WELCOME -

A warm welcome to you, to the Annual General Meeting 2023/2024 of the Ceylon Fellowship of Service - Prithipura Home.

I am pleased to present to you the Annual Report for the year 2023/2024.

THE HOME -

Ceylon Fellowship of Service-Prithipura Home was established in 1962 with the object of providing lifelong residential care to persons with mental and physical disabilities and are in need of special care and attention. Presently we shelter 60 residents in 6 cottages situated in a three and a half acre land along the Sea coast of Palliyawatta, Hendala which land is held in Trust solely for the benefit of the residents.

CFS Prithipura Home is a registered Charitable Organization and is an Approved Charity under Inland Revenue Act No. 24 of 2017 para 1(a) of the 5th schedule and gazette no. 2288 of 12 th July 2022. This is a re-approval of the approval obtained in 1963.

We are also registered as a Home for the Disabled under the Western Province Social Service Department bearing Registration No. WP/SSD/G1DH/2011.06; a Voluntary Organization registered under Section 20 of the Protection the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act No. 28 of 1996, bearing Registration No. MSS/NSPD/R/94; also as a Voluntary Social Services/Non-Governmental Organization registered under Voluntary Social Services Organizations (Registration & Supervision) Act No. 31 of 1980 (as amended) bearing Registration No. FL113316.

MANAGEMENT OF THE HOME -

The rules and regulations governing the Management and Administration of the Home are enshrined in the **Constitution** of the Ceylon Fellowship of Service. The 1962 Constitution was amended in 2021 to streamline, amend and update the rules to cover new areas of progress made in the past 60 years of the existence of the Home and to enable the Executive Committee to manage and administer the Home more efficiently and professionally.

The Executive Committee is in overall charge and control of the Management and Administration of the Home and is comprised of four Office Bearers (Trustees) - the President as the Chief Executive, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer and a maximum of 15 Committee Members all of whom work on a voluntary basis.

To facilitate the Exco in the Management of the Home, several Home Management Subcommittees have been set up to oversee matters relating to - (i) the Residents, (ii) the Staff, (iii)Fund raising and Forward Planning, (iv)Legal, (v) security and Maintenance,(vi) Website and Media. Those not in the membership can be co-opted into the subcommittees on an advisory capacity. The Subcommittees report to the Exco through the President.

The Executive Committee employs suitable Staff headed by a Matron for the management of the day to day running of the Home and caring for the residents, and an Administrative/ Finance Officer manages the office and attends to the general administration, funds and finances of the Home.

STAFF AND REMUNERATION

Staff comprises of -

The Home Management Staff – headed by the Matron, Catherine Fernandez who is in overall charge of the day to day operations of running the Home; 12 Care givers also referred to as House Mothers are allocated to the 6 cottages, two in each cottage and three kitchen staff, a driver and a gate-keeper. All Home Management staff are resident at the Home and are on call 24/7. Driver who lives close to the Home is on call.

Office Staff – The work relating to the Administration, finance and Accounts of the Home is handled by the Administrator/Accounts Officer who heads this division. The Gate Keeper and the Gardner are supervised by the Admin Officer.

The School/ Activity Centre is run by two teachers trained in working with the disabled.

The Home Management Staff plays a pivotal role in managing the day to day activities of the Home. We have long standing and experienced House Mothers familiar with the temperaments, habits, food preferences and health issues of the

residents and care for them with great responsibility and kindness. A special thank you to the Matron Ms. Catherine Fernandez for her dedication.

The Home is short staffed and unfortunately there is a quick turn over of new recruits who do not seem to have the loyalty and staying power of the senior house-mothers. This could be due to the harsh economic difficulties experienced by most Sri Lankans especially the lower income groups.

Our staff have been given substantial salary increases over the years and now earn a reasonable salary package, they are members of the EPF/ETF and are entitled to a retiring gratuity after 5 years of service.

Ms. Gayani Gunawardene was recruited as the Assistant Matron in April 2023. Her neat and meticulous record keeping of the Dry Goods Stores and Maintenance records was very useful to the Home. Unfortunately Gayani had to resign from her post in December 2023 due to ill health and on doctor's advice. We wish her good health in the future.

RESIDENTS

1.(a) Our priority is caring for, and the welfare of the residents. Our 60 residents from the ages of 14 to 65 live in 6 cottages. The concept of life in a cottage is to create a feeling of belonging and living in a Home in a community environment. The 27 females reside at present in two cottages Prithi and Bates and the 33 males in four cottages Norad, Jayawardene, Rosy and Canada. The cottages are provided with necessary facilities, including furniture, wash rooms and toilets, fans, TV. Wheel chairs etc. The residents in each cottage are cared for by two care givers. Most residents come in as children to the Home, sent by the Courts through Probation Officers and the Social Services Dept. Prithipura Home takes care of them from childhood to adult hood and throughout their lives.

(b) Danuja -

Danuja is now 20 years old. He attends Don Bosco National School in Palliawatte and is scheduled to sit the GCE Ordinary Level exam in May this year. We have been giving him private tuition for the past seven years with Ms Malani Anthony who expects him to pass the Ordinary level exam comfortably. Danuja has also joined a Paralympic Rowing program recommended by the Ragama Rehabilitation Centre and attends Rowing training at the Army facility in Nelum Mawatha every Sunday supervised by the Paralympic National Rowing

Coach. He has participated in competition and seems to be keen on the sport and we were informed that he has potential in this field.

c) Farzan –

Farzan was sent to our Home in 2019 by the Pugoda Magistrate Courts after he was found loitering. He has the condition ADHD and had been warded at Angoda Mental Hospital before he was sent to us. His behavior is very erratic and tends to become violent when he does not get what he wants. As he is a threat to the others as well as him-self we have attempted to get him transferred to another Home but have not been successful so far. His mother does a cleaning job as a daily and has two other younger sons and the father has been in Jail periodically for drug peddling and abuse. Currently, we are working with an Islamic volunteer group that may be able to relocate him, we are hopeful!

(2). Health Care -

We have an aging population of residents and many have age related illnesses and need hospitalization frequently and attendants are required to stay with them in hospital, for which we have to incur additional expenses. Many of the residents are registered with clinics at the General Hospitals in Colombo and Ragama and get their regular medicines from the clinic. However, due to the shortage of medicines in the country, we are compelled to obtain medicines from private pharmacies at considerable cost.

Vaccinations - Covid Vaccine -

In the year 2022, most residents and staff had been vaccinated with three doses of vaccines and the 4th was given to the staff and residents who were under sixty years of age. This was carried out under the direction and supervision of the MOH Wattala. Although the Home suffered from an outbreak of Covid , the residents and staff recovered without much side effects and thankfully no casualties.

(4) **Meals** for the residents are according to a set meal plan which is periodically revised, where we try to ensure that a balanced diet is provided to them at all times. Despite the non-availability of essential food items in the market and the rising cost of food we still provide a daily egg together with fish or chicken to all residents.

5) Sumithrayo – Negombo –

We have come to an arrangement with the Volunteer Group, Sumithrayo, Negombo branch to visit our Home once in about two months to hold interactive counseling sessions with our staff. We feel that it is very necessary as the staff live in the premises and cope with the residents 24/7 and are also faced with having to deal with other staff members with varying personalities. The staff seem to enjoy the sessions and is also offered the chance to discuss their personal issues with the volunteers on a one-to-one basis with utmost confidentiality. The Sumithrayo team has visited four times from the month of June 2023. Their next session is on 19th April '24. Swun the Secretary and I have also attended these sessions and found their methodology very impressive.

Our sincere thanks to Ms. Srima Peries, Mr. Christy Peirispulle, Mr. Ralph de Silva and Ms. Anusha Fernando and the other volunteers for their dedication and for taking us on board.

SCHOOL AND ACTIVITY CENTRE

Ms. Lakshika Fonseka, heads the school/ activity centre and is assisted by Ms. Samima Bohoran. Lakshika has been working as a teacher at the Home with dedication since 2013. She has been trained to work with people with special needs. Ms. Bohoran also followed a course in special needs education which has enhanced her capability in

teaching singing, dancing, cookery and handwork. The residents attend "school" wearing their special uniforms - for half a day on week days.

We encourage Lakshika and Samima to attend workshops and training programs for the differently able so that they continue to enhance their knowledge for the benefit of our residents. They have attended the workshops and training program conducted by The Chitra Lane School for the Special Child and the Association for the Intellectually disabled –Sri Lanka (AIDSL).

The following activities were carried out during the course of year with the participation of the residents.

- 1. Poya day religious activities and observing sil.
- 2. Vesak Poya day religious activities and making and decorating the Home with vesak lanterns and observing sil.
- 3. Sightseeing tour of Vesak decorations with bus sponsored by Mr.Manoharan
- 4. Aluth Avurudu Celebrations with Piumi Bagya and team
- 5. Picnic at the beach organized by the teachers
- 6. Residents and staff outing to Galle Face and Vihara Maha Devi Park
- 7. X.mas party
- 8. Dental Day organized by Dr. Shivani Wijeratne and the Team from the Dental Institute of Sri Lanka
- 9. Sumithrayo (Negombo branch) have conducted 4 sessions of "Befriending" with our staff and residents.
- 10. Visit by the Grade 6 students of Elizabeth Moir school

BUILDINGS AND MAINTENANCE.

Our buildings are old and in need of continuous repairs. The drainage pits of the six cottages are regularly cleaned out by the Municipality at a considerable cost to us.

Unfortunately the project to upgrade the entire Home by Mr. Nahil Wijesuriya ,Chairman of the Agnes Wijesuriya Children and Elders Homes; as mentioned in the previous Annual Report had to be abandoned after many months of discussion between the Donor and our Executive Committee, due to differences of opinion on the objective of the whole project.

However, almost at the same time, Mr. Salman Eliyas came forward offering to fund and upgrade /build the buildings of the Home as required by us.

Mr. Salman Eliyas is the young gentlemen who visited our Home in December 2022 with his wife Sakina to treat our residents and staff on X'mas day with a Buriyani meal and gifts. Fortunately for us, they had taken a liking to our Home and the residents, and subsequently he contacted me to inquire about our needs for the Home and so started our association with Salman offering to fund, supervise and construct our Buildings that were in urgent need of upgrading. This being done according to our requirements and specifications.

From May 2023; the executive committee met with Mr. Salman and his team of construction personnel to discuss our requirements and Plans were drawn and approved by the Exco for the following –

- 1) Activity Building a complete demolition of the existing building and rebuilding according to our specifications.
- 2) New Cottage for the female residents on the same design as the existing cottages, with the inclusion of an additional room for the second housemother.
- 3) Upgrading of Canada Cottage including replacing of the entire roof along with the beams. This Cottage also now has an additional room for the second housemother.

All three buildings are nearing completion and will be ready within a few weeks. We plan to provide these buildings with new furniture and equipment and to landscape the surrounding areas as well.

Our very grateful thanks to Mr. Salman Eliyas for his generosity and consider ourselves truly blessed to have been chosen for such unstinted assistance. We thank also Kamal and Lal the Project Managers for their supervision and Buddhika the Contractor and his men who carried out the work without any disruption to the running of the Home.

We also thank our Patron Brigadier Asoka Perera for being a great support to us during the initial stages of this project. We also thank Mr. Shamin Jayawickrema of SJJ Architects who first initiated the project to upgrade the Activity Building during the latter part of 2022.

We intend financing the cost of the furniture and equipment required for the Activity Building and the newly done up cottages with the funds donated by Ms.Erena Fonseka from the Last Will of her mother Mrs. Vera Fonseka of Melbourne, Australia. We are fortunate that Mrs. Vera Fonseka gifted Aus \$ 10,000 to our Home and Irina arranged for the transfer of the Funds to us. Our grateful thanks to Erena Fonseka.

FUND RAISER SALE - 2023

Mrs. Anoja Karunaratne resigned from the Executive Committee in April 2023 after being the Treasurer for many years and the President for a short period from November 2021 to March 2022 following the demise of Mr. Sanjeev Mohan in October 2021. In November 2022 Mrs. Joan Jayamanne who was President since April 2022 resigned from her post as well as the Executive committee due to ill health. In April 2023 Mrs. Sunethra Fernando resigned from the post of Treasure as well as the Executive Committee as she will be living in Australia for the greater part with her two children who reside there. Mr. Luvi Seiman who was elected to the Executive Committee at the last AGM failed to attend any meetings and hence was treated as vacated his post from the Exco.

We welcome Major General Lohan Goonewardene, Mrs. Renuka de Soyza and Mrs Badra Jayaweera to the Executive Committee. They joined the Exco in July 2023. Maj. Gen Lohan is an asset to the Exco as his years of experience in administration are of

great benefit to us. Renuka is no stranger to our Home. She has been visiting the Home for many years and as a member of the Exco some years ago. Badra too has many years of experience in senior Management.

My sincere thanks to our Trustees Vice-President Indira Wettasinghe and Secretary Swun-kou Fernando; and the other members of the current Executive Committee, Minoli de Soysa, Dr Arundathi Kurukulasuriya, Maj. General Lohan Goonewardene, Renuka de Soyza and Badra Jayaweera who have supported me at all times and whose input has been invaluable.

THE YEAR GONE BY -

As with the year 2022; year 2023 too saw our country in grave economic, social and political crisis and instability which resulted in the escalation of the cost of living, increase in the prices and shortages of food including essentials like milk, medicines, diesel, petrol and cooking gas. In addition Covid was still an issue. All this greatly disrupted the normal day to day routine of running the Home and the usual life style of the residents. This also curtailed visits of the Executive Committee to the Home. Our primary concern at this time was to ensure that there were adequate supplies and stocks of food, medicines, diesel to run the vehicles to take the residents to Hospital on clinic days and in emergencies and cooking gas for cooking meals for the residents and staff. Donations in cash and kind were noticeably reducing when compared to previous years.

THE WAY FORWARD -

The much needed upgrading of the Activity Building and the New Cottage for females will be ready for occupation within a few weeks as soon as we source the furniture. Canada Cottage will also be ready soon. The upgrading of Rosy Cottage which is in dire need of upgrading will be commenced by Mr. Salman and his team shortly.

The unfortunate misdeeds of the former Manager who resigned at the end of August '22 having joined the staff in April 2021; resulted in the current executive committee having to deal with many issues that stemmed from her dishonesty. Having made a police complaint, we have now handed over the case to a criminal lawyer.

Although we enjoyed the high Deposit Interest rates offered during the latter part of year 2022 the deposit Interest rates have since been reduced significantly. It appears that the Income tax waiver received in respect of our Interest income for Y/A 2022/23 will continue as the Inland Revenue Department has not specified that it is only for a particular year.

Due to the high cost of essential recurring expenditure and the reduction in donations we expect a substantial operational loss during the year 2024. Hence, during the year we have planned to organize fund raising events such as a musical concert, crowd funding, pop-up sales and continue to appeal to our Prithipura friends in Sri Lanka and overseas.

Regarding the future management of the Home; attracting young members to join the management team is a challenge, perhaps due to the current economic climate. During the last two years all the younger Exco members resigned either to go abroad or due to the challenges of their personal lives.

The current Executive Committee is well past retirement age and the membership of CFS Prithipura Home must urgently come up with a solution to this problem. I appeal to you ALL to give this some thought.

I thank my fellow Executive Committee members for the support given me and hope that we will stay loyal to this Home until we can find a solution to the issue of succession.

I thank the Matron Ms.Catherine Fernandez for her dedication and loyalty amidst all the challenges of the last two years. Also Mr. Asoka Gunatilleke our Admin & Finance Officer who has settled into his post. And lastly the staff who work 24/7 doing work that most of us will not be able to cope with even for a day, Thank you, we greatly appreciate your dedication.

A big thank you to the delightful residents who make one feel that facing all the recent challenges is not in vain!
