- **Improved skills in preservation and development of manuscripts and documentation.** Participants developed skills in preservation and development of manuscripts and documentation. They learned about the different techniques and tools that can be used to preserve and develop these materials. They also learned about the different challenges that are faced in preserving and developing these materials.
- **Increased confidence in the ability to preserve and develop the cultural heritage of Maharashtra.** Participants gained confidence in their ability to preserve and develop the cultural heritage of Maharashtra. They learned about the different resources that are available to them and they were able to network with other people who are interested in preserving and developing the cultural heritage of the region.
