Plan to Travel and Eat Like a Local

1. Map Out a Day-by-Day Plan

Don't wing it. When you arrive with zero plan, you end up wasting half your morning figuring out what to do.

Before you leave, write down a simple plan for Day 1, Day 2, and Day 3. You don't need a strict schedule, just a clear list of what you want to see and eat each day. Grouping your activities by day keeps things relaxed and organized.

2. Pick Three Local Dishes You *Must* Try

Food is the best part of traveling, but tourist trap restaurants are everywhere.

Instead of searching for famous restaurants, search for the food itself. Pick three specific local dishes you want to try. Once you know exactly what food you are looking for, it is much easier to find the authentic spots that locals actually love.

3. Find the Three Apps the Locals Use

The apps you use at home might not work well – or work at all – where you are going.

Before you fly, go online and find out which three apps the locals prefer for these three things:

- **Maps:** For accurate walking directions and public transport updates.
- **AI:** For quick local recommendations and translations.
- **Search Engines:** For finding actual reviews and correct opening hours.

4. Find the Busy Areas Before You Book Your Hotel

If you haven't booked your accommodation yet, this step will save your trip.

Open up the local search engine and find where the main commercial areas or night markets are. You want your hotel to be near the action so you can easily walk out for food and shopping in the evening, rather than being stuck out in the middle of nowhere.

5. Use AI to Keep Everything Within 5 Kilometres

Traffic in major cities can easily ruin your day. If you aren't careful, you will spend half your holiday in the back of a taxi.

Take your daily plan from Step 1 and your food list from Step 2, and type them into the local AI or search engine. Ask it to group your choices so that everything sits **within a 5km radius**. Keeping things close together keeps you out of traffic jams.

6. Base Yourself Near Public Transport

Relying entirely on taxis or ride-shares is a trap, especially during rush hour or when it starts pouring rain.

Check if the city has a good metro system or tourist-friendly buses. When you choose your hotel, make sure it is within short walking distance of a metro station or bus stop. It will save you time, money, and a lot of frustration. Once you pick your ideal stations, search for nearby hotels right on the map.
