Elsinboro Fire Company Received Federal Grant Funding

Congratulations to the Elsinboro Fire Company, who recently received grant funding through the federal Assistance to Firefighters Grant program. The \$150,000 grant requires a 5% cost share of the company. Grant funds will be used to provide new turnout gear and self-contained breathing apparatus. Great job to the leadership of the company in their pursuit of grant funding.

South Locust Avenue

Elsinboro Township received grant funding to begin resurfacing of South Locust Avenue. The grant was enough to complete approximately half of the roadway this year, which will begin on the southern end. The township has already submitted a grant application and hope to receive funding for the second half in the future. In October the bid was awarded and the township hopes to complete in the next several weeks, weather permitting. As part of the contract, the contractor will provide information for those residents impacted prior to beginning work. If you have questions please contact the municipal clerk.

- There are toxins in all computers and some televisions that are hazardous if not recycled and managed properly. These include Lead, Mercury, Cadmium, Nickel, Zinc and Brominated Flame Retardants

How to Recycle eWaste?

- Deliver your electronics to the Salem County Solid Waste Division's Convenience Center. Covered electronics include computers, monitors, portable/laptop computers and all televisions. These electronics can be delivered on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 8am to 3pm.
