







Why did the player get kicked out of the bakery?



-Because they can't catch up!



Why don't soccer players get cold?



dread! What am I?


-Card

you'd have no shot! What am I?


-Pass

in and join the dance! Who am I?


-Substitute





General Soccer Facts

World Cup Facts

1. The first FIFA World Cup was held in 1930 in Uruguay.
 2. Brazil has won the most World Cups—5 times.
 3. The fastest goal in World Cup history was scored by Hakan Şükür (Turkey) in 11 seconds against South Korea in 2002.
 4. Just Fontaine (France) scored 13 goals in the 1958 World Cup—the most in a single tournament.
 5. Miroslav Klose (Germany) is the all-time top scorer in World Cup history with 16 goals.

6. The 2014 World Cup semi-final, where Germany beat Brazil 7-1, is the biggest semi-final win in history.

7. The oldest World Cup goal scorer is Roger Milla (Cameroon), who scored at age 42 in 1994.

8. No country outside Europe or South America has ever won the FIFA World Cup.

9. Italy and Brazil have played the most World Cup finals—each appearing 6 times.

10. The 2006 World Cup Final featured the infamous Zidane headbutt.

11. Soccer is called “football” in almost every country except the United States, Canada, and a few others.

12. FIFA stands for Fédération Internationale de Football Association.

13. Over 250 million people play soccer around the world.

14. Real Madrid was named the FIFA Club of the 20th Century.

15. FC Barcelona's motto is “Més que un club”, which means “More than a club.”

16. The oldest football club is Sheffield F.C., founded in 1857 in England.

17. The Maracanã Stadium in Brazil once held 199,854 fans in 1950.

18. The Premier League began in 1992, replacing the old English First Division.

19. The Ballon d'Or is awarded annually to the world's best player.

20. Pelé and Maradona are often cited as the greatest players of all time.



Brazilian Soccer Trivia

21. Pelé won three World Cups: 1958, 1962, and 1970.

22. Brazil is the only country to appear in every World Cup.

23. The iconic yellow Brazil jersey was adopted after losing to Uruguay in 1950.

24. Ronaldinho was known for playing soccer with a smile and incredible skill.

25. Neymar passed Pelé's official Brazil goal tally in 2023.

European Soccer

26. UEFA Champions League is the most prestigious club competition in Europe.

27. Cristiano Ronaldo is the top scorer in Champions League history.

28. Lionel Messi has won the Ballon d'Or a record 8 times (as of 2023).

29. Manchester United was the first English team to win the European Cup in 1968.

30. AC Milan has won 7 European Cups/Champions League titles, second only to Real Madrid.

31. Camp Nou (Barcelona) is the largest stadium in Europe.

32. Wembley Stadium in London is called the "Home of Football."

33. Old Trafford is nicknamed "The Theatre of Dreams."

34. Signal Iduna Park (Borussia Dortmund) is known for the "Yellow Wall" of fans.

35. La Bombonera in Argentina literally translates to "The Chocolate Box."

Argentina & South American Soccer

36. Diego Maradona's "Hand of God" goal was scored against England in 1986.

37. In the same match, he scored the "Goal of the Century" after dribbling past five players.

38. Argentina has won 3 World Cups—1978, 1986, and 2022.

39. Boca Juniors vs River Plate is one of the most intense rivalries in world soccer.

40. Lionel Messi finally won the World Cup in 2022, cementing his legacy.



Records and Firsts

41. The longest soccer match ever recorded lasted 3 hours and 23 minutes.

42. The fastest red card was given after 2 seconds in 2000 (Lee Todd, UK).

43. The highest-scoring game ever ended 149–0 (SO l'Emyrne vs AS Adema, 2002).

44. The most goals scored in a single match by one player is 13 by Archie Thompson.

45. Christine Sinclair (Canada) is the world's top international goal scorer, male or female.

Women's Soccer

46. The first Women's World Cup was held in 1991 in China.

47. The USA Women's National Team has won 4 World Cups, the most in history.

48. Mia Hamm was one of the first global female soccer icons.

49. The USWNT won back-to-back World Cups in 2015 and 2019.

50. Brazil's Marta is the top Women's World Cup scorer with 17 goals.

Rivalries & Derbies

51. El Clásico is played between Real Madrid and Barcelona.

52. The Merseyside Derby is between Liverpool and Everton.

53. The North London Derby is Arsenal vs Tottenham Hotspur.

54. Boca Juniors vs River Plate is called the Superclásico.

55. The Milan Derby (Inter vs AC Milan) is known as the Derby della Madonnina.

63. Transfer windows are set times during the year when clubs can buy/sell players.

64. The Premier League is the richest soccer league in the world.

65. Sponsorships and TV rights generate billions for top clubs annually.

68. Gianluigi Buffon played professional soccer until age 45.

70. Tim Howard made 16 saves in a 2014 World Cup game vs Belgium—a record.

Historical Moments

71. England won their only World Cup in 1966.

72. The Azteca Stadium in Mexico hosted two World Cup finals (1970 and 1986).

73. The "Golden Goal" rule once ended matches when the first goal was scored in extra time.

74. The back-pass rule (banning goalies from using hands on a teammate's pass) was introduced in 1992.

75. The first live broadcast of a soccer match was in 1937 by the BBC.

Continental Tournaments

76. The EURO Championship is Europe's top international tournament.

77. Copa América is the oldest international tournament—established in 1916.

78. AFCON (Africa Cup of Nations) crowns Africa's top team every two years.

79. Asia's top tournament is the AFC Asian Cup.

80. CONCACAF Gold Cup is North America's regional tournament.

81. The term “soccer” originated in England, derived from “Association Football.”

82. The smallest country to qualify for the World Cup is Trinidad and Tobago.
