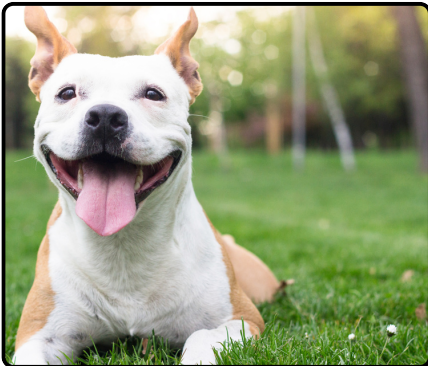
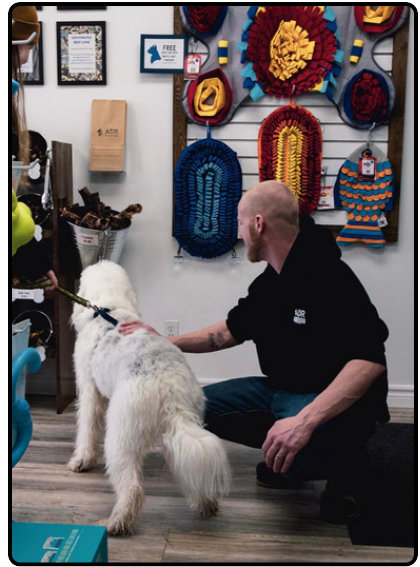

- **Puzzles:** Designed to challenge dogs mentally while they work to access their food or treats.

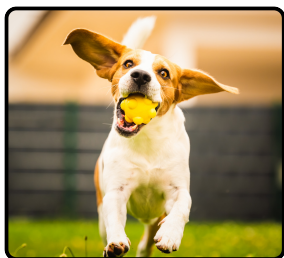
