


Psychopath Bingo

Psychopath Bingo – Behaviors

Present as smooth, engaging, and charismatic	Charm first — then exploit	Treating relationships as transactional	No emotional investment in those affected	Frequent, effortless lying	Repeating lies so often they start believing them	Repeating the same harmful behavior	Insisting on control	Exploitation of others	Ignoring long term harm
Create powerful first impressions	Exploiting insecurities, fears, or guilt	Avoiding accountability by shifting blame	Lack of empathy for pain or consequences	Exaggeration or fabrication even when unnecessary	Blaming the victim	Dismissing concerns	Using charm or guilt to override resistance	Covert hostility or sabotage	Failure to protect those affected
Gain trust before earning it	Using charm, flattery, and gaslighting to influence decisions	alternates between kindness and reassurance, criticism and fear	No guilt after causing damage	No remorse when exposed	Minimizing the damage	Invalidating feelings	Chronic rule-breaking	Impulsive decision-making	Denial and Blame shift
Use compliments and flattery to lower defences	Withholding or distorting information	Ruthlessness when profit is involved	Using people purely as means to an end	Defensiveness or hostility when questioned	Emotional detachment	Breaking promises	Deceit and dishonesty	Risk-taking without safeguards	Excuses and justification instead of an apology
