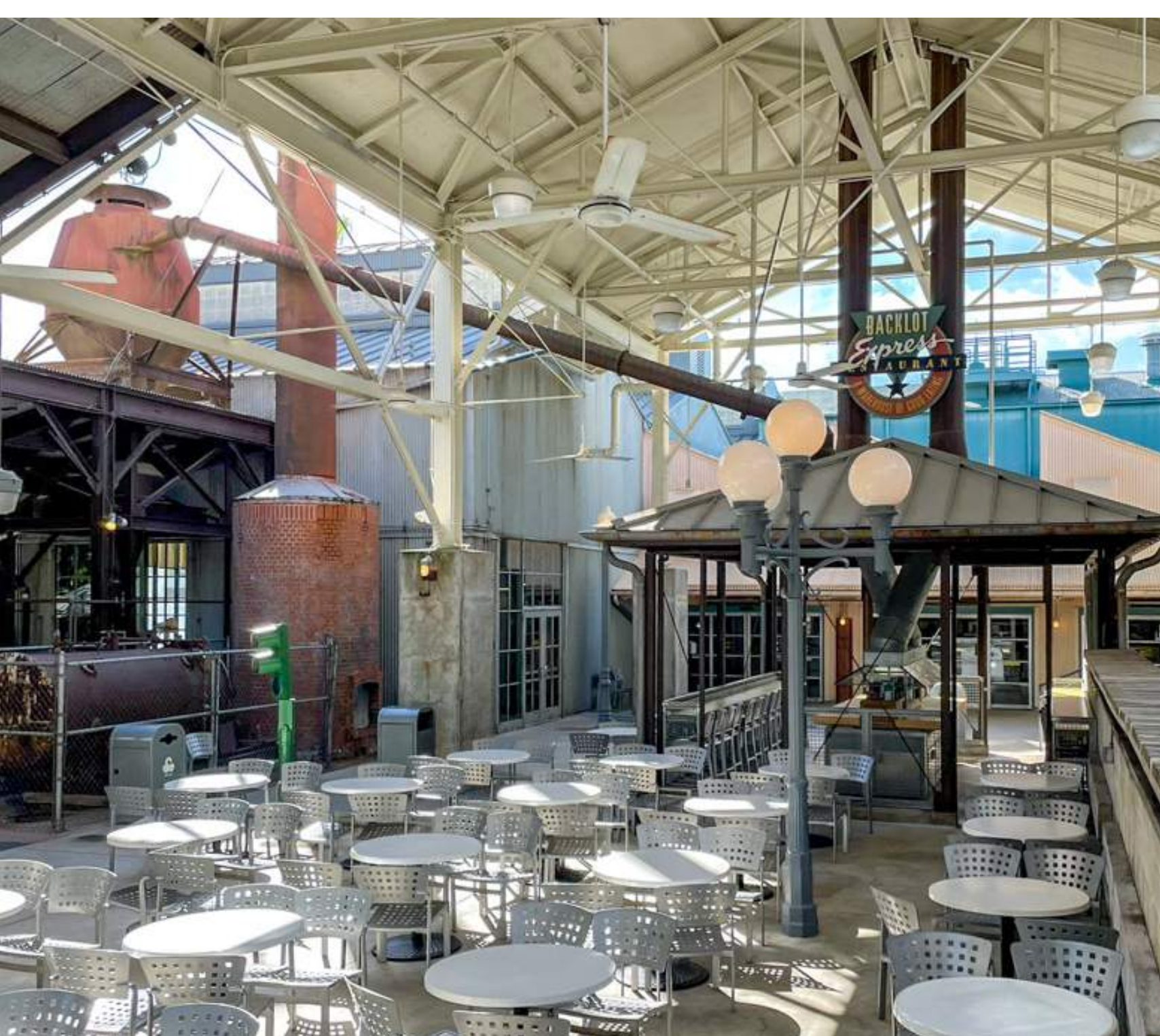
Best Savory Snacks:

- **Totchos** from Woody's Lunch Box—layers of feel-good food (chili, cheese, queso, and more) on top of tater tots, a great mix of flavors and textures, can be a meal or snack
- **Ronto Wrap** from Ronto Roasters (or Docking Bay 7)—this is another one that can be shared as a snack or eaten as a full meal, pita wrap filled with roasted pork + grilled sausage + peppercorn sauce + slaw = a mix of heavier and brighter flavors (try the plant-based versions too!)
- **Bavarian Pretzel** from BaseLine Tap House—simple, tasty, filling, good to share, comes with beer-cheese fondue and spicy mustard
- **Bouncin' Mini Churros** from Ice Cold Hydraulics—savory churros topped with Coca-Cola + bourbon candied bacon, sriracha aioli, and scallions, the toppings really make this snack unique (the bacon, in particular, adds nice sweet and savory elements)
- **Plant-Based Lobster Roll** from Rosie's All-American Cafe—the heart of palm, celery, apples, and creamy dressing make this taste like a yummy salad on a tasty roll (not at ALL like seafood)
- Honorable mention: Outpost Popcorn Mix at Kat Saka's Kettle (a divisive snack!)



Best Drinks

- **Blue or Green milk** from The Milk Stand –controversial drinks, but totally iconic to Star Wars fans, a must-try for many. (Get them with or without alcohol.) Don't love them on their own? Consider trying a “hack” like layering blue and green milk together.
- **Cold Brew Black Caf** from Kat Saka's Kettle–Joffrey's cold brew topped with sweet cream cheese and chocolate puffs, a really well-balanced drink (when mixed!), you can get it spiked with chocolate liqueur
- **Fuzzy Tauntaun** from Oga's Cantina–sweet and fruity cocktail, the foam will make your mouth go NUMB–it's one of those things that's worth getting once for the experience.
- **Peanut Buttery & Jelly Milkshake** from 50's Prime Time Cafe–a fan-favorite, deliciously creamy & just sweet enough, an absolute must-try! (Not a milkshake fan? Try the PBJ Cocktail at the restaurant or the attached Tune-In Lounge)
- Other good picks: **Baseline Select Margarita or Barrilitos Strawberry Hibiscus Soda** (BaseLine Tap House), **Grapefruit Cake Martini** (Hollywood Brown Derby Restaurant or Lounge), **Seasonal over-the-top shake** (Hollywood Scoops)



Best Spots for Large Groups:

- Table Service–**Roundup Rodeo BBQ**– family-style, all-you-care-to-enjoy, plenty to fill you up, a good variety of options (from salad to meats, sides, and dessert), great theming, lots of seating and it’s all indoors (cons: not good if you don’t like barbecue-style food, probably not the most unique or adventurous food you can choose)
 - Honorable mention: Hollywood & Vine–buffet, character meal, plenty of safe options for everyone to pick from (cons: not the most unique or particularly spectacular eats compared to other spots)
- Quick Service–**ABC Commissary** or **Backlot Express**–both have plenty of seating (quite a bit indoors, especially at ABC Commissary), the menus also have a good amount of different eats to feed the whole group (for more unique eats, head to ABC Commissary; for your more standard chicken and burgers, consider Backlot Express)
 - Honorable mention: Pizzerizzo does not have our favorite food in all of Disney World, but we have to mention it here simply because the restaurant has SO MUCH SEATING spread through 2 levels (indoors and outdoors)

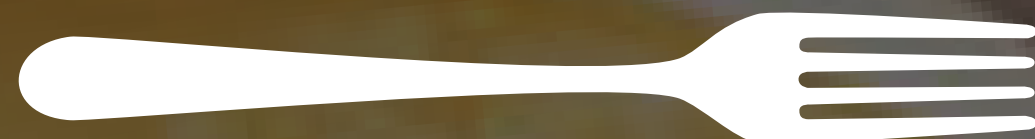

Mickey Brownie Sundae (Hollywood Scoops)

First stop, let's head over to Hollywood Scoops on Sunset Boulevard. In the shadow and echo of the screams from Tower of Terror, you can try some ice cream treats. The Mickey Brownie Sundae is a year-round choice but be sure to look for seasonal, over-the-top milkshakes too!

POG Gelato (Grand Avenue Gelato Cart)

Next, stroll over to Grand Avenue and stop by the Gelato Cart (you'll find it over by Muppet*Vision 3D). Grab your favorite gelato flavor (we're partial to the POG option—passion fruit, orange, and guava!!).



PB&J Milkshake (50's Prime Time Cafe)

We're coming up on the finish line now. Stroll over to 50's Prime Time Cafe and enjoy the fan-favorite PB&J milkshake with your comfort food classics and retro entertainment!

Carrot Cake Whoopie Pie (Trolley Car Cafe)

We're starting off strong at the Trolley Car Cafe with the Carrot Cake Whoopie Pie. This has been one of our favorites for years. Though it has evolved over time, we still keep coming back to it.

Wookiee Cookie (Backlot Express)

Next, let's get another cookie sandwich! Head to Backlot Express for the Wookiee Cookie! Think of an oatmeal cream pie large enough to satisfy a Wookiee. It's big enough to share but tasty enough not to want to (though recent changes have been a bit of a downgrade compared to what it was like before).



Toffee and Coconut Blondie (Catalina Eddie's)

Over on Sunset Boulevard, visit Catalina Eddie's for the Toffee and Coconut Blondie. Goopy toffee, toasted coconut, and salted caramel buttercream? What's not to love there?!

Lunch Box Tart (Woody's Lunch Box)

Now, head to Toy Story Land. Make your way to Woody's Lunch Box for the Lunch Box Tart. You can Mobile Order this to save some time in line and look to see if they have a special seasonal flavor that catches your eye.



Terror Cookie (Joffrey's Coffee by Tower of Terror)

And now for the final stop on our sweets crawl. Head over to the Joffrey's kiosk by Tower of Terror and see if they have the special Terror Cookie available! It features white chocolate chips, Oreo bits, and a dusting of cinnamon sugar on top and it is incredible!

SAVORY SNACKS CRAWL



Totchos (Woody’s Lunch Box)

Start over at Woody’s Lunch Box in Toy Story Land with an iconic snack -- the TOTCHOS! This features potato barrels topped with beef and bean chili, shredded cheese, queso, tomatoes, corn chips, and sour cream—it truly has it all. (The breakfast bowl with loaded potato barrels is also a good option!)

Bouncin Mini Churros (Ice Cold Hydraulics)

Next, stop by Ice Cold Hydraulics for some unique churros. These savory churros are topped with Coca-Cola and bourbon candied bacon, sriracha aioli, and scallions. The toppings really make this snack special—adding salty and savory elements!



Outpost Popcorn Mix (Kat Saka’s Kettle)

Blast into a galaxy far, far away for our next stop. Stop by Kat Saka’s Kettle in Galaxy’s Edge for the Outpost Mix—a sweet and spicy option (it’s a divisive snack that you’ll either love or hate!).



Bavarian Pretzel (BaseLine Tap House)

Now, for our final stop, wander up Grand Avenue to Baseline Tap House for the Bavarian Pretzel with beer cheese and spicy mustard. This is a gargantuan snack option that’s definitely big enough to share!

Grapefruit Cake Martini (Hollywood Brown Derby)

The Hollywood Brown Derby Lounge has plenty of great drinks to pick from, but the Grapefruit Cake Martini is particularly unique since the main restaurant attached to this spot is known for its Grapefruit Cake (might as well get a slice to try while you're there!).

Spiked Cold Brew Black Caf (Kat Saka's Kettle)

Next it's time to get a spiked coffee drink at Kat Saka's Kettle. This features Joffrey's Cold Brew topped with Sweet Cream Cheese and Chocolate Puffs and is spiked with Godiva Chocolate Liqueur. Mix it up to get that sweetness!



California-inspired Brew (Baseline Tap House)

Baseline Tap House is our next stop. This spot specializes in California-inspired brews. You can get an individual drink or a flight. But if beer isn't your drink of choice, you also have the option of a few cocktails or wine, and the non-alcoholic Barrilitos Strawberry Hibiscus Soda is great!

Fuzzy Tauntaun (Oga's Cantina)

See if Oga's Cantina is available on the Walk-up Waitlist in the My Disney Experience app (if you don't already have reservations). The Fuzzy Tautau is a popular drink, topped with a special foam that'll make your mouth numb.



Grown-Up's Lemonade (Woody's Lunch Box)

Our final stop on this drink crawl takes us right to Andy's backyard and over to Woody's Lunch Box for the Grown-Up's Lemonade. Sip on a zesty, citrusy cocktail while strolling under the over-sized Christmas lights in Toy Story Land.

THE BEST OF GALAXY'S EDGE CRAWL



Blue or Green Milk (Milk Stand)

First up, grab a Green or Blue Milk from the Milk Stand. Both are dairy-free, but the Blue Milk tends to have a fruity flavor, while the Green Milk tends to have a more citrus flavor. Those inclined (and 21+) can turn their milk choice into a cocktail.

Cold Brew Black Caf (Kat Saka's Kettle)

Grab the Black Caf for a caffeine boost topped with sweet cream cheese chocolatey treats. You can also get this spiked for a sweeter treat. (And consider checking out the controversial Outpost Popcorn Mix while you're here!)



Ronto Wrap (Ronto Roasters)

Stop by Ronto Roasters for a classic Ronto Wrap. Though the classic is the big fan-favorite, the other versions of the Ronto Wrap—including some plant-based ones—are also quite good.

Endorian Fried Chicken Tip Yip (Docking Bay 7)

Crispy fried chicken + macaroni and cheese are comfort foods, even in faraway galaxies. We've had mixed experiences with the chicken but when done well it can be delicious (and that mac and cheese is a FAV!),



Fuzzy Tauntaun (Oga's Cantina)

Oga's offers a wide range of unearthly beverages. The Fuzzy Tauntaun is the main draw here but there are other fun options too. The cocktails are pre-mixed so you can't tailor these—look through the menu to be sure you find one that suits your tastes.
