Thank you to all of our residents for your recycling efforts. There are many benefits to recycling.

Recycle centers now charge a fee to dispose of recycling and fine municipalities that bring in items that are not on the approved list. The cost to the township to dispose of recycling now exceeds \$10,000 annually. In 2020, Elsinboro Township was charged extra fees for residents placing plastic bags in their recycling containers.

Please help us reduce costs, related to recycling. Knowing what not to recycle can be just as important as knowing what to recycle.

Recycling the wrong items can cause problems at recycling centers as they contaminate the recyclables and jam separating machinery.

Grant Funding Received

Elsinboro Township has received grant funding for the resurfacing of the second half of Locust Avenue and to begin Country Club Road. We have had recent success in receiving grant funding to complete road projects. Over the last few years we have completed South Locust Ave part 1 and part 2, Delaware Avenue, and Locust Ave, part 1. The engineering is scheduled to be completed in early 2021, and then we can begin the construction phase of the project.
