Since 1960, the Ceylon Fellowship of Service Prithipura Home has flourished in tranquil surroundings on three and a half acres of land in the coastal town of Wattala.

The Ceylon Fellowship of Service Prithipura Home was inaugurated in 1962. Under the guidance and dedication of Bikkhu Sumana, the Home initially began as a boys' home. There were three huts with cemented floors, wooden walls and thatch roofs. It had four residents with a few house mothers to care for them.

Today there are 60 residents housed in six cottages on the premises, giving the feeling of an extended family unit. Four cottages - Norad, Canada, Jayewardene and Rosy - house male residents while the females live in Bates and Prithi. Our staff numbers nine house mothers, three kitchen staff, a matron, an administration officer, a gate keeper, a gardener and a driver.

Our mission is to care for the residents in a community environment that enables them to live life to the fullest. We offer a safe place for the well-being and rehabilitation of the residents who need special care and attention due to mental, physical, social or economic reasons. At the Home, residents are encouraged to develop their own personalities and identities.

A New Cottage and Activity Centre

Times continue to be tough with a decrease in danes and donations and continually rising prices of basic essentials. All efforts are being made to streamline and consolidate the cost of running the home but these six months have been a challenge to bridge the shortfall between income and expenditure.

In good news, the newly upgraded Activity Centre and Canada Cottage were completed by June and are functional. The Activity Centre has been furnished with tables and chairs, a magi board on wheels and equipped with cookery equipment. The residents enjoy their cookery classes. A 55" smart TV is to be purchased shortly.

Rosy Cottage renovation is almost completed and the new cottage for females will be formally opened by the end of August and 10 female residents will be transferred there from the overcrowded Prithi and Bates cottages.

The buildings have been upgraded entirely through the generosity of Mr. Salman Eliyas and the furniture and equipment with funds received from the estate of Mrs. Vera Fonseka in Australia. We are very grateful to Mr. Eliyas and Ms. Irina Fonseka for choosing CFS Prithipura Home.
