Court grants default bail to accused Rajesh Sangwan in Rs 645 Cr bank scam

CBI fails to file timely charge sheet

Panchkula : The ultimate development of collusion amongst bank officials of IDFC First bank, AU small finance bank and govt officers led to siphoning off the govt funds by the shell companies. The Panchkula court granted default bail to Rajesh Sangwan, a former Controller of Finance and Accounts for the Haryana State Agriculture Marketing Board (HSAMB) as the CBI failed to file the timely charge sheet within the statutory 90 days period in the case involving Rs 645 Cr bank fraud. The accused official had



facilitated opening of accounts, transfer of funds and subsequent diversion into other accounts. The case mainly concentrated on the illegal deposit and diversion of the Haryana

Govt Funds into IDFC First Bank & AU Small Finance Bank involving multiple departments. The dead line of 90 days had expired on June 12, 2026. The court ruled despite

ongoing investigations, against others, Mr Sangwan was too entitled to bail he under the sec 167 (2) of the Cr Pc corresponding to section. While Sangwan received bail. The investigation is still active with earlier chargesheets filed against 15, other suspect including bank oreports, public servants and private individuals, according to June 13, 2026 report. Earlier reports cited Rs, 645 Cr, investigation have also highlighted a total fund diversion linked to these cases of appr Rs 657 Cr including Rs, 153 Cr loss to Chandigarh Smart City Ltd.

US peace deal doesn't allow Iran to continue enriching uranium for nuclear weapons : Republicans

Washington : US President Donald Trump has been hailed by the allies, as the deal maker. Accolades from varied supporters poured in on the newly struck deal to end the US-Israel war on Iran. The exemplary achievement is being hailed as a strategic victory by US President Donald Trump, though the specific terms of the agreement remain unknown. Despite questions over which commitments would be included in the initial memorandum of understanding (MOU) to be signed on Friday, and which issues, such as Iran's nuclear

During 2024, the claim of high purity was made in August 2025, sample BKD 2458 was taken for purity test and won clientele applause and wide acceptance. For the quality emergence conventional ayurvedic Bolana procedure is adopted by the dairy engineers. Cow pure milk is manufactured from white but-



ter/curd. The quantum of cow milk is put on mild flame specific span of time until it got melted for ghee. It is widely claimed that cow milk is scared substance, often used in religious rituals besides Aurvedic treatments.

Cow ghee must be used before 9 months from date. Milk fat is inherently expensive. Its current exdairy price of Rs 460, -- 470 / is way above Rs 125 -- 130, wholesale range for refined palmolien, soyabean or sunflower.

Finland Minister defends India's purchase of Russian oil within oilprice cap

Kultaranta : India received unprecedented backing from Finland on its purchase of Russian oil, with Finnish Foreign Minister Elina Valtonen saying New Delhi had acted within the framework of the oil price cap introduced by Western countries after Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Speaking during a panel discussion at the Kultaranta Talks in Finland, where External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar participated alongside Valtonen and UAE Assistant Foreign Minister Lana Nusseibeh, the Finnish minister argued that the Western price cap mechanism was never designed to stop countries from buying Russian crude altogether.



"In India's defence, it has bought oil under the price cap. That was the intention," Valtonen said. She added, "When we introduced the oil price cap, we did not prohibit the world from buying Russian oil. The entire idea was not to disrupt the oil market but to make sure oil continued to be supplied while Russia did not make massive margins from it." Jaishankar mounted a robust defence of India's energy policy and rejected criticism over New Delhi's continued purchases of Russian oil since outbreak of the Ukraine war.

87% rise in divorce petitions in Kerala

Kochi : The sweep of changing social norms, growing financial independence and greater stubbornness, and uncompromising attitude are driving the cases to courts for divorce. For the past 6 years, trend has gained momentum with the hike in divorce petitions. Recurring incidents of deaths linked to domestic discord creates pes-



simistic wave. The RTI figures procured from state highlights as 18886 in 2020 arose to 25020 in 2021 and 30781 in 2022 before further shooting to 33,535 in 2023 and 35238 in 2025. About 2,418 petitions for

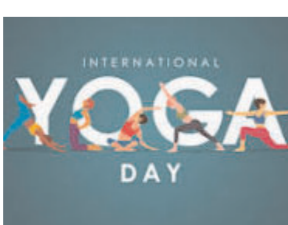

BJP claims India block a marginalized outfit

Amid political marginalisation of its key pillars and accumulating grievances against the BJP government, opposition parties gathered on Monday for a brainstorming on the road ahead — the first such meeting beyond parliamentary coordination since the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. The meeting coincides with PM Narendra Modi completing his third term in office, and amid growing dissonance among anti-BJP parties since the latest round of assembly polls. India block 23 parties have confirmed their participation in the meeting held at the Constitution Club. He added that some parties have expressed their inability to attend “this particular meeting for their own reasons”, but they have “conveyed their strong opposition to Modi government’s policies...” — a remark seeming to allude to DMK while suggesting that the opposition still hopes that the Dravidian outfit would return to the fold in the future. The meeting has been convened at the demand of TMC, which is facing an existential crisis with large-scale defections in favour of BJP in the West Bengal assembly and a looming split in its parliamentary party. The party was represented by its leadership — Mamata Banerjee and Abhishek Banerjee. While there is no love lost between Mamata and the INDIA bloc, the former CM’s plea for the meeting is widely viewed as a call for help. After the BJP swept away the governing TMC in Bengal, Rahul Gandhi urged a stop to rejoicing from Congress and other opposition parties who had faced TMC’s ire in the past, arguing it was time to move beyond personal animosity and focus on the “threat to democracy” posed by the BJP’s politics. The discussions may focus on EC’s SIR of electoral rolls in Bengal, which Rahul and TMC have blamed for the poll outcome. Other issues of the opposition are also likely to come up, as the parties try to hammer out a strategy for the road ahead. Blame games based on intra-INDIA bloc differences could make the exchanges acrimonious, given that Congress is in the crosshairs of some players. DMK - TMC’s ouster from power in May polls has destroyed two big islands of support for the opposition. BJP gaining a firm footing in Bengal poses a serious threat to the marginalised opposition as the state sends 42 MPs to Lok Sabha, which will be critical in the outcome of the 2029 general elections. Tamil Nadu holds out hope as DMK vanquisher TVK is aligned with the bloc’s parties in the state. Besides, the substantial parliamentary contingent of the two parties has been critical to the opposition’s efficacy in LS and RS. Suspense hangs over TVK’s participation in the INDIA the party may not come. TN CM bloc meeting, with some saying Vijay’s party was widely seen as the bloc’s new member, triggering excitement among constituents. A Congress MP claimed the bloc has parties which have members in Parliament. He said TVK could become part of the bloc by winning the RS vacancy in TN that is up for polls, but the seat has gone to Congress.

SIR at door-to-door of voters to begin in SAS Nagar district from June 25

MOHALI : The district administration has initiated comprehensive preparations following the ECI’s notification for the statewide revision across Punjab. Komal Mittal, District Election Officer-cum-Deputy Commissioner announced that the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Sahibzada Ajit Singh Nagar district would be conducted in a completely transparent, systematic and time-bound manner, following the directives of the Election Commission of India (ECI). Under the SIR drive, Booth Level Officers (BLOs) will conduct



door-to-door visits from June 25 to July 24 to distribute and collect voter forms. To ensure the exercise runs smoothly, the administration has deployed 838 BLOs, 83 Supervisors, 3 Electoral Registration Officers (EROs), and six Assistant Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs). Mandatory training for field staff will take place from June 15 to June 24. “The primary objective of the SIR is to ensure the inclusion of every eligible citizen in the electoral roll, while

simultaneously removing ineligible entries to maintain absolute accuracy and integrity,” Mittal stated. January 1, 2003, has been fixed as the qualifying date for the SIR. Mittal further stated that the rationalisation of polling stations would be completed by July 24, while the draft electoral rolls would be published on July 31. Claims and objections regarding the draft voter lists may be submitted from July 31 to August and their disposal would be carried out between July 31 and September 28. The final publication of the electoral rolls had been scheduled for October 1.

Seamless connectivity in just one hour Chandigarh-Noida from July 1

MOHALI : The flight will leave Noida at 6.10 am and reach Chandigarh at 7.10 am. The return flight will depart from Chandigarh at 7.30 am and arrive at Noida International Airport at 8.35 am. Passengers will be able to fly between Chandigarh and Noida in just one hour, with a direct daily flight connecting Shaheed Bhagat Singh International Airport and Noida International Airport from July 1. The service is expected to provide seamless connectivity for travellers from the region to Delhi-NCR and western Uttar Pradesh. The airfare is expected to be around Rs 3,850, which is comparable to fares for flights operating to and from Delhi Airport. Officials said an additional flight service would be introduced on two days a



week from July 13. This flight will depart from Noida at 9.55 am and arrive in Chandigarh at 10.55 am. The return service will leave Chandigarh at 12.20 pm and reach Noida at 1.35 pm. At present, passengers travelling to Noida and nearby areas have to land at Delhi Airport and then undertake a road journey of nearly 100 km. The new direct service is expected to save more than two hours of travel time, particularly for residents of western Uttar Pradesh. Meanwhile, the Noida-Amritsar flight service commenced operations on June 15.

Lessee can terminate lease agreement by serving prior notice of 60 days

MOHALI : The sudden closure of VR Mall, Sector 118, on Mohali-Kharar Road, one of the biggest shopping malls in the region, has put a question mark on the future of showroom owners, employees, retailers, suppliers, and other stakeholders. A Mohali court has issued notice of the suit as well as the stay application to VR Malwa Private Ltd (defendant) in a case relating to the closure and transfer or alienation of the property leased to H&M Hennes and Mauritz Retail Private Ltd. The court directed both parties to maintain the status quo till July 2. Hennes and Mauritz Retail Private Ltd (H&M) filed a petition under Section 9 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, seeking an urgent interim order restraining VR Malwa Private Ltd (respondent) from alienating, transferring, or creating third-party rights in respect of the leased property. Counsel Manish Jain, representing petitioner H&M,

referred to a clause that states the lessee, who is the respondent here, does not have any right to early termination of the lease agreement except in case of default on the part of the lessee. He also submitted that the lease in this case was for 35 years from the handover date. He further referred to a clause which states that only the lessee can terminate the agreement by giving prior notice of 60 days. The court noted that there is a lease agreement between the parties, but the respondent, on 18.04.2026, gave notice to shut down the mall citing public interest due to damage caused by an earthquake on 03.04.2026. Since material rights of the petitioner are involved in this case as he is running a business inside the premises, the respondent cannot proceed with closure, transfer, or alienation of the property without settling the matter with him.

Division of industrial plots in Master Plan-2031 proposed by Chd Admn

CHANDIGARH : An addendum to the proposed amendments concerning the fragmentation of industrial plots in Industrial Area Phase-I and II has been issued as part of the ongoing deregulation exercise aimed at promoting optimum use of industrial land. The UT Administration has recommended the fragmentation of industrial plots in the proposed amendments to the Chandigarh Master Plan-2031. The addendum, approved by the Administrator, is to be read in continuation of the proposed amendments already notified on May 22. It has been proposed to permit the fragmentation of larger industrial plots into smaller plots, subject to approval of revised planning and zoning, and compliance with other conditions prescribed under the applicable policy. The policy governing such fragmentation shall be notified separately by the Chandigarh Administration. Detailed information



regarding the proposed amendments and the addendum is available on the official website of the Department of Urban Planning, Chandigarh Administration. Submitting suggestions, Col (retd) Gursewak Singh, president of the Residents’ Welfare Association, Modern Housing Complex (MHC), Sector 13, suggested that with high density population, the area has the highest car density. “In the absence of designated parking, vehicles are often parked on roads, pedestrian paths, or in front of neighbouring houses, leading to disputes and conflicts,” he said.

Automated testing station to replace manual checking of commercial vehicles in Chandigarh

CHANDIGARH : An automated testing station (ATS) is coming up at Raipur Kalan and the work is in an advanced stage. Manual testing of commercial vehicles will soon be a thing of the past. Machines are being installed and the station is likely to be made operational by August. Commercial vehicle fitness tests will be conducted with the use of sensor-based systems to ensure transparent, accurate and standardised testing. Nearly 30,000 commercial vehicles have been registered in the city. After eight years, the mandatory fitness



certificate is required every year for the renewal of vehicle registration certificate. At present, vehicles are manually inspected at Manimajra. To enhance road safety and reduce pollution, various parameters such as brake efficiency, suspension, steering alignment and emission levels will be evaluated at the testing station. The officials stated that the automated station would help check corruption, human error and manual manipulation.

BLOs commence door-to-door visits for Special Intensive Revision

CHANDIGARH : The enumeration phase, being conducted as per the schedule prescribed by the Election Commission of India (ECI), will continue from June 15 to July 14. The door-to-door visits by Booth Level Officers (BLOs) commenced across the UT on Monday as part of the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls. According to the UT Administration, all necessary arrangements have been made to ensure the smooth conduct of the exercise. On the very first day, up to 5 pm, BLOs distributed 37,410 enumeration forms to electors across the city, reflecting an encouraging response to the revision process. During the enumeration phase, BLOs will undertake



door-to-door visits for the distribution and collection of Enumeration Forms. Every elector will be provided with two copies of the form and assistance, wherever required, in filling it. In cases where houses are found locked, BLOs will leave the forms at the premises and make at least three follow-up visits on different dates for their collection. Electors may also submit duly filled Enumeration Forms online through the ECINet Mobile App or the Voters’ Service Portal, subject to verification

by the BLO concerned. Electors are requested to provide mapping details from the previous Special Intensive Revision conducted during 2002-2003. Where such details are not available, they may provide details of their parents or grandparents recorded in the SIR of 2002-2003 or the recently conducted SIR of 2025-2026 in 12 States/UTs. Previous SIR records can be accessed through the website of the Chief Electoral Officer, Chandigarh, the ECINet Mobile App, or the Voters’ Service Portal. Eligible residents whose names are not included in the existing electoral roll may submit Form 6 along with the prescribed declaration. Such applications will be processed after the publication of the Draft Electoral Roll on July 21.

Western disturbance restores weather activity till June 21

CHANDIGARH : A fresh western disturbance interacting with moisture-laden southwesterly winds brought light to moderate rainfall and gusty winds across Punjab, Haryana and Chandigarh on Monday, providing respite from the prevailing heat and setting the stage for a wet week ahead. A cyclonic circulation over Punjab, Haryana and adjoining areas, coupled with moisture from the Arabian Sea, triggered widespread weather activity across the region, stated officials of the meteorology section. “There was a cyclonic circulation over Punjab, Haryana and nearby areas, which led to rain over Delhi. Moisture-laden southwesterly winds from the Arabian Sea also helped in the development of this weather activity. Because of the moisture and the cyclonic circulation, parts of Punjab, Haryana and Delhi received rain,” said Mahesh Palawat, Vice-President, Climate and Meteorology,



Skymet Weather. In Chandigarh, cloudy skies and intermittent showers brought down temperatures, offering relief from the sultry weather conditions witnessed over the past few days. Similar weather prevailed in several parts of Punjab, including Ludhiana, Patiala, Mohali, Amritsar and Jalandhar, where gusty winds accompanied light to moderate rainfall. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast thunderstorms accompanied by rain across Punjab, Haryana and Chandigarh over the next two days. While the intensity of rainfall is expected to reduce gradually, the presence of moisture in the atmosphere is likely to keep temperatures under check. Palawat said temperatures are

not expected to rise significantly during this period. “After that, temperatures are likely to start increasing again,” he added. The wet spell in Punjab is part of a broader weather system affecting northwestern India. Rain and strong winds lashed parts of Delhi-NCR, Haryana and Rajasthan, while thunderstorms and hailstorms were reported from Himachal Pradesh. The IMD said conditions remain favourable for scattered rainfall and thunderstorms across Punjab till June 21. Farmers, especially those preparing fields for paddy transplantation, are expected to benefit from the pre-monsoon showers, though experts advised caution in areas prone to waterlogging and lightning. Meanwhile, weather models indicate that while the southwest monsoon is advancing into more parts of the country, widespread monsoon rainfall is likely to remain subdued for another week before picking up pace towards the end of June.

Chandigarh plans to plant 4 lakh saplings this fiscal year

CHANDIGARH : The Chief Conservator of Forests disclosed that against the target of 5,76,221, as many as 6,64,133 saplings were planted under the Greening Chandigarh Action Plan 2025-26. The overall survival rate was recorded at 79%. The UT Forest Department has planned to plant over 4 lakh saplings across the city during the fiscal 2026-27. A meeting was chaired by Punjab Governor and UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria to review the preparedness for the Plantation Plan 2026-27. The Administrator was apprised of the preparations



for the 2026-27 plan. It was informed that the focus this year will be on the quality of plantation rather than quantity. This year’s target was fixed at 4,19,854 saplings. The plantation plan for Dadumajra was also reviewed. The MC Commissioner informed that around 10,000 saplings will be planted at the site in consultation with the Forest Department. Species such as bamboo, flowering trees,

bougainvillea, camphor, neem and other suitable species would be planted. The Administrator also reviewed preparations for the ‘Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam’ campaign. He directed the MC to actively involve citizens in the campaign, particularly by encouraging plantation activities in parks and gardens. The UT and MC chief engineers were directed to ensure vegetative cover, preferably grass, in all vacant spaces along roads. Such measures, Kataria observed, would enhance the aesthetic appeal of the city, strengthen soil binding and contribute to mitigation of air pollution.

Iran have 'agreed' to, would never have nuclear weapons, rejects \$300 million fund claim : Trump

Washington DC : US President Donald Trump on Monday (local time) said that Iran has agreed to "never possess a nuclear weapon," while dismissing reports that Washington would provide USD 300 million to Tehran under the newly announced peace agreement as "fake news." Trump reiterated his administration's position that the agreement with Iran would ensure that Tehran does not develop nuclear weapons said in a post on Truth Social.



Iran has agreed to never have a Nuclear Weapon! Also, the story that the US is paying Iran 300 million Dollars is Fake News, put out by the Democrats!!!! Trump wrote. His remarks come amid ongoing discussions surrounding the memorandum of understanding (MoU) signed between the United States and Iran, which establishes a framework for future engagement and links sanctions relief to Tehran's compliance with nuclear verification measures and regional security commitments. Backing the President's position, US Vice President JD Vance said Trump's diplomatic efforts had once again delivered results and reaffirmed that preventing Iran from obtaining a nuclear weapon remained a central objective of the agreement. In a video message shared on X, Vance said, "The President has been clear from day one: Iran will never have a nuclear weapon. Once again, President Trump's efforts to establish peace have paid off

for the American people, despite countless attempts to thwart it by people who hate America and President Trump." Earlier, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu also declared that Iran would never be allowed to acquire nuclear weapons, regardless of any agreement. "For decades, I have been fighting Iran's efforts to acquire nuclear weapons. I can define this as my life's mission. I have upheld it until now, and I will uphold it in the future as well," Netanyahu said. "With or without a deal, Iran will not have nuclear weapons. Not today, and not tomorrow. As long as I am Prime Minister of Israel, this will not happen," he added. According to senior US administration officials, the memorandum signed by Trump and Vance creates a structure for future negotiations and bilateral relations between Washington and Tehran.

Works worth Rs 16 crore to begin, approved by MC

PATIALA : A contractor was blacklisted for failing to execute assigned projects. The Finance and Contract Committee (F&CC) of the Patiala Municipal Corporation on Monday approved development works worth around Rs 16 crore. The meeting was chaired by Mayor Kundan Gogia and outgoing Municipal Commissioner Paramjit Singh. The MC will spend around Rs 9 crore on road repairs and Rs 2.32 crore on sewer cleaning. It will spend Rs 2.29 crore on street lights and other beautification projects. Gogia said the committee had blacklisted BS Builders Private Limited for two years for failing to start road repair works in Green Park Colony, Partap Nagar and the Badangar area despite repeated notices. "The civic body has also forfeited the firm's earnest money deposit and bank guarantee, while fresh tenders will be invited for the pending works," he said. To strengthen the city's drainage network ahead of the monsoon, the committee approved the desilting of the Model Town and Jacob drains.



It also cleared the desilting of the main sewer line from Ablowal to Tiwana Chowk. Other works approved in the meeting included the installation of decorative lighting near Gurdwara Moti Bagh Sahib and new street lights around Gurdwara Dukhniwaran Sahib, along Rajpura Road, Sirhind Bypass and Sanour Road. The committee also sanctioned beautification works on Heritage Street, including the installation of modern street lights. Gogia further said the project would help preserve the city's heritage character and improve the experience of visitors. The development works approved in various wards included the construction and repair of roads, renovation of parks, installation of tubewells and laying of new sewer and stormwater pipelines.

PM Modi conferred highest civilian honour 'Order of the White Double Cross'

President Pellegrini extended a warm welcome to PM Modi, who is the first Indian Prime Minister to visit Slovakia since its independence, in the Presidential Palace, where he also signed the visitor's book. Prime Minister Modi later held a delegation-level meeting with President Pellegrini at the Palace. The Indian delegation participating in the talks included External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri, Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) Secretary (West) Sibi George and Additional Secretary in the MEA Puja Kapur. Ahead of the International Day of Yoga, celebrated on June 21 every year, a special session of yoga was organised at the Palace. The two leaders also visited the session.

\$54 billion mark to be achieved by India, Korea trade by 2030: Goyal

NEW DELHI : Addressing the India-Korea Business Forum in New Delhi, Union Minister of Commerce and Industry Piyush Goyal said India and the Republic of Korea have been tasked by their leadership to double bilateral trade from the current USD 27 billion to USD 54 billion by 2030, requiring an annual growth rate of nearly 18 per cent. Mr Goyal on Monday highlighted the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on the India-Korea Industrial Cooperation Committee as a landmark step towards strengthening bilateral economic engagement. He added that this target does not fully capture the true potential of the partnership and called for efforts to unlock the next phase of economic cooperation. President of the Republic of



Korea (ROK), H.E. Lee Jae Myung, who was also attending the India-Korea Business Forum, said India stands as a key pillar of the global economy. He noted that there is significant scope to further expand business and trade, adding that bilateral trade has considerable room for growth and, with sustained efforts, is expected to double alongside ongoing negotiations on the Comprehensive Economic Partnership agreement. He emphasised the need to prepare high-tech industries for the future through collaboration and by

leveraging India's strengths in artificial intelligence. He also said cooperation in the shipping sector will be strengthened. Meanwhile, Goyal emphasised that sectors such as semiconductors, electronics, advanced manufacturing, e-mobility, green energy, shipbuilding and digital trade offer strong complementarities between the two economies. He noted that India and Korea can collaborate through co-production, co-design, co-creation, co-innovation and jointly serve global markets with high-quality and competitively priced products. Highlighting India's economic trajectory, Goyal said the country, currently a USD 4 trillion economy, is on a roadmap to reach USD 30 trillion by 2047, when it celebrates 100 years of independence.

Pilgrims advised to check registration process as Amarnath Yatra 2026 slated to begin from July 3

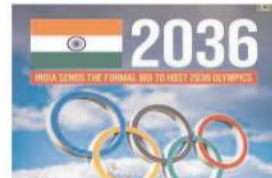

NEW DELHI : Tourists between the ages of 13 and 70 can undertake the yatra and registrations will begin from April 15. The LG told reporters at the Lok Bhavan here. The annual pilgrimage to the holy cave shrine of Amarnath in south Kashmir will commence on July 3 and conclude after 57 days on August 28, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha said. The dates for the yatra were decided at a meeting of the Shri Amarnath Ji Shrine Board (SASB) under the chairmanship of Sinha. "The Amarnath Yatra will commence on July 3 and conclude on August 28. Overall, this year's pilgrimage will be slightly longer, lasting about 57 days," the LG said. Registration for the pilgrimage has been made mandatory and will begin from April 15. The minimum age for pilgrims has been fixed at 13 years and the maximum at 70 years, he said. "Advance registration can be carried out through about 556



designated bank branches across the country, while online registration will also be available through the official website of the Shri Amarnathji Shrine Board," Sinha said. Yes Bank, ICICI Bank, Punjab National Bank, State Bank of India and Axis Bank will facilitate registrations through their branches, he said. The LG said the first puja will be performed on June 19, on the occasion of Jyeshtha Purnima. The pilgrimage will commence from the twin tracks—the traditional 48-km Nunwan-Pahalgam route in Anantnag district and the 14-km shorter but steeper Baltal route in Ganderbal district.

BJP's commitment to make Thiruvananthapuram 2036 Olympics venue generate political uproar

Thiruvananthapuram : BJP Kerala unit urge it would request the Centre to include the city as one of the venues for the 2036 Games. In its manifesto for the Thiruvananthapuram Corporation election. BJP's local body election manifesto promise to develop the state capital into a co-host city for the 2036 Olympics triggered a political row, with leaders of both LDF and UDF on Monday calling it a fake claim. The International Olympic Committee is yet to announce the host for the 2036 edition of the world's biggest sporting event. However, there have been reports that India is bidding for the Games with Ahmedabad as its proposed main host city. Kerala Education Minister V Sivankutty accused BJP of deceiving the people of Thiruvananthapuram. "When the Union Government has bid for the



Olympics in Gujarat, how can BJP here claim that Thiruvananthapuram will be a venue?" He further said as part of the bidding process, BJP is planning for the 2030 Commonwealth Games in Ahmedabad, he claimed. He asked whether BJP state president Rajeev Chandrasekhar considered the people of Thiruvananthapuram "fools". "The proposal submitted to the Olympic body has no mention of Thiruvananthapuram. This is a trick because BJP has nothing to say about development," he said. Senior Congress leader K Muraliedharan also hit out at BJP on its election manifesto,

saying that, fearing defeat, the party had begun making "fake promises". "They know they would not even become the main opposition party this time. Hence, such claims," he said. State Revenue Minister K Rajan echoed a similar view, stating that the host for the 2036 Olympics had yet to be announced, but BJP claimed the event would be held in Thiruvananthapuram. Reacting to the criticism, Chandrasekhar said that other political parties would realise the proposal later. "They do not understand how it will happen. We will teach them after we get the opportunity to govern," he said. BJP is currently the main opposition in the CPI(M)-governed Thiruvananthapuram Corporation. The local body election in the state will be held in two phases on December 9 and 11.

'Like an obedient servant of US, Modi remains patientful over killing of Indian sailors : Rahul Gandhi

New Delhi : Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi Sunday questioned Prime Minister Narendra Modi's "silence" over American missile strikes on commercial ships in the Gulf region that killed three Indian seafarers on June 10. After External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar spoke with US Secretary of State Marco Rubio regarding the deaths of three Indian seafarers, the US State Department issued a readout of the conversation. It stated that commercial vessels must comply with the instructions issued by



American forces. Additionally, it warned that any violation of the US blockade on Iranian ports "will not be tolerated". In a post on X, Gandhi said that a "free country would never tolerate such language", but our "compromised PM" is "silent". "They listen like an obedient servant and comply with the orders," said Gandhi.

He said that just days after the murder of three Indian sailors in American attacks, there was "no remorse, no apology". "On the contrary, America has continued issuing orders," said Gandhi. He added that the "compromised PM" will not defend the country's honour because "those who insult the country control them". In a separate post on X, Gandhi appealed to the government to bring the mortal remains of the sailors killed in the US attack, and said. "In the regime of the compromised PM, being an Indian means utter ruin."

Nationalist Citizens Party christenises New Home Of 20 Rebel Trinamool MPs

New Delhi : A little-known political outfit that failed to make any electoral impact in the 2023 Tripura assembly elections has suddenly found itself at the centre of national politics after 20 rebel Trinamool Congress MPs announced their merger with the Nationalist Citizens Party of India (NCPI). The development has transformed the obscure Bengal-based party into a key player in the unfolding political crisis within the Trinamool, drawing attention to the party's origins, structure, leadership and internal functioning. The Nationalist Citizen Party was registered with the Election Commission as a Registered Unrecognised Political Party (RUPP) on January 20, 2023, just weeks before the Tripura assembly elections. Despite being registered in Bengal, the



party chose to make its electoral debut in Tripura. According to Election Commission records, the party received total donations of just Rs 1.13 lakh. Party documents list Shewly Kundu as the treasurer. She is also a director in two organisations registered at the same address as the political party: Biswabazar Private Limited (director since November 2021) and Paschim Banga Asangathita Mahila Karmi Association (director since October 2020), an organisation involved in social work activities.

Maiden flight with Indigo from Lucknow opens Noida international airport as operational

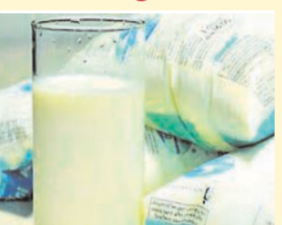

India lodges strong protest against the US naval attack on commercial vessel

New Delhi : Mr Marco Rubio, US State Secretary told S Jaishankar, External Affairs Minister, violation of the American blockade and illicit transport of Iranian oil through the Strait of Hormuz will not be tolerated.

Jaishankar spoke to Rubio on Friday, hours after the Ministry of External Affairs summoned US Chargé d'Affaires Jason Meeks for the second time in less than 48 hours over attacks involving commercial vessels carrying Indian crew. "Spoke to US Secretary of State



Marco Rubio this evening. I reiterated India's strong protest at the attacks by the US Navy in the Gulf that killed three Indian mariners. Such lethal actions against commercial shipping are not justified," Jaishankar wrote on X. The minister's intervention elevated the issue from a diplomatic protest lodged through officials to a direct conversation between the two countries' top diplomats, signalling the seriousness with which New Delhi views the incidents.

On screen marking, CBSE needs needs over hauling

New Delhi : On screen marking is the latest introduced trend by the Central Board of Secondary Education. Principals of CBSE-affiliated schools began posting strikingly similar videos and parroting similar lines while defending the evaluation mechanism and urging students to "trust the system." Marking (OSM) system, a digital evaluation mechanism intended to replace the conventional process of physically handling and checking answer scripts. Under the new system, answer sheets are scanned, uploaded to a centralised portal, and evaluated digitally by examiners logging into the CBSE platform. Marks are entered directly into the system, reducing manual tabulation



errors and streamlining the evaluation process. However, shortly after the declaration of results, social media platforms, particularly X (formerly Twitter), were inundated with complaints from students alleging serious irregularities in the evaluation process. Among them was Vedant Srivastava, who claimed that after receiving unexpectedly low marks in Physics, he applied for photocopies of his answer scripts through CBSE's re-evaluation process. To his shock, the Physics answer sheet uploaded by the Board did not appear to be his own.

'Agniveer Vayu, other airmen laid down life forever Mothers kept mourning

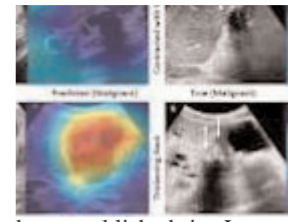

Detection of gallbladder cancer by ultrasound image at PGI

Chandigarh : Gallbladder cancer is a major public health menace in north India especially among women with common gallstones serving as a primary risk factor. While affordable and radiation free ultrasound machines are widely available in rural areas, smaller peripheral health centres usually lack the specialised expertise required to spot subtle, early malignant signs.

From the department of radiodiagnosis and imaging the pioneering study has



been published in Lancet Regional Health. The team of multidisciplinary researchers at the PGI has an artificially developed a distinct model.

The new model analyses multiple ultrasound scans from same patient simulta-

neously to deliver a single cancer or non cancer diagnosis, complete with a mathematical probability score. The PGIMER team plans to validate the model through prospective clinical trials and integrate the software into routine hospital ultrasound workflows. Clinicians anticipate that deploying this application within standard hospital routines will significantly lower the diagnostic burden on tertiary care centres like PGIMER by filtering out non malignant cases at the primary care stage.
