Budapest, Hungary – Thermal baths, Danube, competitive cost of living.

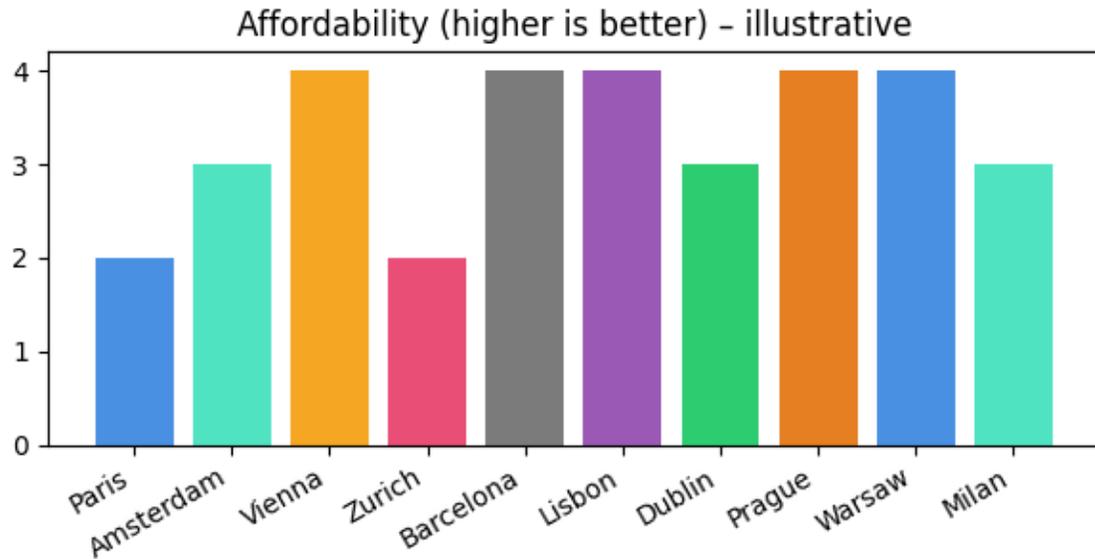
Warsaw, Poland – Rapidly growing finance/IT, modern skyline.
