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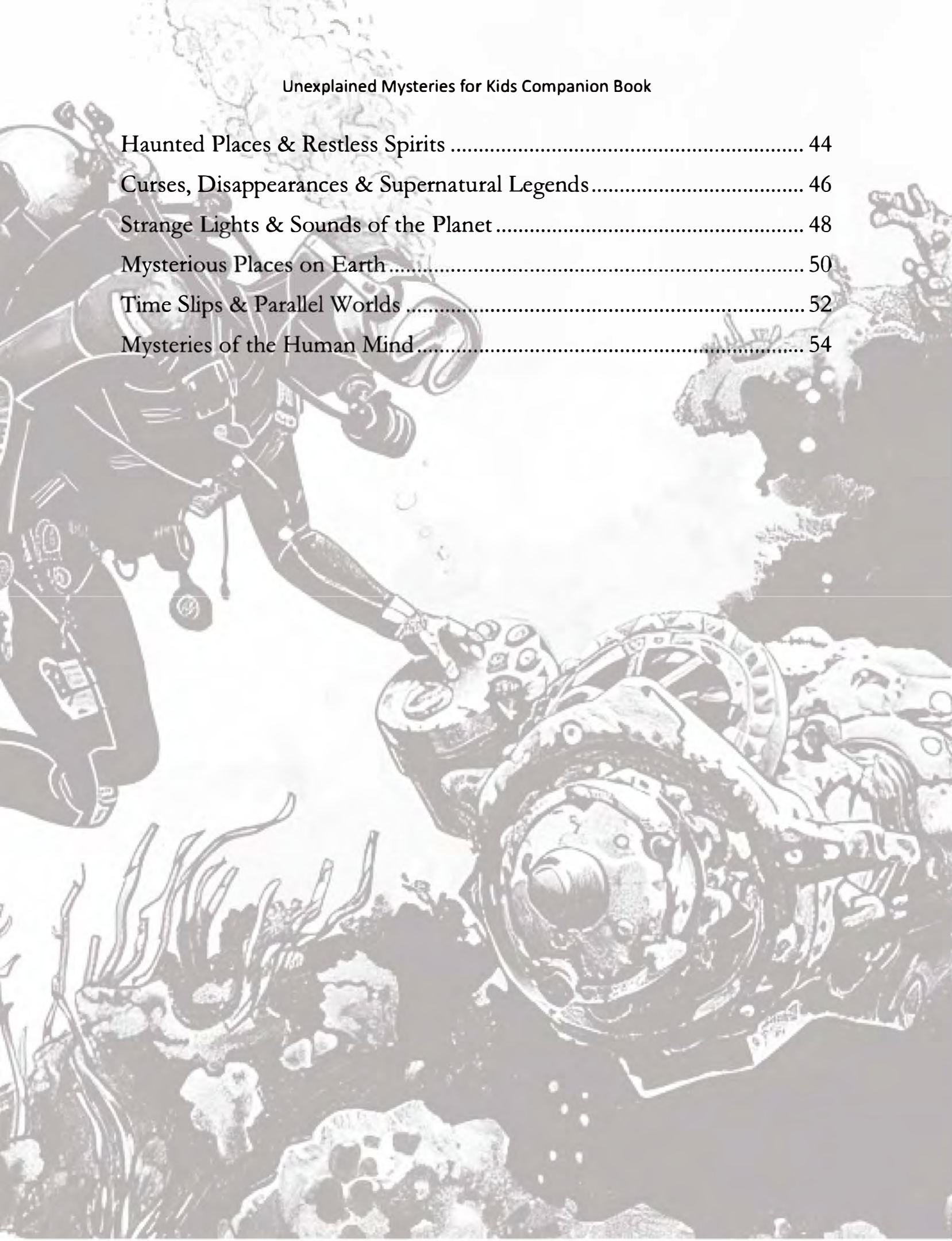

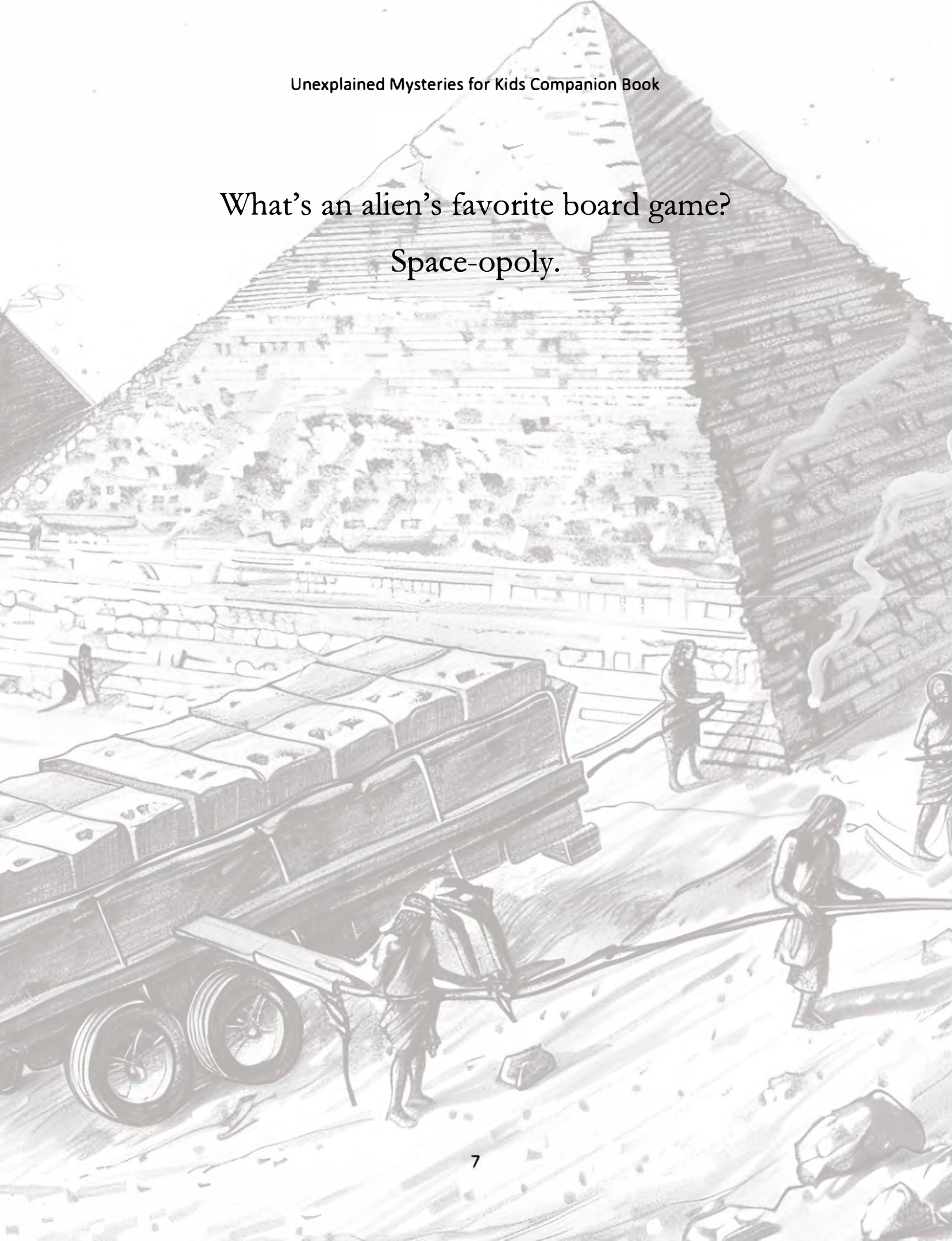

What forgotten thing did explorers find?


Answer: Hidden ruins

What spooky creature might visit the corral?

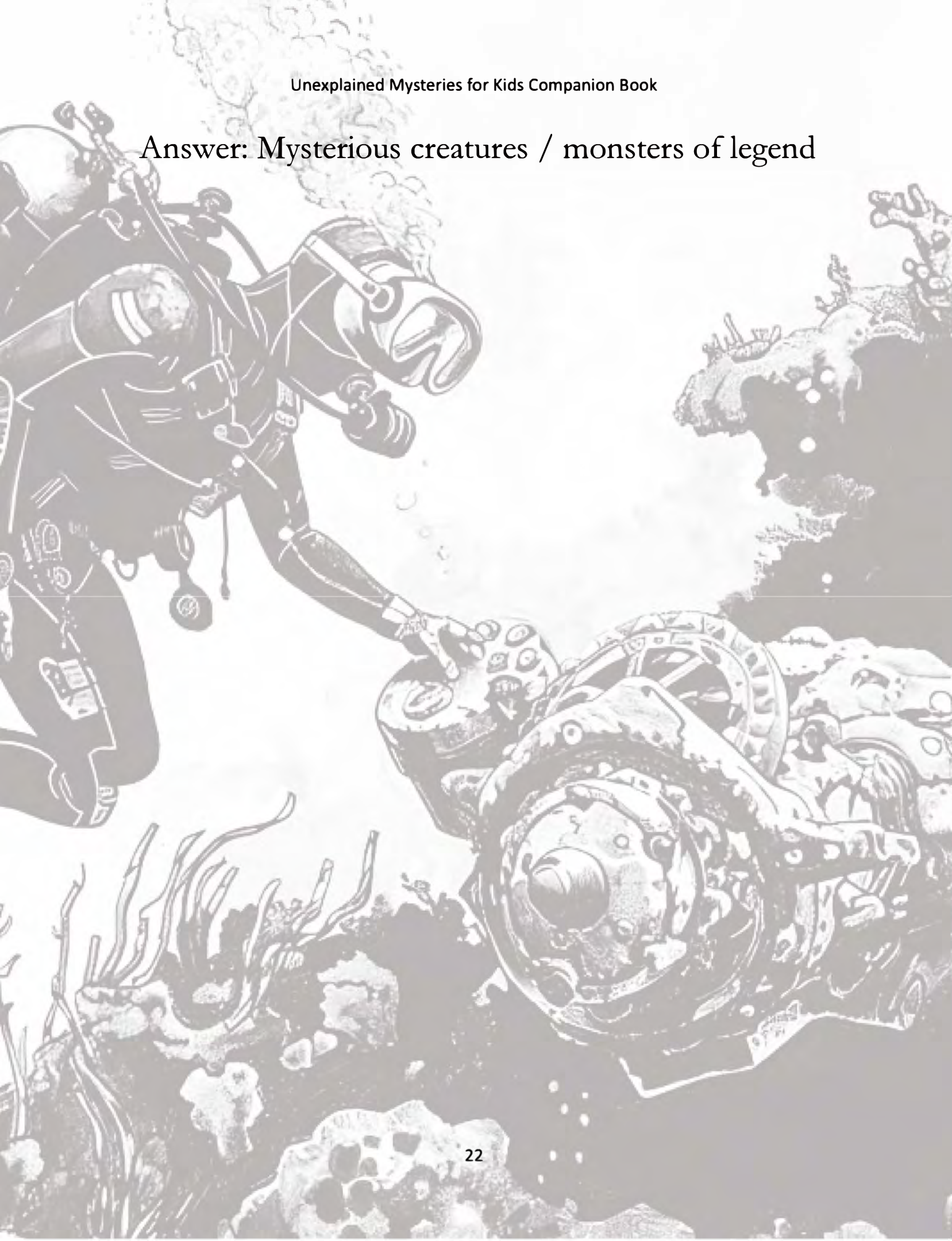
Answer: The Chupacabra

What do we call someone who just... disappears?


Answer: A missing person / disappearance

1. Some scientists believe Atlantis may have been inspired by a real volcanic island that exploded 3,600 years ago.
2. The ancient city of Heracleion sank into the sea and was rediscovered only in the year 2000.
3. The Maya used chocolate not just as food—but as money.
4. El Dorado was originally a man, not a city, known for covering himself in gold dust.

5. Many Maya temples were hidden for centuries beneath jungle vines and trees.

6. The Inca carved entire cities out of solid stone—without using iron tools.

7. Machu Picchu is so well-built that not even a knife blade fits between the stones.

8. Some lost cities left behind perfectly straight roads hundreds of miles long.

9. Satellite images continue to reveal new hidden ruins every year.

85. The Philadelphia Experiment allegedly involved invisibility technology.

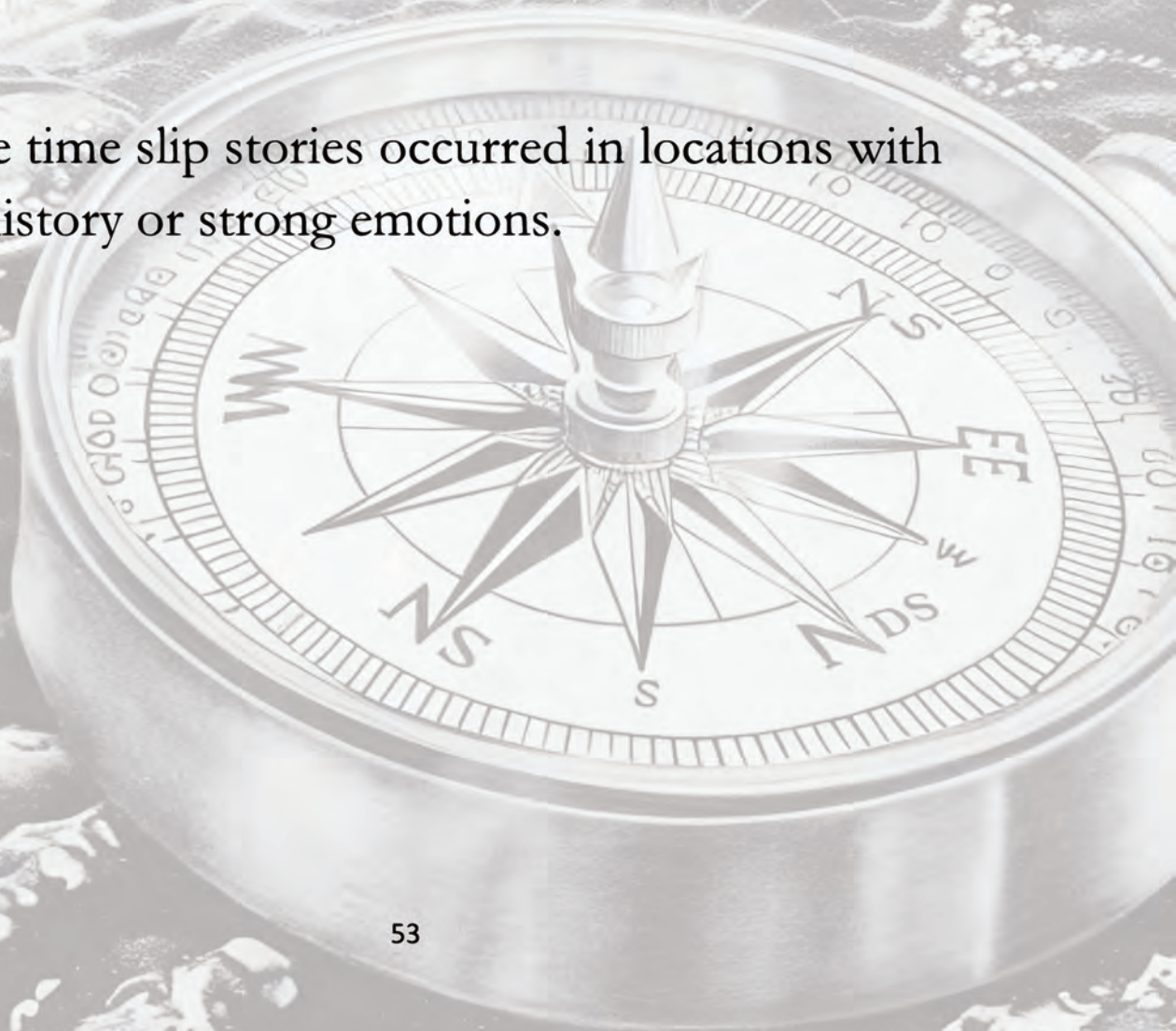
