# CANADA – Still a Dream Destination, But Policies Are Rapidly Changing



## What Has Changed for Students

### New Fee Structure

Starting 1st September 2025, international students applying for study visas in Canada will need to show a financial capacity of CAD 22,895. This includes tuition fees, living expenses, and travel costs.

### Visa approval rate drops

According to a recent report:

- Visa approval rate drops - just 43%
- Immigration officers are now checking financial evidence, study plans and documents very strictly.



### Business Opportunity

- The H-1B visa fee has been increased to \$100,000 CAD.
- Canada is focusing on attracting high-tech professionals and global talent relocating from the U.S.

### Economic Impact

- The IRCC has planned to welcome 958,850 new immigrants by 31 October 2025.
- About 56–57% of these are expected to be economic immigrants.
- Categories include Skilled Workers, Students, and Trade Professionals.



### Study Visa & SOP Tips

- Express Entry and CRS scores are changing constantly.
- PNP draws are becoming more competitive.
- To strengthen your profile, prepare strong SOPs, LOEs, and financial documentation.
- Apply early to stay ahead of policy shifts.

## Immigration & PR Updates

### Express Entry

- 19 September 2025: 2,500 ITAs (Invitations to Apply) were issued.
- The CRS score cut-off stood at 462.

### PNP Draws (Provincial Nominee Program)

- 15 September 2025: 228 invitations were issued.
- The CRS score range was 746.

### Trade Occupations Draw

- 18 September 2025: 1,250 ITAs were issued.
- The CRS cut-off stood at 505.

### Education, Skills and Trade Canada is clearly prioritizing specialists



### Did You Know?

By 2025, Canada is expected to host over 8 lakh international students.

Each year, about 55–58% of total student visa applications are approved. Canada continues to remain among the Top 3 study destinations globally for higher education.

# U.K - Studying and Working is Now Becoming More Challenging

Rules are changing frequently, and expenses are rising. Let's understand the latest updates in detail.

## Student Visa Updates

### Key Points for Students

The UK Home Office has made several updates:

- It is now harder to get a student visa compared to before.
- Financial requirements have increased – proof of funds must now be higher.

### Increased Expenses

- Tuition + living expenses = high costs.
- For a family of 4, the 5-year cost will be around £72,600.

### Important Advice for Students

- Research thoroughly about universities before applying.
- Keep your finances ready before filing the visa.
- Always follow immigration rules strictly.



## Skilled Worker and Immigration Updates

### New Rules for Skilled Worker Visa

- Minimum salary threshold: £41,700.
- Applicable for RQF Level 6 (bachelor's degree and above).
- Healthcare and teaching sectors have special salary scales.

### Sponsor Licence Rules

- Many universities and companies lost their sponsor licence status.
- If your sponsor licence becomes invalid, your Skilled Worker or Student Visa could be affected.

### Reform Party proposal

- Proposal to end ILR (Indefinite Leave to Remain).
- 5 year renewable visas instead.
- The path to settlement could become more difficult.

### New agreement with France

- "One in – One out" policy launched.
- Channel migrants will be sent back, and family-linked migrants will be accepted instead.

### Meaning for Skilled Workers and Sponsors

- New salary scale needs to be met.
- Employers with Sponsor License will have to strictly comply.
- It will take more time and cost to get the settlement.



Opportunities for study and work in the UK are still open, but the road is no longer easy. Only those who are prepared will succeed.

# USA - The Dream of Education and Career

However, rules and expenses are continuously changing.



## Student Visa Updates

### F-1 Visa Status Rules

- Recently, the U.S. introduced new F-1 visa regulations.
- Starting from January 2026, student visa approval will become more selective and competitive.

### SEVIS Fee and DS-160 Form

- SEVIS Fee: USD 350
- DS-160 Form Fee: Increased
- Both fees are mandatory before visa submission.

### STEM OPT Extension

- After completing a STEM program, students can now work for up to 3 years under OPT.
- The technology and innovation sectors remain highly supportive for international students.

Opportunities for study and work in the USA are still open, but now it has become more expensive and competitive. Only the right plan will bring success.



### What Students Should Do

- Stay updated with institutional requirements and visa rules.
- Prepare strong documentation and SOPs.
- Plan early for OPT/STEM extensions to avoid last-minute issues.

In 2025, the visa approval rate for student visas is expected to increase, making it a hopeful sign for applicants.

## Work & Immigration Updates

### H-1B Visa Fee & New Rules

- H-1B visa fee increased up to USD 1,000,000 (for certain categories).
- This change impacts high-demand occupations like IT, healthcare, and engineering.

### Application Processing Time

- Due to heavy demand, processing times are now longer.
- The U.S. remains the top destination for skilled professionals worldwide.

### Green Card Opportunities

- Indian professionals continue to dominate U.S. immigration.
- Over 1-1.5 million applicants apply each year for H-1B and employment-based green cards.

### Visa Renewal Program

- Those with H-1B or L1 visas can now renew within the U.S. itself—no need to return home for stamping.



### Key Points for Workers

- New fee structure introduces higher costs.
- Green card waiting period remains long and competitive.
- Visa renewals depend on category and compliance documentation.

# France - No Longer Just for Arts and Culture

Now a Hub for Study and Career Opportunities

## Student Visa Updates

### Long-term student visa

- Valid for one year.
- Renewal is mandatory every year to continue the course.

### Campus France interview mandatory

- A Campus France interview is required before a visa in many countries, including India.
- A study plan, proof of finances, and a course specification will have to be submitted.

### Part-Time Work:

Students can work up to 964 hours per year (~20 hours per week).

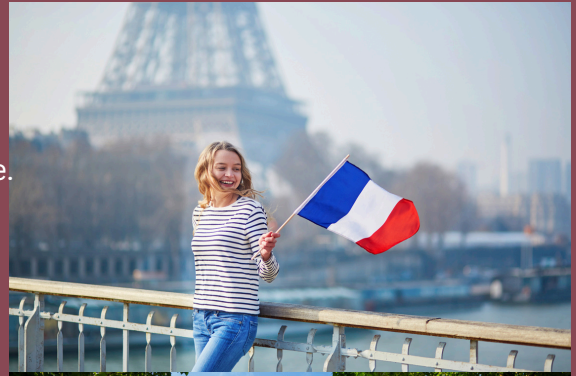
### Post-Study Work Options:

- After completing a master's degree, students can stay up to 2 years.
- This is known as the Post-Study Work Visa (APS Visa).

### What should students do?

- Have your documents pre-verified by Campus France.
- Show proof of funds of at least €7,200+ per year.
- Think in advance about stay-back options after your studies.

The number of international students in France is growing rapidly, especially in business, engineering, and the arts.



## Work & Immigration Updates



Professionals working in France can move across EU countries more easily under this program.

**There are many opportunities for study and career in France, but don't skimp on preparation. Language + Documents + Money = Successful France Trip.**

### Talent Passport Program

- A 4-year work visa for highly skilled professionals.
- Designed for Researchers, Tech, Arts, and Business sectors.

### French Language Requirement

- Minimum B1 level French proficiency required for most jobs.
- French language learning is increasingly becoming mandatory for employability.

### Stricter checks

- Compliance is stricter for Sponsor Employers.
- Special attention to contracts, salaries and accommodation arrangements.

### EU Mobility Benefit

### Meaning for workers

- Language knowledge is the biggest key to a career in France.
- Talent Passport is the path to long-term settlement.
- All documents must be kept 100% correct.

# Germany – Beyond Engineering and Automobiles, Now a Top Study and Career Hub

## Student Visa Updates

### Increased Financial Requirement

Students must now show €11,208 per year (~€934 per month) in their blocked account.

### Visa Appointment Delays

- Appointments for visa interviews are now longer and slower in most regions.
- Students are advised to apply early and secure slots in advance.

### Work Permission for Students

Students are allowed to work 120 full days or 240 half days per year.

### Post-Study Options

After graduation, students can stay up to 18 months with a Job Seeker Visa to find employment.



### What Students Should Do

Open a blocked account early and deposit the required funds.

Prepare documents properly for visa interviews.

Focus on learning German language basics during studies.

## Work & Immigration Updates

### Skilled Immigration Act 2025

- The new act simplifies work visa processes for EU and non-EU professionals.
- Professionals with degrees, diplomas, and relevant experience can now apply more easily.

### Blue Card Germany

- Minimum annual salary: ~€45,300.
- Special demand in IT and technical shortage sectors.
- EU Blue Card holders can apply for permanent residency (PR) after 33 months, or 21 months if fluent in German.

### Language Requirement

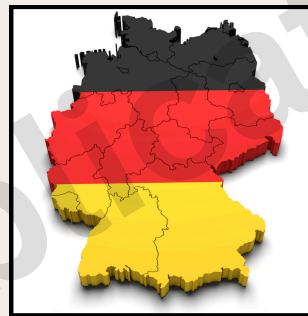
Most jobs now require B1/B2 level German language proficiency.

### Employer Compliance

Employers must meet new compliance standards – valid contracts, salaries, and work conditions are mandatory.

### Key Points for Workers

- German Language is essential for long-term success.
- Blue Card offers a secure path to residency.
- Skilled Immigration Act opens new doors for non-EU professionals.



**Opportunities for both study and work in Germany are increasing, but preparation should not be lacking. German language + money + documents = the road to success.**

# Spain – Now One of Europe’s Most Popular Education Destinations

Affordable living, easy language learning, and post-study work options make Spain a favorite among international students.

## Student Visa Updates

### Student Visa (Type D)

- Issued for study programs of 6 months or longer.
- Valid for the entire course duration.

### Financial Requirements

- Proof of funds between €600–€700 per month is required.
- Blocked account or sponsor documents are accepted.

### Part-Time Work

- Students can work up to 20 hours per week while studying.
- After graduation, post-study work visas are available.

### Post-Study Work Options

After completing a Master’s, students can stay up to 12 months to search for a job.



### What Students Should Do

- Prepare all financial and academic documents properly.
- Apply through recognized universities.
- Focus on learning Spanish language before and during studies.

**Knowing Spanish significantly improves your job opportunities after graduation.**



## Work & Immigration Updates

### Skilled Worker & Work Permit

- Work permits can be applied for through employers.
- Employers must confirm that no local (Spanish/EU) candidates are available for the role (Labour Market Test).

### EU Blue Card Spain

- Available for highly qualified professionals.
- Minimum salary: ~€33,900 (for shortage occupations).

### Permanent Residency

After 5 years of continuous residence, one can apply for permanent residency.

### Citizenship

### Key Points for Workers

- Job offer is required for entry under the work permit.
- Blue Card holders can apply for PR later.
- Those planning long-term stay must follow Spanish language and visa rules carefully.
- Normally available after 10 years of residence.
- Citizens of Latin American countries can apply in 2 years.



# Malta – A Small Country with Big Opportunities!

Malta is becoming one of the most popular European destinations for both study and employment.

## Student Visa Updates

### Student Visa (National D Visa)

- Issued for courses longer than 90 days.
- Visa validity depends on the course duration and institution confirmation.

### Part-Time Work

- Students can work up to 20 hours per week.
- After course completion, students may be eligible for a Stay-Back Option to search for jobs.

### What Students Should Do

- Prepare financial and academic documents in advance.
- Apply early and ensure all documents are properly verified.
- Explore post-study work visa opportunities.

### Financial Requirements

- Students must show at least €500 per month in available funds.
- Proof of accommodation and medical insurance is mandatory.

### Application Timeline

Visa applications must be submitted at least 3 months before the course start date.



## Work & Immigration Updates

### Single Permit

- Allows both residence and work in Malta.
- Valid for 1 year, renewable annually.

### Labour Market Test

- Employers must confirm that no local (EU) candidates are available for the job.
- Only then can a non-EU foreign worker be hired.

### Residency & PR

- After 5 years of continuous residence, individuals can apply for Permanent Residency.
- PR applicants must meet the required tax and stay conditions.

### Citizenship

Citizenship is available after 10 years of residence.

### Key Points for Workers

- A job offer is mandatory before entering Malta.
- The Single Permit covers both residence and work authorization.
- For PR or Citizenship, maintaining tax records and compliance is essential.



# Japan – A Nation of Technology, Culture, and Education

Japan is increasingly becoming a preferred destination for international students and professionals.



## Student Visa Updates

### Certificate of Eligibility (CoE)

- The CoE is issued through the university or institution.
- Without CoE, visa approval is not possible.

### Visa Duration

Generally issued for 1 year or 2 years, depending on the course duration.

### Financial Requirements

- Students must show at least JPY 1,000,000 (~₹5.5 lakh) in available funds.
- Proof of financial capacity is mandatory.

### Part-Time Work

- Students can work up to 28 hours per week.
- During vacation periods, the hours may be extended.

### Stay back option

After completing studies, students can apply for a Designated Activities Visa, allowing them to stay in Japan for up to 1 year to search for jobs.

## What Students Should Do

- Prepare all necessary documents for CoE and university admission.
- Ensure financial and bank statements are ready.
- Focus on learning the Japanese language during studies.

**Learning Japanese greatly increases chances for internships and job opportunities.**

## Skilled Worker Visa (SSW)

- Applicable in sectors like caregiving, construction, hospitality, and manufacturing.
- Valid for up to 5 years, allowing full-time work.

## Work Visa Requirements

- Sponsorship from an employer is mandatory.
- Minimum language proficiency (JLPT N4/N5) and relevant skills certification required.

## Work & Immigration Updates

### Highly Skilled Professional Visa

- Based on a point system (education, experience, salary).
- Leads to fast-track PR in 1–3 years.

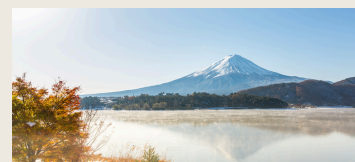
### Permanent Residency

- Generally available after 10 years of residence,
- but only 1–3 years for Highly Skilled Professionals.



## Key Points for Workers

- Without sponsorship, a work visa cannot be issued.
- Japanese language is essential for career growth.
- Highly Skilled Visa is the fastest route to PR in Japan.



# Dubai – From Tourism to Education and Career Opportunities

## Student Visa Updates

### Student Visa (1 Year)

- Issued for one academic year.
- Sponsorship can be arranged through universities or parents.

### Application Process

- Applications must be submitted at least 45 days before course commencement.
- Students already in the UAE must change visa status within the country by paying a status change fee.

### Golden Visa

High Achiever Students can apply for a 5-year Golden Visa.

### What Students Should Do

- Prepare all academic and financial documents in advance.
- Ensure to renew visa annually on time.
- For outstanding academic records, apply for the Golden Visa.

Dubai's universities are now gaining international recognition, making them a great option for a global degree.

## Work & Immigration Updates

### Work Permits & Work Bundle

- The UAE now issues 12 types of work permits.
- Under the new Work Bundle System, one can obtain:
  - → Work Permit + Emirates ID + Residency Visa together.

### Visit Visa Updates (2025)

- 30-day and 60-day visas available.
- New categories introduced: AI, Cruise, Events, Entertainment.

### Re-Entry Permit

Individuals who stay outside the UAE for over 6 months can now re-enter with a Re-Entry Permit.

### Permit Validity

Work permits and residencies are valid from 2 to 3 years (renewable).

### Key Points for Workers & Employers

- The Work Bundle system simplifies and speeds up the process.
- Visit Visa categories expanded under new rules.
- The 3-year work permit ensures longer employment stability.
