The 7 Prompts

Prompt 1 of 7 · Business Idea Clarity

THE PROMPT

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Act as a practical small business advisor. Help me clearly explain my business idea in simple language. Tell me what problem it solves and
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whether the idea is focused or too broad. Here is my idea: [insert your idea].

Prompt 2 of 7 · Real Problem Finder

Why this matters: A business only works if it solves a problem people actually feel. This prompt helps you move from "I think this is a good idea" to "here's the real pain my customers experience every day."

THE PROMPT

Act as a realistic market researcher. Based on this business idea: [describe your idea], explain the real-world problem it solves, who experiences this problem most, and how urgent or painful it is for them.

Sample AI Output:

"The core problem is decision fatigue around dinner. Busy parents report spending 20–30 minutes each evening just deciding what to cook — before they've even started. For dual-income households, this is a daily stressor. The urgency is high: it happens every single weeknight, not occasionally."

Prompt 3 of 7 · Ideal Customer Profile

Why this matters: Trying to sell to "everyone" is one of the most common early mistakes. This prompt helps you picture one real person who would love your product — so your marketing, pricing, and messaging can speak directly to them.

THE PROMPT

Act as a customer research expert. Create a realistic profile of the type of person most likely to buy from this business: [describe your business idea]. Include their age, lifestyle, biggest frustrations, and what would make them trust a new brand.

Sample AI Output:

"Meet Sarah, 38, a marketing manager and mother of two. She works full-time, values healthy eating, but has almost no spare time on weeknights. She's tried meal kit services before but found them complicated. She'd trust a local provider if she saw real customer reviews and a simple, flexible subscription."

Prompt 4 of 7 · Demand Check

Why this matters: Most businesses fail because founders assumed people would pay — without checking. This prompt pressure-tests your idea before you spend a single dollar.

THE PROMPT

Act as a cautious business analyst. Based on this business idea: [describe your idea], tell me whether people are likely to pay for this solution, and what risks suggest demand may be weaker than I expect.

🗨️ Sample AI Output:

"Demand looks real — people already pay for convenience in food (delivery apps, meal kits). The risk: price sensitivity. Parents may want this but balk at cost if it exceeds \$15–20 per meal. Test with a small group of 5–10 local customers before investing in packaging or branding."

Prompt 5 of 7 · Revenue Ideas

Why this matters: There's often more than one way to make money from a single idea. This prompt helps you see your options clearly — and prioritize the ones you can realistically start with.

THE PROMPT

Act as a small business strategist. Give me three realistic ways this business idea could generate revenue in its first year, and rank them from easiest to hardest to start: [describe your business idea].

🗨️ Sample AI Output:

"1 (Easiest): Weekly subscription meal prep boxes delivered locally — recurring revenue, predictable demand. 2: One-time event catering for school fundraisers or office lunches. 3 (Harder): A digital recipe + meal planning guide sold online — lower overhead but requires building an audience first."

Prompt 6 of 7 · Simple Marketing Plan

Why this matters: You don't need a big marketing budget to find your first customers. This prompt focuses on what actually works for brand-new businesses — low-cost, high-trust strategies.

THE PROMPT

Act as a practical marketing coach. Suggest simple, low-cost ways a new business like this could attract its first customers without spending much money: [describe your business idea].

🗨️ Sample AI Output:

"Start in local Facebook parent groups — introduce yourself and offer a free trial to 3 families in exchange for honest feedback. Post before-and-after photos of meals on Instagram. Prompt 7 of 7 · First Customer Plan

Why this matters: Reading about business is easy. Actually getting someone to pay you is the real milestone. This final prompt gives you a concrete, realistic action plan to land your very first customers.

THE PROMPT

Act as a startup mentor. Give me a simple step-by-step plan for how I could realistically get my first five paying customers for this business: [describe your business idea].

💬 Sample AI Output:

"Step 1: Write down 10 people you personally know who fit your target customer. Step 2: Message 5 of them this week — not a sales pitch, just a genuine ask: 'I'm testing a new idea and would love your honest opinion. Can I send you a free sample?'
