





ared down with a reigning neutral palette, the home is transformed by a discerning eye for detail, a refined material palette, and a curated selection of art. "It is because of clients like these that I love my profession more and more," says Vasundhara Sampath, principal designer at her Hyderabadbased practice, Phylosophy Design Studio, who is the creative force behind designing this luxurious home. A past client recommended her to this multigenerational family of seven, and it was an instant match. The clients, in their early forties, comprise a family that includes parents and three children — two young daughters and a son. They desired a home in Hyderabad that felt and looked different from their previous residence. Having lived in a bungalow for many years, they were reluctant to move into an apartment but the hesitation was partly alleviated when they decided to merge two four-bedroom flats vertically. While the bungalow boasted a classical appearance, the new home required a contemporary design featuring a layout that provided privacy, connectivity, spaciousness, and complied with vastu principles. With this brief in mind, Vasundhara developed a plan for a 13,200 sq ft duplex apartment, connected by an internal staircase.

Both floors share the same footprint yet differ in spatial planning and accent colours. A warm beige provides a neutral backdrop, while bronze accents define the design. Hints of brass in partitions, inlay, furniture and accessories contribute to an indigenous, refined appearance. The home also features art and murals that echo the family's former residence, created by artists

such as Somnath Bothe, Yuvan Bothysathuvar and Umakant Kanade. On the ground floor, a set of steps near the foyer includes a single, longer step clad in lapis lazuli, establishing the blue accent that recurs throughout the level. This blue detail appears in the lapis and mother-of-pearl inlay in the flooring, in artworks and furniture from Within, and in the motifs of partition walls, showcasing Vasundhara's design approach. A notable accent is also the Jaipur console in blue, positioned in the dining room. On the first floor, multiple accent colours come into play. The master bedroom features a crystal green, inspired by subtle hints of malachite in the bed and flooring pattern. In the drawing room, a dual-toned artwork by Yuvan Bothysathuvar shifts from blue to red depending on the angle, neatly encapsulating the home's coherent colour scheme.

While the home adheres to the design brief, the son's room is crafted with its own distinctive character. "The six-year-old boy wanted a family of African elephants with accents of yellow like bananas, and even a baby elephant eating sugarcane," explains Vasundhara. And so his wish was fulfilled with this exact scene painted on the walls, as a thoughtful personalised touch. The new abode is extremely stylish, but it is details like these that make it a home. Room by room and detail by detail, Vasundhara has designed the home to be inviting and comfortable, while curating an aesthetic and functionality for the future. "The client envisioned a classy and elegant style, his wife preferred a rustic character, and the son wanted his jungle theme. It was a clear decision, and in the end, everyone was satisfied – including me," concludes Vasundhara with a smile of satisfaction. \| \Delta phylosophy.in
