Level I

Level II

6. Urban Exploration – The basics of cities. Buildings, zones, districts, transportation, and times.

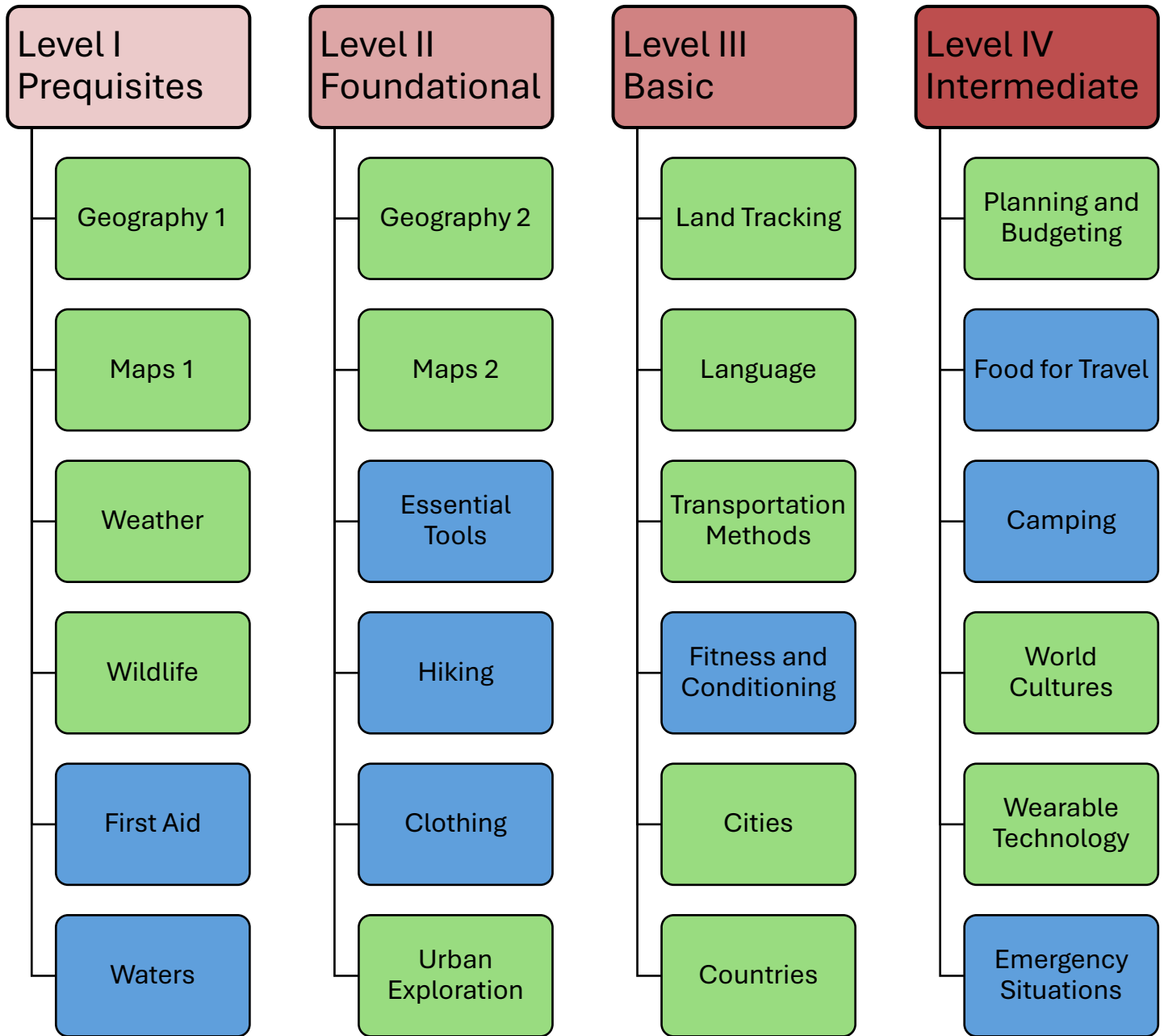
Level III

1. Land Tracking – Learning to explore new places and not get lost. Fundamentals of navigation
2. Language – One (1) language to an intermediate fluency for communication within new regions
3. Transportation Methods – Planes, trains, buses, routes, highways, roads, paths, and underground
4. Fitness and Conditioning – Basics of physical activity to handle any terrains and land features
5. Cities – Complex inner workings of city economies, ecosystems, and shipping and transport
6. Countries – Vital information and statistics about countries all around the world

Level IV

1. Planning and Budgeting – Planning for trips, budgeting for longer journeys and equipment
2. Food for Travel – Survival foods that can be used in any situation. Essential nourishments
3. Camping – Spending time outdoors overnight in remote areas. Building shelter safely
4. World Cultures – Knowledge of cultures/peoples in various regions with their customs and norms
5. Wearable Technology – Travel and survival gadgets and electronics. GPS, heating, lightning, etc.
6. Emergency Situations – Awareness, understanding, and action training for potential dangers
