



Care & Maintenance of your shower screen

To preserve the life of your shower screen, the hardware and anodised/powder coated aluminium sections require regular cleaning to remove and prevent a build-up of soap scum, mildew, and hard water lime scale.

- After installation, thoroughly clean the screen ensuring construction materials such as concrete, plaster and paint splashes are removed before they have a chance to dry
- Never use abrasive household cleaners, steel wool, hard brushes, or excessive abrasive rubbing which will wear, damage, and dull the finish
- Wipe the surfaces with a clean, non-abrasive damp cloth using warm water and nonabrasive, pH neutral detergent solution
- For more stubborn dirt, a mild detergent should be used with a soft brush or sponge
- Surfaces should be thoroughly rinsed after cleaning to remove all residues

MAINTENANCE

Semi-framed & Frameless Shower Screens



In addition to regular cleaning, perform 6-monthly checks of:

- **Glass panel clearances:**
a change in the joint gap between glass panels or touching of door to panels is an indication that fixings may have become loose
- **Hinge clamp screws:**
check the screws to ensure they are tight and have not worked loose
- **Operation of the hinges:**
the door should operate smoothly without restriction. If noisy, a small amount of white mineral oil can be applied to the hinge

WARNINGS



It is important to follow the cleaning instructions outlined in this guide to ensure the finish of your shower screen is preserved over the years.

- Do not use cleaners which contain Hydrofluoric or Phosphoric Acid
- Never use alkaline, acidic or abrasive based cleaners
- Under no circumstances use strong solvent or harsh detergents, bleach, scourers or any other abrasive cleaner on the frames
- Do not clean glass when the glass is hot or in direct sunlight
- Avoid causing extreme temperature changes to the glass as this may lead to thermal fracture of the glass
- Some tapes or adhesives can stain or damage glass surfaces. Avoid using such materials unless they are known to be easily removed
