WHO ARE WE?

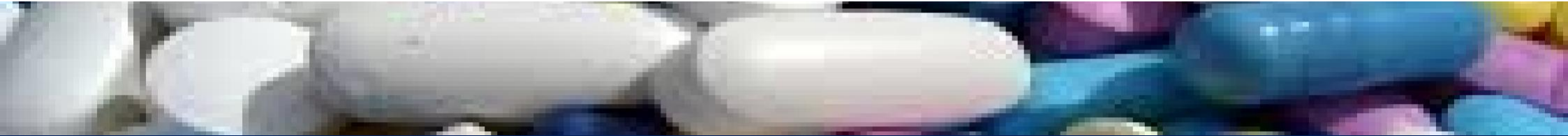
Al Ummah Medical Care Foundation tries to bring back our traditional model of Community health care in Nigeria. Diseases unfold differently in various communities according to social conditions. Our goal is to counteract the effects of poverty such as stress, anger and anxiety on general well being.

Al Ummah Medical Care Foundation made a beginning with As-Sabil Dispensary Clinic in 2010 under the aegis of Sabil International Charity Foundation. We metamorphosed into Al Ummah Medical Foundation in 2014 and have since been providing health care services to Kabalan Dokin Community and its environs in Kaduna State.

For at least 14years now, we have been providing medical services at subsidized rate, first aid treatment, women and children primary health care, antenatal care and family planning. We are committed to the shared purpose of ensuring that communities live under conditions that promote healthy living through our CLEAN HOUSE COMPETITION/ GASAR TSAPTA, encouraging families to participate in immunization for children, general advice on healthy living and personal hygiene. We as well build community health capacity by providing scholarship program for Diploma in Community Health Care at Islamic Foundation College Tudun wada Kaduna.

Our Objectives and Strategies

Objectives

❑ By the year 2025, establish three more well equipped and functional health facilities in communities with poor health access.

❑ By the year 2025, increase by 50% the percentage of children, two years of age, that are appropriately immunized (childhood immunization).

Objectives

❑ By the year 2025, decrease by 30% the percentage of newborns with low birth weight (infant mortality) in our community

❑ By the year 2025, increase by 40% the percentage of local residents especially the women and children who have a specific source of ongoing health care (overall access to health care).

Strategies

- ✓ Enhance community participation in primary health care and ownership
- ✓ Providing employment opportunities for the locals through our health facility
- ✓ Encouraging healthy living and environmental sanitation through medical outreach and competitions.
- ✓ Educate women and children on health and wellbeing.
- ✓ Increase self confidence by bringing people together.



Environmental Context



According to UNICEF, Nigeria's 40 million women of childbearing age suffer a disproportionately high level of health issues surrounding birth. Infant mortality currently stands at 69 per 1,000 live births while more than half of the under-five deaths -64 per cent result from malaria, pneumonia or diarrhea. As troubling as these statistics are, a closer look at our communities would reveal a grimmer picture. This is worsened by the fact that our communities today are faced with the problems of depressed local economy creating problems of rising level of poverty and ability to access basic health services.

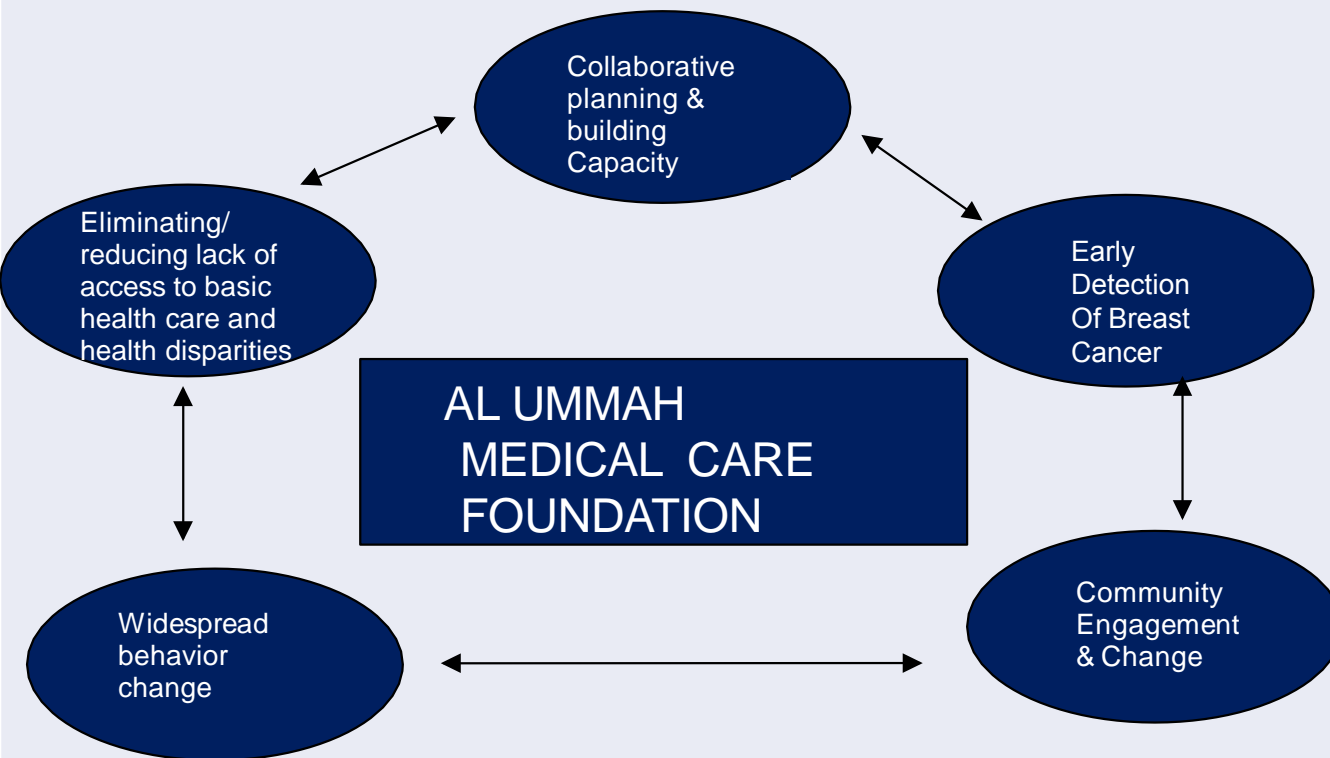
The most common ailments in African children such as malaria, chest infection, diarrhea are often treated with off counter medications. Pregnant women need antenatal care to deliver safely, but all this is beyond the reach of so many in our society simply because they cannot afford to go to hospital or buy the medication in their local chemist. Another common danger is the pervasive abuse of medication whereby people just walk into pharmacies and ask for any type of medication without seeing a doctor or a health worker.

Al Ummah Medical Care Foundation was borne out of the quest to change the narrative having realized that we cannot keep kicking the can down the road. The foundation therefore takes up the cause to bring back the communal model of health care we used to have in our society hence the name Al-Ummah (Community) whereby we all work together and collaborate for our collective well being. The foundation made a wide stride in 2014 by establishing primary health care facility at Kabalan Doki.

Kabalan Doki is a relatively poor semi-urban area within Kaduna North Local Government Area. The community is situated between Gamji Park and Kaduna State Police College. It is small but highly populated with the landscape speckled with cramped mostly "room and parlour" type of homes. The small roads in the community lack drainage system and regular sanitation. This kind of environment bears a high risk of malaria outbreak, diarrhea, skin infections and the likes, especially among young children. But remarkably the people of Kabalan Doki are full of life and potentials which can only be harnessed with proper health care. That's what we are currently doing and planning to replicate in other communities to improve access to health services for everyone.



Our Framework of Action



Collaborative planning through community participation in primary health care and ownership and building capacity by providing scholarship in community health for young people.

Our health practitioner are trained in teaching self examination, informations for early detection of breast cancer. Advocacy for HPV vaccination in our communities.

Community engagement and change action such as “CLEAN HOUSE COMPETITION/ GASAR TSAPTA” a monthly competition that encourages the people to clean their immediate environment introduced in 2013.

Widespread behavior change in healthy living

Eliminating lack of access to basic health care especially for women and children through our antenatal and women and children health care.

COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION IN PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

Most people in urban areas come from rural areas in search of better opportunities. Traditionally in Nigeria, village life fosters a better sense of community where it is said that it takes a community to raise a child. We have lost this sense of belonging and togetherness in urban areas where every man or woman is on their own. Al Ummah Medical Care Foundation embodies a reinvigoration of our traditional community values and it has become part of the community it serves. We provide employment for the community by sourcing our staff from the locals of the area, which helps create trust and job satisfaction. In the past seven years that we have provided health care services to the people of Kaban Doki it has become apparent the community appreciates and values our presence so much so that our members of staff and other members of the community in many occasions have made significant contributions towards the sustainability of our clinic.

Medication at Subsidized Rate

Al Ummah Clinic provides low cost brand prescription medications for minor illnesses after consultation with our health workers. The average households in Kabala living from hand to mouth can easily fall into poverty when there is a minor ailment in the family. With this medication at subsidized rate, Al Ummah has been serving as beacon of hope for the less privileged families in this area and we have covered more than 3,000 households in the past 14 years.



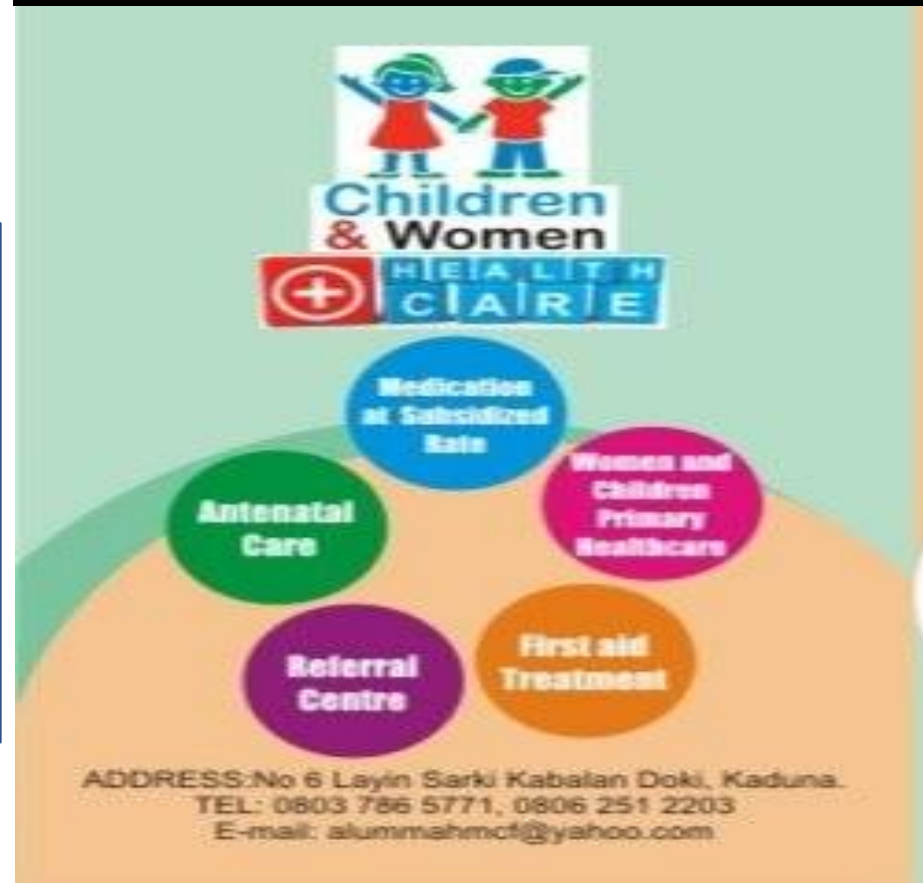
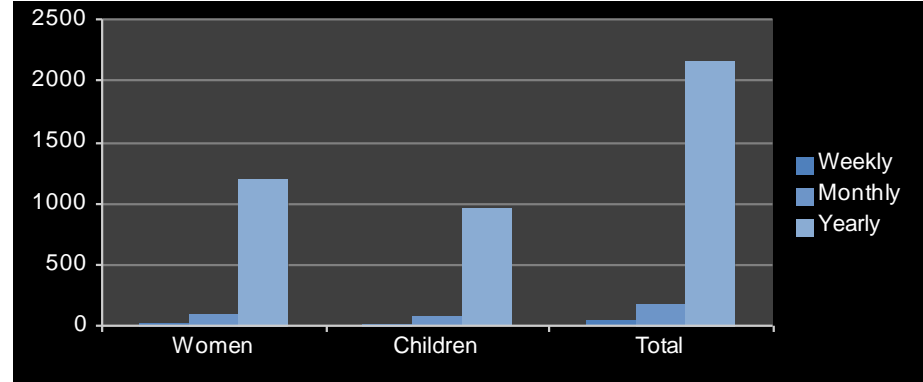

We attend to about 30 women on average a week for ailments ranging from infections, diarrhoea, malaria typhoid and pre existing diseases such as diabetes and hypertension. Sometimes, we are presented with social problems that we refer to appropriate authority.

CHILDREN often present minor ailments like teething fever, diarrhoea, malaria infections and minor accidents. Our community health workers also give information on vaccinations and signs of infectious diseases.

Family Planning & Antenatal Care up to 36 Weeks

Al Ummah Clinic provides safety net for women in the community who cannot afford family planning and safe antenatal care. Language communication for cultural and religious norms is our hallmark in family plan with emphasis on spacing for a healthy family.

Our CHW can identify pregnant women in the community and improve uptake of ANC. This gives opportunity to prevent or diagnose conditions that can lead to complicated pregnancies.

During our weekly Antenatal Care, our midwife examines and advises on the wellbeing of both mother and child.

We also make referral for HIV testing to prevent transmission from mother to child.

Al-Ummah Medical Care Annual Health Talk: Kaduna Health Commissioner stresses need to keep to COVID-19 protocols

Kaduna State Commissioner For Health, Dr. Amina Baloni has stressed the need to keep to the COVID-19 health protocols. She spoke at the Al-Ummah Medical Care Annual Health Talk which drew participants from the Kabala Doki community in Kaduna State and beyond.

Dr. Baloni emphasized that Covid-19 is deadly because some people may not show any symptom and it mostly affects people with underlying sicknesses such as hypertensive and diabetic patients. While addressing common misconceptions about the virus the commissioner said, “Most people are saying Coronavirus is not a poor man’s disease, it’s for the rich. About 10,000 people have been infected in Kaduna State and almost 72 people dead. Someone might say the death of 70 people from 9 million is nothing, not until your family is affected before you know that losing a single life is painful.”

The Commissioner also stressed that what the health authorities have advised does not go against the religion. According to her, following the Qur’an and Sunnah, we are to stay where we are when there is disease outbreak. She therefore enjoined everyone to always put on the face mask, avoid social gatherings and stay indoors when having cold or fever.

“Anybody that sees what is happening in India will know it is a very dangerous and disheartening situation. No more space in the hospitals, no drugs and no burial grounds. What is more disturbing than to see a dead body without a place to bury it?! So, I’m pleading we should be cautious and pray to the Almighty,” she said.

In his vote of thanks, the head of the Kabala Doki community appreciated the commissioner for her kind words and for taking out time from her tight schedule to grace the occasion. He intimated the Commissioner on the impacts Al- Ummah Medical Care Clinic has had on the community providing medication at subsidized rate, free antenatal care, girl child education scholarship and promoting environmental sanitation.

He therefore appealed to her to give all necessary supports to the foundation in upgrading its clinic and improving the quality of its services.

Al Ummah Organic Gardening Project

Alummah Organic Garden Training

Having realized the health dangers associated with genetically modified seeds and animals as well as indiscriminate use of chemical fertilizers, Alummah Medical Care Foundation introduced organic garden training project in December 2021. The project is aimed at teaching youths a safe way of producing food and sustainable land use.

This project does not only empower young people in the community but also correct the widely held notion that organic farming cannot feed the large population we have in Nigeria.

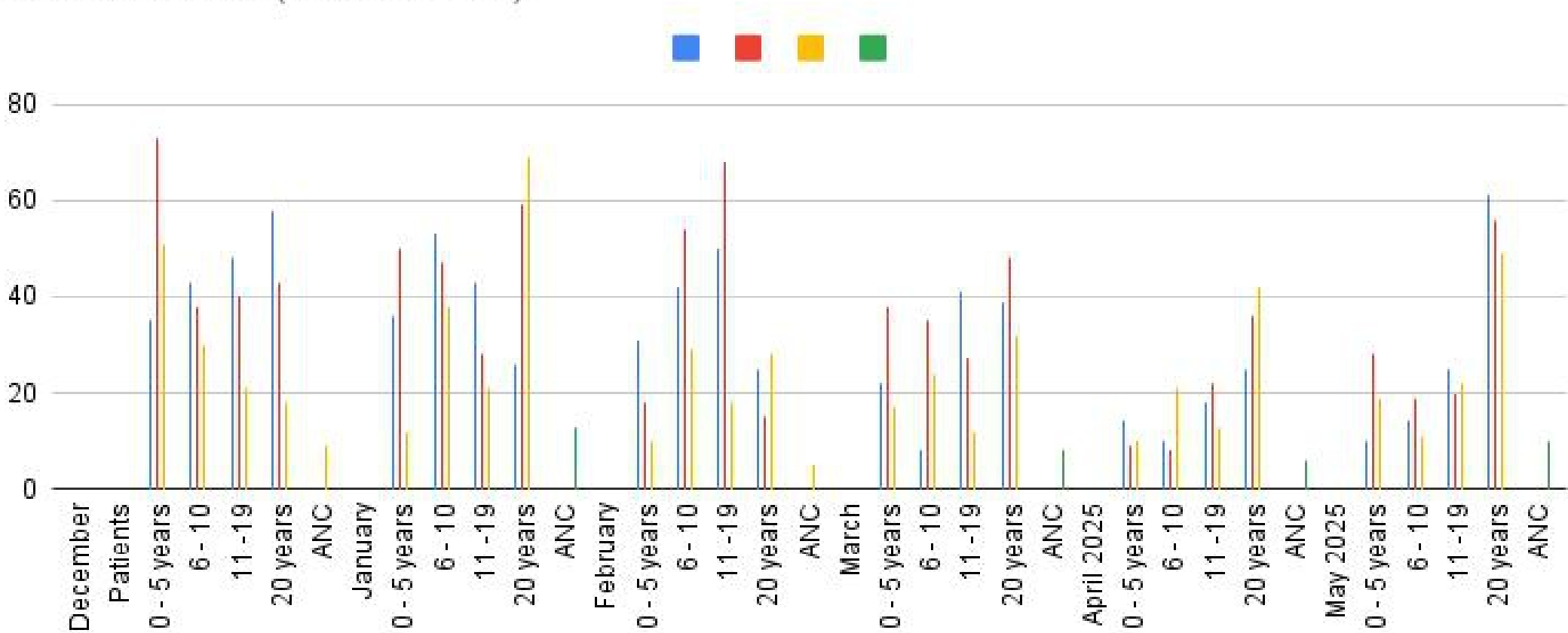
