Pet Care Checklist

Daily Essentials

Dogs:

- [] Fresh water available at all times
- [] Nutritious food according to age and breed
- [] Daily walk/exercise (adjust based on breed needs)
- [] Potty breaks every 4-6 hours
- [] Check for any signs of illness or injury
- [] Mental stimulation (toys, training)

Cats:

- [] Fresh water available at all times
- [] Nutritious food according to age and activity level
- [] Clean litter box daily
- [] Playtime and interaction
- [] Check for any signs of illness or injury
- [] Scratching post available

Grooming Routine

Dogs:

- [] Brush coat (frequency depends on breed)
- [] Check and clean ears weekly
- [] Trim nails as needed (usually every 2-4 weeks)
- [] Bathe as needed (over-bathing can dry out skin)
- [] Brush teeth regularly with dog-specific toothpaste

Cats:

- [] Brush coat regularly (helps prevent hairballs)
- [] Check and clean ears periodically
- [] Trim nails as needed (usually every 2-4 weeks)
- [] Occasional bath if needed (most cats selfgroom)
- [] Brush teeth regularly with cat-specific toothpaste

Health & Wellness

Dogs:

- [] Annual vet check-up
- [] Vaccinations up-to-date
- [] Heartworm prevention
- [] Flea and tick prevention
- [] Deworming as recommended by vet
- [] Monitor weight and body condition

Cats:

- [] Annual vet check-up
- [] Vaccinations up-to-date
- [] Flea and tick prevention (if applicable)
- [] Deworming as recommended by vet
- [] Monitor weight and body condition
- [] Be aware of common cat diseases

Environmental Enrichment

Dogs:

- [] Provide a variety of toys
- [] Rotate toys regularly to keep things interesting
- [] Puzzle toys for mental stimulation
- [] Safe chew toys
- [] Training sessions and games

Cats:

- [] Provide a variety of toys (wands, balls, etc.)
- [] Scratching posts and cat trees
- [] Rotate toys to maintain interest
- [] Window perch for bird watching
- [] Safe hiding places

Safety First

Dogs:

- [] Secure fencing or leash when outdoors
- [] Keep toxic substances out of reach (cleaning supplies, medications, etc.)
- [] Be aware of potential hazards during walks (e.g., hot pavement)
- [] Proper identification (collar with tags, microchip)
- [] Safe transportation (crate or seatbelt harness)

Cats:

- [] Keep toxic substances out of reach (cleaning supplies, medications, poisonous plants, etc.)
- [] Secure windows and balconies
- [] Be aware of potential hazards (string, rubber bands)
- [] Proper identification (collar with tag, microchip)
- [] Safe transportation (carrier)
