New Police Department Contact Information

On April 1, 2011, Lower Alloways Creek Police Department dispatch services were transitioned to Salem County Emergency Services in Mannington Township.

The historical Police telephone number (935-7300) will not ring at the Police Station but will reach a county dispatcher who will have direct radio contact with our Officers.

The Police Station will maintain a business line (935-7301). The plan is for this line to be answered by a Police Clerk 8AM to 4PM Monday through Friday. During non business hours, this line will provide a recording with prompts enabling the caller to leave messages for all Department employees.

This line may also be answered "by chance" during non business hours if an on duty Officer happens to be at the station and is not performing a critical

function such as processing a prisoner.

An emergency telephone box has been mounted outside the front entrance of the Police Department. Anyone can simply pick up the receiver 24/7 and be connected to a dispatcher. No dialing required.

Remember, for emergencies dial 911.

Bicycle Safety

Always wear a helmet on every ride.

Buy a bike helmet that fits right. Check it regularly to

make sure it's safe.

Make sure drivers will be able to see you.

Learn and follow the rules of the road.

Ride right: Bikes travel with traffic, not against it so ride on the right side of the road.

Stop and look both ways before crossing a street. Look

back before turning left. If traffic is coming, be patient and let it go first.

Although these may seem like common sense, it is important to share these tips with your family to keep our community safe.



Mayor's Corner

It has now been four months since I have taken over the responsibility of Mayor. Previous Mayor Jack Elk left big shoes to be filled. So far, although there have been some challenges, we have also had many successes in the first quarter of the year.

Here is just a sample of things that are going on in Elsinboro:

We applied for and received permission to reduce the posted speed limits on two residential roads within the township. Residents in the Sinnickson Landing Road and Tilbury Road areas were concerned for safety. The speed limit was reduced to 35 mph, and new signs have been posted.

Riverview Drive and the final part of Mason Point Road are slated for resurfacing in the coming months. These projects are possible through grants received through the Highway Trust Fund.

Elsinboro Township has joined the Joint Insurance Fund, which has initiated monthly safety meetings for all township employees.

We have received a grant for upgrades to the lighting and heating system at the municipal building. The building is 22 years old and the much needed upgrades will make the heating and lighting of the building more efficient. Without the grant funding we would not be

able to make the necessary upgrades.

I would like to also thank the Elsinboro Emergency Management and coordinators George Parris and Rob Klein, as well as the Elsinboro Fire Company and Chief Shawn Love for the efforts during the recent storms and flood conditions. Everyone worked together to keep the residents of Elsinboro safe. While there may have been some damage to personal property, there were no injuries sustained during the storm and crews worked to minimize the damage.

I hope to see everyone at the First Annual Community day! Stay Safe!
