Mr. Goodmark is an education civil rights attorney in Atlanta, Georgia. In his practice, Mr. Goodmark represents students, teachers and families whose civil rights have been violated in the education setting. Mr. Goodmark was previously the director of the TeamChild Atlanta Project at ALAS. TeamChild Atlanta provided legal services to low-income families with outstanding educational issues, children involved with the juvenile justice system or children whose unmet needs have not been addressed. Mr. Goodmark provides technical assistance, advocacy, and full legal representation to families whose disabled children are not having their developmental, educational or mental health needs met. Mr. Goodmark has represented hundreds of students in the metropolitan Atlanta area secure appropriate educational services and currently works with impact litigation team addressing harmful or unjust practices in education.

Prior to entering legal services, Mr. Goodmark spent five years in private practice at law firms specializing in education law, with an emphasis on special education litigation. Mr. Goodmark has represented teachers, students and families of children with disabilities. Mr. Goodmark is a graduate of Leadership Atlanta Class of 2014 and recognized by the Daily Report as an Attorney on the Rise in 2013. Mr. Goodmark currently sits on the Board of the Council of Parent Attorneys & Advocates and the Board of Atlanta Legal Aid Society. Mr. Goodmark is an honors graduate of the University of Florida College of Law where he participated in the initial TeamChild Clinic in Gainesville, Florida.
