US unleashes sea drones in Middle East

Washington : "The Hormuz Strait is open and will remain open with or without Iran. We are reinstating the Iranian Blockade" said Donad Trump on Truth Social. Blockade of Iranian shipping in the Gulf by US returned ensuring the Strait of Hormuz continued to stay open, when two opponent sides exchanged more missiles and drone attacks. Iran on the contrary, had proclaimed it was closing

the Strait and cast doubt over the viability of an interim peaceful deal to halt the ongoing war in the Middle East. The US, hence, would like to be called Guardian of the Hormuz Strait, but as a matter of FAIRNESS at the rate of 20% would be reimbursed on all safe cargo shipping. The Iran mocked at the Trump's version on Strait charges, the Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi echoed in a post "Iran has always been the



Guardian of the Strait and will remain for ever, the charge of 20 % is in fact

unbeatably too much. The only way to restore regular shipping traffic

through the Strait was to end. The US military intervention in the water-

way, and has warned that the continued interference could lead to greater catastrophic events in the global oil and gas sector. US Central Command said on Tuesday it's latestest strike were aimed at degrading Iran's capacity to attack "innocent civilians" and commercial shipping in the Strait. The latest round of attacks on Iran lasted 5 hours. US forces successfully struck military targets across Iran, Bushehr,

Chah Bahar, Jask, Konar, Abu Musa, and Bandar Abbas. Iranian state Television and official news agencies reported explosion throughout the night across the country's southern coast. Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) said it had launched a wider retaliatory campaign against US allies and interest across the Gulf. The UAE said two of its oil tankers, had been hit

by Iranian cruise missiles in Omani waters in the Strait of Hormuz. The IRGC hit two offending oil super tankers, citing an IRGC statement. The IRANIAN army sld it carried out drone attack on US Military targets in Kuwait. Iranian army launched drones on Tuesday at a US Patriot missile system, fuel tanks, a watch tower, an ammunition depot and communication systems.

Iran Shuts Hormuz After Attack On 'Unauthorised' Ship

East Asia : " Strait Hormuz" was closed once again after a warning shot fired by its military struck a vessel using an unauthorised route in the critical waterway, further jeopardising the already tenuous ceasefire agreement with the United States. US Central Command said a short time later that its forces began a third round of strikes against Iran. There were explosions in Bandar Abbas and Sirik, two towns along the shores of the strait, Iran reported. "The United States is imposing a heavy cost by continuing to degrade Iran's ability to attack civilian mariners and commercial ships freely transiting the strait," the American military said. A Cyprus-flagged container ship was hit by Iran and suffered "significant engine-room damage" and a civilian crew member is missing, US Central Command said. Senior US officials had previously said in Washington



that negotiations to further cement last month's deal to end the war will be unable to progress without the strait being secure - and even said they wanted Iran to offer public statements to that effect. Instead, the Revolutionary Guards Corps said multiple vessels "disregarded our warnings and instructions to correct their course and proceed along the approved route." One of them "was struck by a warning shot and brought to a stop." Iran said that the Strait would remain closed "until further notice" and said it would consider targeting "additional enemy bases in the region" if it faced more attacks

Decrepit office building posing potential threat of collapse

DeraBassi : No less than the six decade years old structural life of the office building has passed, yet the authorities are seeming to be in slumber, perhaps awaiting for providential orders. Hardly at a few hundred metres distance ,14 office structures of the municipal council were demolished as they too were more than six decades old and daily posing safety risk to municipal staff. The compromised wilful neglect of the rickety building might cost several human life as the



municipal evacuation before 4 years heralded indication against the potential threat. Every year, with the advent of monsoon, continual rains trigger leakages from the dilapidated building which doesn't leave any safe slot for the smooth operational working. To overcome the shortage of the safe accommodation, the forest staff had to devise alternates, may now be seen sitting under a cottage shed which can be either in no way ideal and safe working place, whisper in low tone the employees of the

department. On asking about the existing plight, Mr. Jai Singh, Forest Officer says the matter already is in the cognizance of the higher authorities. Nevertheless, the issue remains in limbo, building work has not yet started. On confirming about the momentum of the predicament, DFO Amneet Singh said he would approach higher officials for taking up the ramshackle old building on top priority so that new construction of the ricketing unit may start at the earliest.

For the quality emergence conventional ayurvedic Bolana procedure is adopted by the dairy engineers. Cow pure milk is manufactured from white but-



ter/curd. The quantum of cow milk is put on mild flame specific span of time until it got melted for ghee. It is widely claimed that cow milk is scared substance, oftenuised in religious rituals besides Aurvedic treatments.

Cow ghee must be used before 9 months from date. Milk fat is inherently expensive. Its current exdairy price of Rs 460, -- 470 / is way above Rs 125 -- 130, wholesale range for refined palmolien, soyabeen or sunflower.

EDITORIAL –

Capability and credibility of India’s defence hike

"As sugar melts in milk and makes it sweeter, we Indians imbue the world with the colour of love," Prime Minister Narendra Modi said. Addressing a diaspora crowd at a community event in Melbourne in the presence of his Australian counterpart, Anthony Albanese, Modi said Indians had made the city more vibrant with their culture. And while they had stayed connected to their roots, they had also been working day and night for the development of their adopted country, he added. Modi drew cheers from the audience when he spoke about Operation Sindoor and, a day after the deal to sell Brahmos missiles to Indonesia, he said the world was witnessing the capability and credibility of India's defence platform. "You must have seen the demo during Operation Sindoor. Blasts occurred at in Australia the shelters of terrorists but their echoes were heard across the world. You must have felt proud of the blows at the terror

camp," he said. Asserting that India was setting big goals, Modi said the country was driven by the spirit of "grow more, achieve more". "From chips to ships, new manufacturing ecosystems are being created in India." The PM said a growing India benefited all of humanity as "happiness for all" drove its policies and actions. PM di and his counterpart, Anthony Albanese, expressed concern over the renewed escalation of tensions and called upon all parties to exercise restraint and ensure protection of civilians as well as uninterrupted flow of energy. Both leaders reinforced their commitment to peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific as Albanese raised with Modi concerns related to China's submarine-launched ballistic missile test this week. The 3rd India-Australia summit saw a declaration of intent by the two sides to work together for energy security, open markets and rules-based trade in the

face of geopolitical tensions. According to a joint statement, the leaders reiterated the importance of dialogue and diplomacy, and adherence to international law to achieve a peaceful and lasting solution to the conflict. In a separate joint statement on energy security, they shared concern over the prolonged impact of disruptions on energy, resources and the supply chains and prices of other important commodities. They reiterated their commitment to an open and rules-based order in the Indo-Pacific. The joint statement did not mention Eastor South China Sea but underlined the importance of adhering to international law, particularly United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, freedom of navigation and overflight. The leaders strongly opposed any "destabilising or unilateral action to change the status quo and undermine regional peace and stability".

328 more electric buses to be inducted under Central scheme from October

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Sanctioned under the PM e-Bus Sewa Scheme from October this year. The UT Administration would most probably start getting 328 electric buses in transition to environmentally friendly transportation. A total of 428 electric buses for the city had been sanctioned under the scheme by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs. Out of these, 100 buses were sanctioned to replace the 100 diesel buses following their condemnation post completion of their operational lifespan of 15 years from Depot IV of the Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU). Out of the 100



sanctioned electric buses for Depot-IV, 60 electric buses have already been inducted and are operational, while the remaining 40 buses are scheduled to be added by June, said officials. The CTU is at present operating a fleet of 140 electric buses on Tricity routes. The delivery of 328 additional electric buses sanctioned under the PM e-Bus Sewa Scheme is expected to commence in October

this year, as the ministry has floated e-tender for procurement of the buses. Officials stated the UT Administration planned to replace all diesel buses with electric buses by the end of 2027–28 to promote eco-friendly, sustainable and green public transport in the city. For the first lot of 100 electric buses, the UT Administration has signed an agreement at the lowest amount of Rs 61.80 per km with the operator. Under the hiring model procurement, maintenance and operation will be looked after by the operator, while the revenue will be collected by the department.

Chandigarh railway station to be upgraded in 2 phases

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : “The railway station would be blocked in coordination with the Railway Administration for the installation of a rooftop balance at the concourse level” said Yashanjeet Singh, Senior Divisional Commercial Manager, Northern Railway, Ambala Division. The Rail Land Development Authority (RLDA) will undertake the upgrade of Chandigarh railway station in two phases — from July 20 to 22 and July 23 to 25 — due to which the platforms of several arriving and departing trains have been changed. During the first phase (July 20-22), four-hour blocks will be taken from 10.10 am to 2.10 pm on Line Nos. 4 (Platform 3), 5 (Platform 4), 6 (Platform 5) and 8 (Platform 6). During this period, the following platform changes will remain in force: Train No. 12046 (Chandigarh-New Delhi Shatabdi Express): Platform 2. Train No. 14542 (Amritsar-Chandigarh Express) and



No. 15531 (Saharsa-Amritsar Jansadharan Express): Platform 1. Train No. 12058 (Daulatpur Chowk-New Delhi Jan Shatabdi Express) and No. 14332 (Kalka-Delhi Express): Platform 3. During the second phase (July 23-25), four-hour blocks will be effected from 10.10 am to 2.10 pm on Line Nos. 6 (Platform 5) and 8 (Platform 6). The following platform changes will remain in effect: Train No. 12046 (Chandigarh-New Delhi Shatabdi Express): Platform 2. Train No. 14542 (Amritsar-Chandigarh Express): Platform 1. Train No. 12058 (Daulatpur Chowk-New Delhi Jan Shatabdi Express) and No. 14332 (Kalka-Delhi Express): Platform 3.

Deficiency in service, builder told to refund Rs 13 lakh for delay in handing over plot

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Daljeet Singh Malhotra, a city resident, in the complaint filed through advocate Anirudh Gupta said he booked a 10-marla plot in Sector 86, Mohali, with the Akash Co-Operative House Building Society in their housing project scheme. He was allotted registration number 519 upon payment of booking amount of Rs 13,40,110 on December 14, 2005. The possession was promised within three years, but was never delivered. Currencies & Foreign Exchange. The project was later taken over by Preet Land Promoters and Developers Pvt Ltd, and an allotment letter dated July 17, 2016, was issued for a plot, yet without any possession timeline. While observing this, the District Consumer



Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh, has directed a builder to refund Rs 13,40,110 to the consumer, along with interest, from the respective dates of deposit till realisation. Currencies & Foreign Exchange The commission also directed the builder to pay Rs 50,000 as compensation towards harassment and litigation expenses to the complainant. The project was later taken over by Preet Land Promoters and Developers Pvt Ltd, and an allotment letter dated July 17, 2016, was issued for a plot, yet without any possession timeline.

Civic body amasses Rs 7.57cr revenue collection record of 3 months

Commissioner News Service Panchkula : Several initiatives had been undertaken to strengthen tax collection, including regular reviews, special recovery drives, action against major defaulters and public awareness campaigns to encourage timely payments. The Civic body has this way collected revenue worth Rs 7.57 crore between April 1 and June 30 — approximately 78 per cent more than the Rs 4.26 crore collected during the corresponding period of the previous financial year. The civic body raked in Rs 5.92 crore from property tax, Rs 36 lakh from fire tax and Rs 1.29 crore from garbage collection charges. Initial notices were issued to 752 property owners with outstanding dues exceeding Rs 2 lakh. Of these, 47 property owners have already cleared their dues, while second notices will soon be issued to the remaining 705 defaulters. The civic body aims to promote voluntary tax



compliance while ensuring the timely recovery of all outstanding dues. The MC's self-certification campaign has received an encouraging response from residents. Of the 104,631 properties, the self-certification process has been completed for 44,002, accounting for 42.05 per cent. The civic body had collected a total revenue of Rs 14.72 crore during the previous financial year. Expressing confidence over the encouraging performance in the first quarter of the current financial year, officials said the corporation was well positioned to set new benchmarks in revenue collection in the months ahead.

Process of shifting traders from Sector 26 to begin by the end of this year

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The approval will pave the way for facilitating the auction of the remaining plots and enable the Administration to begin the process of shifting traders from the existing Sector 26 mandi to the new facility by the end of the year. The Administration is likely to resume the auction of plots at the new wholesale fruit, vegetable and grain market in Sector 39 next month. The State Agricultural Marketing Board is expected to receive environmental clearance for the project later this month. The officials said the board had applied for environmental clearance, following which the State Expert Appraisal Committee (SEAC) sought



certain clarifications. These have since been addressed, and the proposal has been submitted to the competent authority for approval. Once environmental clearance is received, the board will auction the remaining 80 plots, each measuring 120 square yards, and begin other developmental works at the new mandi. Of the 92 plots planned in the new mandi, only 12 were

auctioned during the first phase. Authorities have decided that the next auction will be open to all eligible buyers, including traders from outside Chandigarh, and no preference will be given to commission agents (arhtiyas). The Administration has also revised the reserve price of showroom plots following the implementation of new collector rates. The reserve price has increased from Rs 3.70 crore to Rs 5.40 crore. Once completed, the Sector 39 mandi will provide modern trading, storage and logistics facilities while addressing congestion and infrastructure constraints at the existing market. The officials said the detailed project report (DPR) had been approved by the Engineering Department.

Scrapping of the houses in Sector 53 to be withheld

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The proposal to discontinue the general housing scheme was taken up in a meeting of the board of directors of the CHB here. Urban & Regional Planning The meeting of the board of directors was held under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary H Rajesh Prasad. A total of 16 agendas were discussed in the meeting. A proposal to scrap the long-pending general housing scheme in Sector 53 has been deferred after nominated board members opposed the proposal and sought clarity on the authority's future housing policy. The members decided to first study merits and demerits of the scheme, after which the matter would be taken up in the next meeting of the board for a final decision.



While officials proposed formally withdrawing the Sector 53 housing scheme, nominated members opposed the move, saying that no decision should be taken without first finalising a comprehensive policy on land utilisation and the construction of affordable housing. The Sector 53 housing project has remained in limbo despite the CHB conducting two separate demand surveys over the years. Housing & Development Strongly opposing the proposal to develop the Sector 53 housing scheme through private builders, nominated

board member Shakti Prakash Devshali said, “If private builders are given new housing schemes to develop, their prices will soar.” However, board members insisted that before abandoning the housing scheme, the board must clearly spell out its proposed land disposal policy. Members argued that certain policy aspects should be finalised before any decision was taken to withdraw the scheme. The board also reviewed the issue of payment defaults across various housing schemes. According to CHB records, around 13,000 allottees have defaulted on payments under different schemes. To provide relief, the board decided to allow defaulters to clear their outstanding dues through easy monthly instalments.

Aesthetic look of Rock Garden with grass pavers costing Rs 1.26 cr would beautify its facade

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The envisaged project of installing grass paver is estimated to cost nearly Rs 1.26 crore. In a significant move it would enhance the aesthetic look and environmental sustainability of the city's tourist hub, the UT Engineering Department has invited tenders for a major infrastructure project. The department eco planning would install grass pavers on the land opposite the world-famous Rock Garden in Sector 1. The initiative is expected to not only beautify the area but also provide a durable, eco-friendly surface for the heavy footfall and vehicular movement the area receives due to its proximity to major tourist attractions. The department has set a tight deadline for the project. After awarding the contract, the entire work has to be completed within two months to minimise any inconvenience to tourists and residents. Unlike solid concrete, grass pavers allow rainwater to percolate into the ground, aiding in groundwater recharge and



reducing surface runoff, which is a common issue during the monsoon season. To increase the green cover in the city, the UT Administration has prepared a comprehensive Plantation Plan 2026-27 in consultation with all stakeholders concerned. The focus this year will be on the quality of plantation rather than quantity. All departments have been advised to use quality planting material to ensure better growth and survival of saplings. The plantation target for all greening agencies during 2026-27 has been fixed at 4,19,854 saplings, including distribution and sale of plants. Plantation target exceeded During the plantation activities undertaken in 2025-26, against the target of 5,76,221 saplings under the Greening Chandigarh

Action Plan, 6,64,133 saplings were planted. Meanwhile, the UT Administration has planned to establish a City Forest Development Project in the Sukhna choe forest area while adhering strictly to environmental safeguards and conservation principles. The proposed City Forest is envisioned as a landmark initiative to promote environmental conservation, nature-based education and sustainable ecotourism in Chandigarh. The project aims to create awareness among citizens about the protection and conservation of forests, wildlife and the environment through immersive learning experiences and nature-oriented activities. The City Forest will be developed as a premier centre for nature education and learning while promoting responsible and sustainable ecotourism. The project will encourage greater public engagement with nature and foster environmental stewardship among visitors of all age groups.

Trump’s new threat,
Mojtaba vows revenge for
father's killing

Tehran : Iran’s Supreme Leader,
Mojtaba Khamenei on Saturday
vowed revenge for the U.S.-
Israeli killing of his father and
predecessor, hours after
President Donald Trump
warned against any attempt to
assassinate him.
Mr. Trump has declared their
ceasefire over, while mediators
have been trying to salvage
diplomacy.
“Vengeance is the will of our
nation and must inevitably be
carried out,” Mojtaba Khamenei
said in a written message.
He became Iran’s Supreme
Leader after his father Ali
Khamenei’s killing in late
February by U.S.-Israeli strikes,
but has not been in public since

before the war. “This matter
depends neither on my personal
existence nor on that of other
officials. Whether we are pres-
ent or not, it will come to pass,”
he wrote in his first message
since his father’s funeral this
week. He said Iran had com-
piled a list of individuals to be
targeted.
Hours earlier Mr. Trump had
posted on his Truth Social plat-
form that any attempt to assassi-

nate him would lead the U.S. to
“completely decimate” Iran.
“1000 Missiles are Locked and
Loaded and aimed at the Islamic
Republic of Iran, with thou-
sands more to immediately fol-
low should the Iranian
Government act on its threat,
pronounced in many corners of
the Globe, to assassinate, or
attempt to assassinate, the sit-
ting President of the United
States of America, in this case,
ME!” Mr. Trump wrote.
“Orders have already been
given, and the U.S. Military is
ready, willing, and able, for a
one-year period of time, subject
to extension, to completely de-
cimate and destroy all areas of
Iran.”
