Evening: Golden Hours & Firelit Dreams



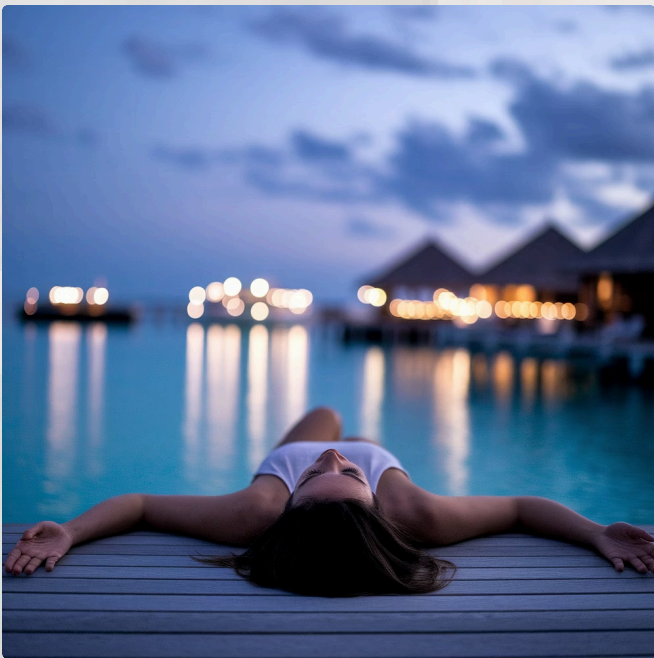
4:00 PM — Sunset Cruise on a Dhoni
