I am a medical doctor with a background in adult general and emergency medicine, currently practising as a General Practitioner. In parallel with my GP work, I have extensive experience in emergency medicine across metropolitan Sydney since 2008, including formal training in disaster management at both local and major incident ("MAJAX") levels.

During my GP specialty training, I served as a Registrar Liaison Officer for GP Synergy and later the RACGP, representing the Nepean, Western & Northern Sydney region for 2.5 years. This role positioned me as a key stakeholder in shaping policies for the delivery and management of GP training, both within NSW and nationally—particularly during the transition from Regional Training Organisations (RTOs) to direct oversight by the RACGP.

Following the completion of my GP Fellowship, I was appointed a Medical Educator with the RACGP, where I mentored 24 GP registrars and delivered the College's formal specialty training program.

I am a strong advocate for lifelong learning in medicine. I believe that high-quality policy development, clear clinical guidelines, and supportive mentorship are essential to nurturing resilient, competent healthcare professionals capable of meeting the evolving needs of our communities.
