The risk remains high for regional spread and low at global levels, said the Director General. In review meeting, Nadda said India has not reported any case of Bundibugyo Ebola disease till date.

Nadda noted that as a precautionary measure, the Union Health Ministry, in close coordination with the NCDC, DGHS, ICMR, Civil Aviation, Immigration authorities and other concerned ministries and departments, has strengthened surveillance and public health preparedness across the country. "Enhanced screening and surveillance measures have been initiated at international airports and other points of entry and advisories along with

Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) on screening, quarantine, clinical management, laboratory testing and infection prevention practices have been shared with all states and union territories," Nadda noted. Meetings have also been held with states/UTs and concerned stakeholders to review preparedness and response measures. On May 24, India had issued a travel advisory for citizens to avoid non-essential travel to the Democratic Republic of

the Congo, Uganda and South Sudan. Prior to that, on May 21, the Union Health Ministry issued SOP on public health preparedness and response to Ebola disease encompassing protocols to be followed by international passengers and on May 22, guidelines were issued for hospital infection control, isolation facility preparedness and for safe and dignified handling of human remains of Ebola patients.

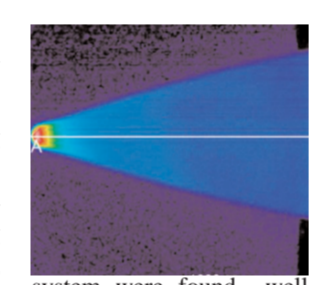


owners, Sehgal forged and prepared consent letters to acquire CLU for the Sutech City, a mega housing project. The agency held the whole game against

Venezuela becomes third largest crude oil supplier of India

New Delhi : Venezuela has emerged as India's third-largest crude oil supplier in May, overtaking traditional heavyweights Saudi Arabia and the United States. Indian refiners increased purchases of cheaper Venezuelan crude amid ongoing disruptions in global oil markets. Energy cargo tracker Kpler stated, Venezuela supplied around 417,000 barrels per day (bpd) of crude oil to India so far this month, sharply higher than 283,000 bpd in April. The South American country had supplied no crude to India during the previous nine months. The jump comes at a time when India is reshuffling its crude oil sourcing strategy due to the ongoing West Asia conflict, disruptions around the Strait of Hormuz and changing global supply dynamics. Only Russia and the United Arab Emirates supplied more crude oil to India than Venezuela in May. The main reason behind the surge is price. Venezuelan crude is currently cheaper than many other global oil grades, making it attractive for Indian refiners dealing with elevated crude



prices and geopolitical uncertainty. "Indian buyers have historically shown strong interest in Venezuelan barrels due to their attractive economics and compatibility with complex refining systems," said Nikhil Dubey, Lead Analyst Refining at Kpler. Indian refiners, especially Reliance Industries, are among the biggest buyers because Venezuela's heavy and high-sulphur crude suits complex refinery systems such as Reliance's Jamnagar refinery in Gujarat. Most Indian refiners can process Venezuelan crude only in limited quantities, but Reliance's advanced refining infrastructure makes it one of the biggest beneficiaries. system, as it provides a "more democratic collaborative and inclusive process for appointing election commissioners, in line with the spirits of Article 324 (2) of the Constitution.

7 day police custody for Samarth in Twisha Sharma Dowry Death Case

Bhopal : A Bhopal Court on Saturday sent Twisha Sharma's husband Samarth Singh in case of dowry demand, to seven-day police custody. Samarth Singh withdrew his anticipatory bail plea from the Madhya Pradesh High Court on Friday (May 22). Samarth Singh was produced before Judicial Magistrate First Class Anudita Gupta in Bhopal who remanded him to 7-day police custody. Twisha Sharma was found dead at her matrimonial home in Bhopal on May 12. An FIR has been lodged under BNS Sections 80(2) (dowry death), 85 (cruelty) and 3(5) (common intention)



and Sections 3 (giving or taking dowry) and 4 (demanding dowry) of the Dowry Prohibition Act. The high court had on Friday issued notice on Twisha's father's plea challenging the anticipatory bail granted to the mother-in-law; the court also issued notice on the State's plea challenging the same. The high court had also directed a second post-mortem of the deceased's body to be conducted by a team of doctors from AIIMS Delhi in Bhopal.

EDITORIAL -

Green Energy, Clean Energy

In a bold move that could reshape India's renewable energy landscape, aims to leverage the state's natural advantages while aligning with national and global climate objectives. Transformative push into renewable energy marks a pivotal shift in India's energy landscape, positioning the coastal state as a potential global leader in clean energy production and storage. As the world grapples with climate change and nations race to meet ambitious decarbonisation targets, the state's strategic investments in diverse renewable technologies demonstrate a comprehensive approach to energy transition. As Greenko's MD, Anil Kumar Chalamalasetty notes, the industry has evolved beyond traditional wind and solar to embrace innovations like green hydrogen, opening up opportunities in the 10 trillion dollar global decarbonisation market driven by carbon taxation. NTPC Green Energy has formed a strategic partnership with NREDCAP, committing Rs 2,00,000 crore to develop an impressive portfolio of 25 GW solar/wind projects, 10 GW pumped storage projects, and 0.5 MMTPA green hydrogen production. This initiative is expected to generate 100,000 jobs across the state, fostering economic growth while advancing environmental goals. Meanwhile, Reliance Industries is investing Rs 65,000 crore in an ambitious biogas initiative, planning 500 advanced plants over

4-5 years. The unprecedented shift we are experiencing with the democratization of technology, climate change, and geopolitical trends has created an unprecedented demand for energy globally, which till now only OPEC countries could fulfill. "Out of the 13 trillion dollar energy demand globally, India's is at about 300 billion, and out of this, close to 120-130 billion worth raw material is imported", says Anil. The state's existing infrastructure, particularly its port network and city gas distribution (CGD) lines, positions it uniquely for green hydrogen bending and renewable energy generation. PMS Prasad, ED, RIL, announcing their investment in November 2024, had said, "It (the investment of Rs 65,000 crore for 500 advanced biogas plants) would not be possible without the pro progressive clean energy policy by the AP government and uicance of CM Nara Chandrababu Naidu". These investments are transforming State into a model for sustainable development, creating a blueprint for other states to follow. The projects not only address India's growing energy needs but also position the state as a potential exporter of clean energy solutions, marking a significant step toward India's energy independence and climate commitments. Unlike conventional state-level energy policies that often address renewable sources in isolation,

the ICE Policy orchestrates a symphony of clean energy initiatives, each complementing the other in a carefully choreographed dance of sustainable development. The policy's ambitious scope becomes evident in its treatment of solar and wind energy. With targets of 78.50 GWp for solar and 35 GW for wind energy, these aren't mere numbers on paper, but carefully calculated figures based on the state's natural endowments. The coastal state's 974-kilometre shoreline, blessed with consistent wind patterns, provides a natural advantage for wind energy development, while its abundant solar irradiance offers perfect conditions for photovoltaic deployment. This emphasis on storage addresses the fundamental challenge that has long plagued renewable energy deployment - intermittency. By incorporating storage at such a scale, The State is not merely generating clean energy, tsk ensuring its availability round the clock, transforming variable renewable energy into a reliable baseload power source. The state's natural advantages come into play here as well, with abundant deposits of high-grade quartz and silica sand providing raw materials for solar manufacturing. This integration of resource availability with manufacturing capability creates a self-sustaining ecosystem that could significantly reduce costs while enhancing energy security.

SIR at door-to-door of voters to begin in SAS Nagar district from June 25

MOHALI : The district administration has initiated comprehensive preparations following the ECI's notification for the statewide revision across Punjab. Komal Mittal, District Election Officer-cum-Deputy Commissioner announced that the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Sahibzada Ajit Singh Nagar district would be conducted in a completely transparent, systematic and time-bound manner, following the directives of the Election Commission of India (ECI). Under the SIR drive, Booth Level Officers (BLOs) will conduct

door-to-door visits from June 25 to July 24 to distribute and collect voter forms. To ensure the exercise runs smoothly, the administration has deployed 838 BLOs, 83 Supervisors, 3 Electoral Registration Officers (EROs), and six Assistant Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs). Mandatory training for field staff will take place from June 15 to June 24. "The primary objective of the SIR is to ensure the inclusion of every eligible citizen in the electoral roll, while

simultaneously removing ineligible entries to maintain absolute accuracy and integrity," Mittal stated. January 1, 2003, has been fixed as the qualifying date for the SIR. Mittal further stated that the rationalisation of polling stations would be completed by July 24, while the draft electoral rolls would be published on July 31. Claims and objections regarding the draft voter lists may be submitted from July 31 to August and their disposal would be carried out between July 31 and September 28. The final publication of the electoral rolls had been scheduled for October 1.

CH01DE series auction starts special registration today

Chandigarh Excise deptt envisages revenue to go beyond Rs 1000 crore

CHANDIGARH : Out of 97 retail liquor vends, 96 have been allotted for the year 2026-27 for Rs 560.85 crore against the reserve price of Rs 450 crore. The department stated that several reformative measures were introduced in the Excise Policy 2026-27, including auto-renewal of labels, maintenance of real-time stock inventory by licensees, reintroduction of liquor licences at departmental stores and transportation of liquor through GPS-enabled vehicles for ensuring better transparency, monitoring, and regulatory compliance. The UT Excise and Taxation Department is likely to achieve excise revenue collection of approximately Rs 1,009 crore against the target of Rs 1,000 crore during the fiscal 2026-27. The information was provided by the department during a review meeting held under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary H Rajesh Prasad. During the Excise Policy Year 2025-26, the department had collected Rs 965.71 crore as revenue. The Chief Secretary directed the officers to further strengthen enforcement activities and

maintain strict vigil over all excise licensees. Directions were also issued to initiate breach proceedings against licensees found violating the provisions of the Excise Policy and relevant rules. Emphasis was laid on effectively checking the illegal movement and sale of liquor, and ensuring that all necessary preventive and punitive measures are taken to curb illicit trade. The meeting was attended by Diprava Lakra, Secretary (Excise & Taxation); Nishant Kumar Yadav, Excise & Taxation Commissioner; Pradhuman Singh, Additional Excise & Taxation Commissioner-cum-Deputy Excise & Taxation Collector (Excise) and Excise & Taxation Officer (Excise).

Chd calls for Rs 10,000 penalty for urinating, defecating in open

CHANDIGARH : The Municipal Corporation (MC) has amended the Solid Waste Management (SWM) Bylaws, 2018, in compliance with the Swachh Survekshan-2025 guidelines issued by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs. Urinating or defecating in the open will now attract a fine of Rs 10,000. Mr Amit Kumar, MC Commissioner exhorted people to use public/community toilets in order to keep Chandigarh clean and

maintain its "City Beautiful" status. To ensure the highest standards of public health and sanitation, open defecation and open urination were now categorised as offences under "Littering" (Clause 4(49)) and the offender was liable to pay a fine of Rs 10,000, said an MC official.

Automated testing station to replace manual checking of commercial vehicles in Chandigarh

CHANDIGARH : An automated testing station (ATS) is coming up at Raipur Kalan and the work is in an advanced stage. Manual testing of commercial vehicles will soon be a thing of the past. Machines are being installed and the station is likely to be made operational by August. Commercial vehicle fitness tests will be conducted with the use of sensor-based systems to ensure transparent, accurate and standardised testing. Nearly 30,000 commercial vehicles have been registered in the city. After eight years, the mandatory

fitness certificate is required every year for the renewal of vehicle registration certificate. At present, vehicles are manually inspected at Manimajra. To enhance road safety and reduce pollution, various parameters such as brake efficiency, suspension, steering alignment and emission levels will be evaluated at the testing station. The officials stated that the automated station would help check corruption, human error and manual manipulation.

Lion Company out, protection of 900 sanitation workers job assured by UT Mayor

Saurabh Joshi, the incumbent Mayor of Chandigarh, on Monday assured a delegation of sanitation workers engaged by M/s Lion Services Ltd, providing sanitation services in the southern sectors of Chandigarh, that their jobs will be protected. The company had been providing sanitation services in Sectors 31 to 50, 61 and 63 for many years. During the interaction, the workers informed the mayor that the termination of the extension had left hundreds of workers uncertain about their future and livelihood. Expressing concern, Joshi



patiently heard their grievances and assured them that the Municipal Corporation (MC) Chandigarh stands firmly with every worker and would make all possible efforts to protect their interests. 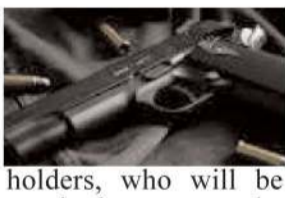

The move is being seen as a way to regulate information about the use of weapons. It will also help in monitoring licenced firearms, curb illegal use, and prevent celebratory gunfire. Assistant

Commissioner of Police Vikram Nehra said, "A record of all such reports will now be maintained. If a licence holder neglects to provide information or their response is found to be unsatisfactory, it could impact the renewal of their weapon licence." Police deptt have appealed to all licence holders to follow the rules and provide correct information about the use of weapons to the concerned department on time.

Nirmala Sitharaman deplors cynical and pessimistic narrative of critics against Modi's austerity call

MUMBAI : Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Monday defended Prime Minister Narendra Modi's austerity call, stressing the need to focus on the "3Fs" -- fuel, fertiliser and forex -- amid the West Asia crisis. At the 37th foundation day event of the Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) here, she also hit out against naysayers who have built a cynical and pessimistic narrative after the Prime Minister's appeal for austerity, she said, stressing that such observations are factually incorrect. "The narrative is wrong because it is fear-mongering. India cannot afford fear-mongering. We need to give confidence to the people with our words and with our actions," she said. Fuel prices are high, gold prices



have climbed to elevated levels, creating concerns on the external front, and there is an "unimaginable increase" in the fertiliser prices, she said, contextualising the call made by the Prime Minister. There is a need to look at conserving the forex, she said, adding that there is a need to focus on the 3Fs of fuel, fertilisers and forex in the current context. Stating that India's policy response has been calibrated to preserve domestic growth, Sitharaman said the cut in diesel and petrol excise duties will lead to a revenue impact of Rs 1 lakh crore. Some "naysayers" have jumped into the debate following the Prime Minister's appeal, claiming that everything is "crumbling", which is factually incorrect, she said, listing out a slew of indicators showing buoyancy in the economy, including GST collections and

automobile sales. "All the good that is being done by the common people themselves is forgotten. And a pessimistic, cynical narrative is generated, which is just not right," she said. "We should appreciate that the challenges are more externally driven. We must also recognise that India's domestic economic situation remains positive and resilient even today," the finance minister said. She also highlighted that the issue of Rs 8.1 lakh crore locked in delayed payments for MSMEs is impacting their working capital and growth, and urged public sector undertakings not to exceed the 45-day window to make payments to them. Meanwhile, Sitharaman also asked lenders to relook at the design of loans to tailor-make products, where repayments happen when an entity gets its revenues. "My message to Sidbi and every banker here is that standard products cannot serve non-standard businesses," she said, citing examples of how the income generations of businesses vary across multiple activities.

Shivraj Chouhan announces collective decision of agriculture ministry not to buy gold for 1 year

NEW DELHI : Union minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Monday announced that officials of the agriculture and rural development ministries headed by him have collectively decided not to purchase gold for the next one year. Shivraj Singh Chouhan made the announcement in line with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's recent appeal to citizens for judicious use of resources to strengthen the Indian economy, and shield people from the adverse impact of the West Asia conflict. "Officials of the agriculture and rural development and related departments have collectively decided not to purchase gold for the next one year. Official tours and visits will be limited and regulated according to necessity. Physical visits will be undertaken only for essential work, while other activities will be conducted through video conferencing and



virtual platforms," the minister said. Chouhan said a nationwide "Save Farms Campaign" will be conducted for 15 days starting from June 1, aimed at creating awareness among farmers about balanced and necessary use of fertilisers. He said upcoming regional conferences related to the agriculture sector will be organised through virtual platforms to promote technology-based effective communication and coordination. The Union minister said a rotation-based "work from home" system will be implemented for 20 per cent of employees. "A decision has been taken to regulate and limit electricity consumption in offices. A

carpooling system will be adopted one day of every week for saving fuel and ensure better utilisation of resources," he said. He said the initiative will be extended up to the Director level, alongside a targeted reduction in the usage of approximately one-third of the vehicles within the Ministry, with the aim of curtailing expenses related to fuel, vehicle maintenance, driver arrangements, and other associated costs. The Ministry of Agriculture also emphasised on reducing unnecessary consumption of edible oils to decrease import dependence and encourage a healthier lifestyle. It has been decided to launch a special public awareness campaign to promote the balanced and healthy consumption of edible oils. This initiative aims to curb excessive consumption, foster positive health outcomes, and bolster the national objective of reducing the country's dependence on imported edible oils.

Pilgrims advised to check registration process as Amarnath Yatra 2026 slated to begin from July 3

to "renew" the Quad engagement, Mr. Rubio said, crediting Mr. Modi and U.S. President Donald Trump as drivers of the India-U.S. engagement. The two leaders are expected to meet in June when they travel to Evian in France for the G-7 summit, where India is one the countries invited to an outreach summit. In addition, Mr. Modi, who has visited the Trump White House once already in February 2025, is expected to travel to the U.S. for the G-20 summit in Mar-a-Lago in December this year.

BJP's commitment to make Thiruvananthapuram 2036 Olympics venue generate political uproar

Thiruvananthapuram : BJP Kerala unit urge it would request the Centre to include the city as one of the venues for the 2036 Games. In its manifesto for the Thiruvananthapuram Corporation election. BJP's local body election manifesto promise to develop the state capital into a co-host city for the 2036 Olympics triggered a political row, with leaders of both LDF and UDF on Monday calling it a fake claim. The International Olympic Committee is yet to announce the host for the 2036 edition of the world's biggest sporting event. However, there have been reports that India is bidding for the Games with Ahmedabad as its proposed main host city. Kerala Education Minister V Sivankutty accused BJP of deceiving the people of Thiruvananthapuram. "When the Union Government has bid for the



Olympics in Gujarat, how can BJP here claim that Thiruvananthapuram will be a venue?" He further said as part of the bidding process, BJP is planning for the 2030 Commonwealth Games in Ahmedabad, he claimed. He asked whether BJP state president Rajeev Chandrasekhar considered the people of Thiruvananthapuram "fools". "The proposal submitted to the Olympic body has no mention of Thiruvananthapuram. This is a trick because BJP has nothing to say about development," he said. Senior Congress leader K Muraliedharan also hit out at BJP on its election manifesto,

saying that, fearing defeat, the party had begun making "fake promises". "They know they would not even become the main opposition party this time. Hence, such claims," he said. State Revenue Minister K Rajan echoed a similar view, stating that the host for the 2036 Olympics had yet to be announced, but BJP claimed the event would be held in Thiruvananthapuram. Reacting to the criticism, Chandrasekhar said that other political parties would realise the proposal later. "They do not understand how it will happen. We will teach them after we get the opportunity to govern," he said. BJP is currently the main opposition in the CPI(M)-Governed Thiruvananthapuram Corporation. The local body election in the state will be held in two phases on December 9 and 11.

2000 km under sea gas pipeline at cost of Rs 40,000 Cr to diffuse fuel tension

MUSCAT : A spectacular 2,000-kilometer undersea pipeline would facilitate gas supply from Oman to Gujarat. The war between Iran and America-Israel in the Middle East has erupted crisis and tension in the world. The Strait of Hormuz through which 20 to 25 percent of the world's crude oil and gas trade takes place has witnessed disruptions in the smooth flow of gaseous fuel as



the route at present stands blocked. India imports 40 to 50 percent of its crude oil and about 80 percent of LPG through this route. But since the start of the conflict and the blockade, the import of oil and gas has been affected. In view

of this crisis. Under the proposed mega plan, This means that gas from the Gulf will flow directly to Gujarat, India, via the under sea route. The closure of the route has disrupted not only gas and oil but also food imports and exports. With energy security emerging as a key priority, the government is refocusing its attention on the proposed project connecting Oman with India.

As part of proposed peace deal Iran ready to surrender enriched uranium to US

Tehran : Iran has agreed to give up its stockpile of highly enriched uranium as part of a broader peace agreement being negotiated with the United States to end the ongoing West Asia conflict, two US officials. The development came after US President Donald Trump announced that Washington and Tehran were close to finalising a deal aimed at ending hostilities and reopening the Strait of Hormuz. While Trump did not disclose the specifics of the proposed arrangement, US officials told the newspaper that Tehran had agreed in principle to relinquish its stockpile of near-weapons-grade uranium. The officials, however, said the understanding remains broad at this stage, with the exact mechanism for disposing of the uranium yet to be negotiated. Detailed discussions on how Iran would transfer, dilute, or otherwise neutralise the material are expected to take place in a later round of nuclear talks once the broader agreement is



formally reached. According to the International Atomic Energy Agency, Iran currently possesses nearly 400 kilograms of uranium enriched to 60 per cent purity, a level close to weapons-grade. Israeli officials have repeatedly argued that the stockpile could potentially be refined further to produce material for multiple nuclear bombs. Washington has insisted that Tehran must make at least a preliminary commitment in the initial agreement, warning that failure to do so could lead to the collapse of talks and a resumption of military operations.

India to host 18th BRICS summit in Sept 2026 at New Delhi

ident of Rs 17 lakh.

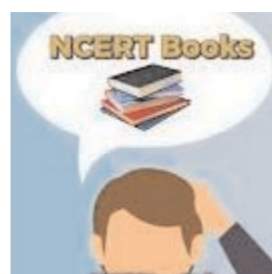

"They are a great ally, a great partner. We do a lot of good work with them. And so it is an important trip. I'm glad we're able to do it because I think there'll be a lot for us to talk about," Rubio said. "We'll also meet with Quad there, which is important. I think my first meeting as Secretary of State was with the Quad. I'm glad we are able to do it now in India and we're going to do one later in the year as well," Rubio said.

Rubio also said that acting Venezuelan President Delcy Rodríguez is expected to visit India next week.
