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ON THE WORLD PREMIERE

It's become pretty commonplace in modern theatre and film to adapt Shakespeare's stories into modern retellings or modernized concepts - setting Hamlet on Mars or using the same plot to tell a new story (fun fact: the movie Forbidden Planet is based on The Tempest!). It's practically unheard of to take other stories and make them Shakespeare-an. And even when you do, it's for the novelty of reading it, not putting it on a stage.

Jordan Monsell, however, has found a way to take these stories and make them something that can be translated to a realistic stage production. The Wizard of Oz story works so well in this case. The characters draw a lot of parallels to Shakespeare's iconic roles see how many references you can spot! By the end of the show you might think the story was written by Shakespeare in the first place!

Oz is something special and its story has had powerful impact on people for over 100 years now. It's seen many iterations that have been a beacon for many in various communities. As a proud member of the Queer community, this story holds a special place in my community's history. If this was the 50s I'd be considered a 'friend of Dorothy'. And legend in the Queer community has it that the patrons of the Stonewall Inn were singing Somewhere Over the Rainbow as they mourned the passing of Judy Garland on that fateful night in 1969 when they were raided and the gay rights movement officially began.

Directing this production has been a very special experience. The team, the cast, the crew have all put so much heart and passion into this show and I've enjoyed shaping it into the production you're seeing tonight. I want to thank every single person who has had a hand in bringing this show to life, and especially thank the Smalley brothers, the driving force behind Odesa Company, for trusting me with this chapter of their story.

And lastly, I want to thank all of you for coming and choosing to spend your time with us while we share this version of this classic tale. I sincerely hope you enjoy the show.



JEREMY HEWITSON Director Shakespeare's Oz



In the year 1609, roughly one year before Shakespeare would write *The Tempest*, a small ship of English colonists bound for Virginia would be wrecked off the shores of Bermuda. A survivor, one William Strachey, would describe his ordeal in a letter, circulated back home. In his book *Shakespeare A-Z*, author Charles Boyce speculates that Shakespeare may have read Strachey's letter, and exploited it's accounts for *The Tempest*; specifically the shipwreck in 1.1, and Ariel's description of St. Elmo's Fire in 1.2.

But be it Bermuda or Virginia, Shakespeare was no doubt influenced by stories emerging from this new continent across the sea, just as author L. Frank Baum was influenced by the Bard's play of a wizard and his rule over an island of magical creatures. In fact, Baum frequently memorized passages of Shakespeare and even founded a Shakespearean troupe with his father's financial backing. Every great artist has stood on the shoulders of giants. Shakespeare had Chaucer and Plutarch; Baum had Carroll and Shakespeare.

The Wizard of Oz, first printed in 1900, almost 300 years after the Tempest, has become as iconic a piece of literature as any Shakespeare play. Schools and theatre companies across the globe continue to stage productions of both works, enchanting audiences of children and adults alike.

It was out of this enchantment for both authors that I have attempted to combine the two. Certainly, while *The Tempest* was the main source of inspiration, I used quotes from the entire Shakespeare canon, just as I used references from several of Baum's books, and not just the 1939 musical. For example, we do not learn of the Tinman's harrowing backstory in *The Wizard of Oz* but in the 1918 book *The Tin Woodsman of Oz*. And when Dorothy first wakes upon the shores of Oz, it is Viola from *Twelfth Night* that she quotes.

I have no doubt that purists of Shakespeare and Baum will scoff at such an adaptation, but it is my hope that this world premiere production will renew your interest in these authors, and that a Caliban quoting Cowardly Lion makes you smile and forget about your troubles if only for a brief moment.

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LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT




