Lebanese militia group 'Hezbollah' not to attack Israel : Trump

WASHINGTON/JERUS ALEM/BEIRUT : Iran aligned Lebanese militia group Hezbollah through intermediaries announced a pledge that it would not undertake any assault, attack Israel over. Hezbollah had informed the US through Lebanon's parliament speaker Nabin Berri that it was willing to halt attacks over on northern Israel in exchange for Israel sparing Beirut and its suburbs any strikes.

diplomatic efforts to end the 3 month old Iran war are continuing, said Tasnim in Iran. President Donald Trump said yesterday he had persuaded Israel and Hezbollah to de-escalate, talked with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu agreeing not to send troops to southern Beirut and the Lebanese militant group promising to stop attacks. Over Israel's Lebanon strikes, Iran has suspended talks with US. Iran and the Resistance Front which includes its Shiite allies in Yemen, Lebanon and Iraq, have set an agenda to com-



pletely block the Strait of Hormuz and activate other fronts including the Bab El Mandeb Strait, in order to punish Israel and its supporters. Hezbollah had accepted a US proposal for a mutual cessation of attacks, after

Israel threatened more strikes on south Beirut on the eve of a fourth round of Ismael Lebanon negotiations. The Lebanese authorities received confirmation of Hezbollah's acceptance of US proposal providing

for a mutual cessation of attacks, said Joseph Aoun' Lebanese President. There will be no troops going to Beirut and if there is any troop on their way, have already returned. German, Norwegian min-

isters in Abortive trip were pointed out. Reem Alabali Radovan, German Minister for international development and Norwegian Counterpart Asmund Aukrust had to abort and head back to Berlin " for military reasons" as they approached Beirut airport owing to "a rapidly worsening situation." a spokesman for Alabali Radovan revealed. The ministers had hoped to make the visit to show solidarity with the Lebanese people, but their German military aircraft finally had to land in Cyprus ahead of a return to Berlin, reported

Norwegian daily. Tehran spokesman hinted : Ceasefire in Lebanon remains a key condition for any deal with the United States to end the Middle East war, said Esmail Baqaei of the Iranian foreign ministry . "We insist that a ceasefire in Lebanon is an essential condition for any deal aimed at ending the war," Esmail Baqaei said at a weekly press briefing, as Israel expands its offensive in Lebanon. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has vowed to push deeper into Lebanon, while the UN Security Council is set to hold an emergency

meeting on Monday after Israel's military took control of the medieval Beaufort castle. Baqaei said Iran "will take all measures to support Lebanon and the resistance against the Zionist regime's illegal aggression". His remarks come as Tehran and Washington continue exchanging messages in an effort to finalise a framework agreement aimed at ending the war, which erupted with US-Israeli strikes on Iran in late February and subsequently engulfed the region.

Wide alternate airport road opens partially

Mohali : Wide 8.5 km alternate road to Chandigarh International Airport running parallel to the existing Air Port road, originating from Bawa White House in phase 11 was opened by GMADA on Sunday. Completion of the project now hinges on the second bridge over a seasonal rivulet.



"The ongoing work on bridge will be ready roughly within, 10 days, and then dual carriage-way will become fully operational. One side,

however, was opened after necessary trials," said Ajay Garg, Chief Engineer, GMADA. On completion, the road is expected to significantly decongest the existing Airport Road. The alternate road will reduce travel time to the airport and improve overall traffic flow and safety on the corridor.

'Charisma of camaraderie' in a hamlet

Zirakpur : The spirit of camaraderie remains in the veins as long as the reciprocal ally remains warm with one's affection. Tez with his warmth in nineteen sixties, the adolescent boy, real Teza Singh generated his warmth toward his dependently associate and fondling partner Sham. Enroute to our farms, once we faced a person accompanying funeral procession who closely, reliably asked us and a few other "Ye lautenge kab tak, ye kahan ja rahen hai. Janaaje ko wo samne hamare, rukwa kar bola" Sham Lal asked Teza Singh and Teza asked Sham," over this incomprehensible narration. "Are bhai, kaun jaane ke baad, wapas aata hai, yahin apne karam, yaaden chhod jata hai, specific seven, eight decades hi hoten hain jeene ke liye, kar lo nobility, elephantine deeds " came inspiring analogue of philosophy As a trailblazer, Tez executed chores perhaps with more alacrity which was not easily flourishable during sixties where prints of British ruthlessness, dried, having milked India's economy, deserted consonance, legacy characterized the facade of pervasive downtroddenness and slackening pace of development . Sham recalls afresh his care-free days in the horizon of Thuha hamlet where love



used to breathe dense innocence, jubilating contentment and playful rhymes. Contemporary winds used to buzz louder than other merry voices and noises where abundance of life over matched the fairy tales. Teza used to reminisce away from hamlet, the piercing warmth of bonds, close knit relation with Sham which stemmed and evolved in the interior of the village environs. The folk friends along Sham Lal used to rejoice merry makings and folk laughter , had truly strengthened our structural love and wide trust . The life comprising components were our innocent chores, innocent times, innocent air, innocent cattle and innocent entity filled with spontaneity that moved Sham Lal , the promising tall man in my life ,who used to exalt his jingoistic airman of Indian Air Force at distinct distance of thousands miles from my home turf. Postal messages from "Thuha" and back used to remove our consternation and Teza often used to eulogise Sham for his rich humble messages. The comrade on other end regularly used to

despatch the contemporary proceeds of the hamlet 's developments . Teza used to encounter the fusillades of home sick and concentrate on routine defence duties and used to apprise through inland letters from the barriers of several states to his distant and departed friend . On completion of specific authorised leave period, the airman as expectedly used to leave the home turf timely. Once during 1982s, the only conveyance from our village was traced singular rickshaw whose rider had gone feverish with unexpected drugs. Highly accountable and disciplined job, Teza, had to abide by protocols imposed on him, never he could have compromised execution . As seemed no readymade alternate available, Sham's heart rocked and with orchestrated mind , he thought to fast paddle the available machine and reach the railway station at 9 km away to enable the airman's baggage safe and sound reached which gladdened the duo to witness their proven love at greater heights.

He adds saying this pure cow ghee is preferred by those who prioritise natural and organic options. During 2024, the claim of high purity was made in August 2025, sample BKD 2458 was taken for purity test and won clientele applause and wide acceptance . For the quality emergence conventional ayurvedic Bolana procedure is adopted by the dairy engineers. Cow pure milk is manufactured from white but-



ter/curd. The quantum of cow milk is put on mild flame specific span of time until it got melted for ghee . It is widely claimed that cow milk is scared substance, often used in religious rituals besides Aurvedic treatments .

Cow ghee must be used before 9 months from date . Milk fat is inherently expensive . Its current exdairy price of Rs 460, -- 470 / is way above Rs 125 -- 130, wholesale range for refined palmolien , soyabean or sunflower.

Centre govt notifies elevation of five judges to Supreme Court

New Delhi : An elevation of 4 sitting judges and one senior practising judge to Supreme Court has been made by the Centre govt with publishing a notification on Monday. The recommendation was made at the Supreme Court Collegium meetings held on May 22 and 27. The names approved for appointment are : Justice Sheel Nagu, presently Chief Justice of the Punjab and Haryana High Court; Justice Shree Chandrashekhar, Chief Justice of the Bombay High Court; Justice Sanjeev Sachdeva, Chief Justice of the Madhya Pradesh High

Court; Justice Arun Palli, Chief Justice of the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh; and Senior Advocate V. Mohana. Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal announced the appointments in a social media post this morning. The appointment of Sr Adv V Mohana will add to the women's representation in the Supreme Court. The Court presently has only one woman judge, Justice BV Nagarathna. After August 2021, no woman has been appointed to the Supreme Court. Recently, the strength of the Supreme Court was increased to 38 judges including the CJI.

Bitumen scarcity halts road construction work on linking Chandigarh road

P'KULA : The construction work has virtually halted due to crunch in bitumen supply, said NK Payal , Haryana Shehri Vikas Pradhikaran (HSVP) executive engineer. He added that even the quantity was little marginally raised that was beyond our reach ,was very costly. Global supply of crude oil from West Asia has triggered discontentment and incapacibilities among the entrepreneurs .The war has caused global crude oil cri-



sis. The stalled road construction from IT park - Dolphin Chowk to Sukhna Lake (Regulatory end), measuring less than 1 km is left incomplete.

The HSVP should put up boards guiding commuters that the road remains still under construction . On completion of this stalled road will improve connectivity between the two towns but sectors 2,3 and 4 on this stretch wii also see significant development with number of projects planned here. Independent houses, group housing societies, shopping complexes,parks and such projects are planned to be built here.

School based menstrual health education launched in Punjab

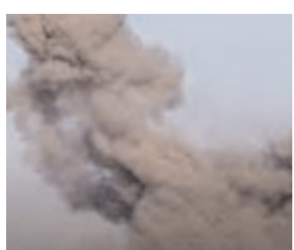

EDITORIAL -

Special Intensive Revision of electoral roll remains Constitutional and Supreme

For decades, SC treated voting as a mere statutory right, giving Parliament and EC wide discretion over its content and conditions.

But this elevation is immediately drained of consequence. The court holds that compliances, such as documentary verification, do not by themselves, infringe the right to vote. The relevant question, so the court says, is only whether compliances are so onerous that they negate the right altogether. This is the same deferential standard that a statutory right would attract.

On a positive note, this is the first time that SC, in a majority opinion bearing directly on the franchise of individual voters in direct elections, has recognised the right to vote as a "constitutional right", not merely a statutory one. This is a welcome departure from the orthodox position.

A constitutional right, on the other hand, should do much more. It should impose a positive duty on EC to ensure inclusion, and shift the burden of justifying exclusion onto it. It should recognise that the right to vote is impaired not only when it is abolished, but also when citizens are made to navigate burdensome or uncertain procedures to retain it. The judgment does none of this.

SC deploys another constitutional principle - free and fair elections as the primary justification for SIR. In Bihar, approximately 47L voters were excluded from the final roll. EC justified this in the name of electoral integrity. SC accepted this argument, relying

on EC's "institutional expertise". There is, of course, no dispute that clean electoral rolls are essential to electoral legitimacy. But when integrity of the roll is treated as a value that can override rights of individual voters, "free and fair elections" is invoked not to safeguard the franchise, but to justify its curtailment.

The Constitution gives EC enormous powers under Article 324. Over the years, SC has read this provision very liberally, treating C as the institutional guarantor of free and fair elections. ut empowering the Juarantor of elections not the same as protecting the rights of a lot of power b has but no responsibility to protect a wter, is akin to a gatekeeper whose only job is to keep people out.

On the legal architecture of SIR, SC effectively gives EC a blank cheque. It is free to conduct sweeping, state-wide re-verification exercises whenever it considers necessary, with broad procedural discretion, and only the softest judicial constraints. While SC repeatedly acknowledges the importance of safeguards, all it asks is whether some safeguards exist on paper, and not whether they are robust enough to protect the franchise.

SC holds that while EC may conduct a limited inquiry into citizenship for electoral purposes, it cannot finally determine who is or is not a citizen. Exclusion from the roll just means inability to vote, not loss of citizenship. If a person's name has been deleted from the 2003 roll because EC thinks they are not a valid citizen, it must refer the matter to the

competent authority under the Citizenship Act, 1955, which should decide the issue before the next election. 5 This prevents SIR from becoming a backdoor citizenship determination exercise. Whether this will work in practice remains to be seen.

The stark difficulty is that the judgement departs from the historical logic of Indian democracy. The story of universal adult franchise in India is one of inclusion. The franchise expanded from 3% under Government of India Act, 1919 to 20% under the 1935 Act, and then to universal adult suffrage under the Constitution. The preliminary electoral rolls for the first general elections were prepared under the draft Constitution even before any statute existed, because the framers regarded the franchise as a constitutional necessity that could not wait for ordinary legislation.

The places the burden on the citizen to prove their place in the electorate, rather than on the state to justify their removal. It privileges the EC's constitutional power while giving short shrift to the individual voter's constitutional right. SC reached the right conclusion on the status of the right to vote. But a constitutional right that imposes no duty on the state, shifts no burden onto EC, and melts away the moment "free and fair elections" is invoked, is of limited use to millions of voters, who may find themselves on the wrong side of the next revision exercise.

328 more electric buses to be inducted under Central scheme from October

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Sanctioned under the PM e-Bus Sewa Scheme from October this year. The UT Administration would most probably start getting 328 electric buses in transition to environmentally friendly transportation.



sanctioned electric buses for Depot-IV, 60 electric buses have already been inducted and are operational, while the remaining 40 buses are scheduled to be added by June, said officials. The CTU is at present operating a fleet of 140 electric buses on Tricity routes. The delivery of 328 additional electric buses sanctioned under the PM e-Bus Sewa Scheme is expected to commence in October

this year, as the ministry has floated tender for procurement of the buses.

Officials stated the UT Administration planned to replace all diesel buses with electric buses by the end of 2027-28 to promote eco-friendly, sustainable and green public transport in the city. For the first lot of 100 electric buses, the UT Administration has signed an agreement at the lowest amount of Rs 61.80 per km with the operator. Under the hiring model procurement, maintenance and operation will be looked after by the operator, while the revenue will be collected by the department.

CM to address residents' water, power grievances in Morni on June 3

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : During the public meeting at Morni, Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini will listen to the grievances and concerns of local residents and issue necessary directions to the concerned officials on the spot.



CM will hold a public hearing at the Government Polytechnic College on June 3. Residents of Morni area have been facing acute drinking water shortage during summers. The power supply in the area is also erratic. Many villages have accessibility issues, with residents demanding a steel bridge for better connectivity during monsoons. Deputy Commissioner Satpal Sharma said that in addition to the public

hearing, the Chief Minister would also interact with farmers and members of Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) to promote natural and organic farming. The Haryana Government is actively encouraging the large-scale adoption of natural and organic farming practices to enhance farmers' incomes, reduce cultivation cost, and preserve soil health. The Deputy Commissioner further said that necessary instructions had been issued to ensure the event is conducted in a smooth and successful manner.

Courts to observe summer vacation in Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh from June 1 to 30

Commissioner News Service CHD/LUDHIANA : From June 16 to June 30, regular hearings in criminal matters will remain suspended and courts will remain closed, except for urgent cases, said Sessions Judge Harpreet Kaur Randhawa.



Due to the summer vacation, the regular functioning of Sessions Courts and subordinate courts across Punjab, Haryana and Chandigarh will remain suspended from June 1 to June 30. She added that duty rosters of judicial officers have been prepared to ensure the hearing of urgent matters, including bail applications, stay petitions and other emergency cases, during the vacation period. A detailed roster has also

been issued, under which designated judges will hear urgent matters on specified dates to ensure that litigants do not face inconvenience during the court vacation. Meanwhile, District Attorney Dinesh Kumar Verma said the Prosecution Department has deputed government counsels to represent the State before the vacation courts during the holiday period, ensuring the smooth handling of urgent government-related matters.

Chandigarh Excise deptt envisages revenue to go beyond Rs 1000 crore

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Out of 97 retail liquor vends, 96 have been allotted for the year 2026-27 for Rs 560.85 crore against the reserve price of Rs 450 crore. The department stated that several reformative measures were introduced in the Excise Policy 2026-27, including auto-renewal of labels, maintenance of real-time stock inventory by licensees, reintroduction of liquor licences at departmental stores and transportation of liquor through GPS-enabled vehicles for ensuring better transparency, monitoring, and regulatory compliance.



The UT Excise and Taxation Department is likely to achieve excise revenue collection of approximately Rs 1,009 crore against the target of Rs 1,000 crore during the fiscal 2026-27. The information was provided by the department during a review meeting held under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary H Rajesh Prasad. During the Excise Policy Year 2025-26, the department had collected Rs 965.71 crore as revenue. The Chief Secretary directed the officers to further strengthen enforcement activities and

maintain strict vigil over all excise licensees. Directions were also issued to initiate breach proceedings against licensees found violating the provisions of the Excise Policy and relevant rules. Emphasis was laid on effectively checking the illegal movement and sale of liquor, and ensuring that all necessary preventive and punitive measures are taken to curb illicit trade. The meeting was attended by Diprava Lakra, Secretary (Excise & Taxation); Nishant Kumar Yadav, Excise & Taxation Commissioner; Pradhuman Singh, Additional Excise & Taxation Commissioner-cum-Deputy Excise & Taxation Collector (Excise) and Excise & Taxation Officer (Excise).

Chd calls for Rs 10,000 penalty for urinating, defecating in open

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The Municipal Corporation (MC) has amended the Solid Waste Management (SWM) Bylaws, 2018, in compliance with the Swachh Survekshan-2025 guidelines issued by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs. Urinating or defecating in the open will now attract a fine of Rs 10,000. Mr Amit Kumar, MC Commissioner exhorted people to use public/community toilets in order to keep Chandigarh clean and



maintain its "City Beautiful" status. To ensure the highest standards of public health and sanitation, open defecation and open urination were now categorised as offences under "Littering" (Clause 4(49)) and the offender was liable to pay a fine of Rs 10,000, said an MC official.

Family ID portal introduce to address grievances related to electricity

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : A new facility on the Family ID (Parivar Pehchan Patra - PPP) portal, toward improving governance and citizen convenience, has been introduced allowing residents to register grievances related to incorrect or mismatched electricity connection details.



The above mentioned initiative aims to address a long-standing issue where electricity connections recorded in the Family ID database often do not align with official records maintained by UHBVN (Uttar Haryana Bijli Vitran Nigam) and DHBVN (Dakshin Haryana Bijli Vitran Nigam). This discrepancy has, in many cases, created hurdles for citizens in accessing government services and welfare schemes.

Dr Satish Khola, PPP state coordinator said mismatch between Family ID data and electricity department records have been a recurring concern. Incorrect mapping can lead to errors in beneficiary identification and delays in service delivery. "To resolve these issues, the government has now rolled out a streamlined grievance redressal mechanism directly on the Family ID Portal. The move reflects a broader

push toward digital governance, accuracy of public records and ease of access for citizens," he said. Under the new system, citizens can log in to the Family ID Portal and submit a grievance regarding their electricity connection details by accessing the newly added electricity connection correction option.

To initiate the request applicants are required to provide the correct electricity connection number followed by uploading supporting documents to validate their claim. Once submitted, the system automatically compares the information provided by the applicant with the data maintained by the respective power utilities (UHBVN or DHBVN).

Division of industrial plots in Master Plan-2031 proposed by Chd Admn

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : An addendum to the proposed amendments concerning the fragmentation of industrial plots in Industrial Area Phase-I and II has been issued as part of the ongoing deregulation exercise aimed at promoting optimum use of industrial land.



The UT Administration has recommended the fragmentation of industrial plots in the proposed amendments to the Chandigarh Master Plan-2031. The addendum, approved by the Administrator, is to be read in continuation of the proposed amendments already notified on May 22.

It has been proposed to permit the fragmentation of larger industrial plots into smaller plots, subject to approval of revised planning and zoning, and compliance with other conditions prescribed under the applicable policy. The policy governing such fragmentation shall be notified separately by the Chandigarh Administration. Detailed information regarding the proposed

amendments and the addendum is available on the official website of the Department of Urban Planning, Chandigarh Administration. Submitting suggestions, Col (retd) Gursewak Singh, president of the Residents' Welfare Association, Modern Housing Complex (MHC), Sector 13, suggested that with high density population, the area has the highest car density. "In the absence of designated parking, vehicles are often parked on roads, pedestrian paths, or in front of neighbouring houses, leading to disputes and conflicts," he said.

Weapon licence holders in Haryana to report use of firearms within 30 days

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : The report of weapon licence use would include when and where the weapon was used, the reason for its use, and the number of rounds fired. The disposal of spent cartridges would also be required to be submitted. If empty cartridges are not available, the reason must be stated in writing. The Haryana Home Affairs Department has issued these orders for weapon licence



holders, who will be required to report the use of their licenced weapon to the relevant licensing authority within 30 days. The move is being seen as a way to regulate information about the use of weapons. It will also help in monitoring licenced firearms, curb illegal use, and prevent celebratory gunfire. Assistant

Commissioner of Police Vikram Nehra said, "A record of all such reports will now be maintained. If a licence holder neglects to provide information or their response is found to be unsatisfactory, it could impact the renewal of their weapon licence." Police deptt have appealed to all licence holders to follow the rules and provide correct information about the use of weapons to the concerned department on time.

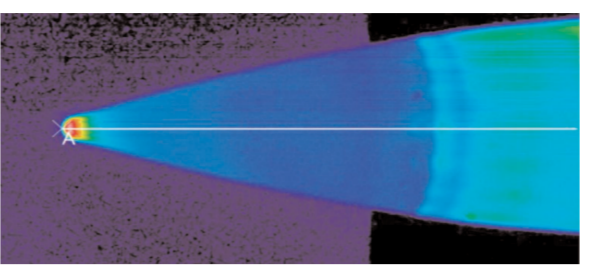
CBI receives "Smart City" "FD scam files

New Delhi : Uganda has shut border with Congo as there had been Ebalos1000 cases, escalating further. Airport screening ,traveller monitoring and quarantine measures have been strengthened following suspected Ebola cases in Bengaluru and Gujarat,though no infection has been confirmed in India. A 28 year old Ugandan woman has been quarantined in Bengaluru over suspected Ebola infection,yet infection was tested negative amid heightened concern over afresh cases in Africa . Airport Health Organisation teams



are directly connecting travellers landing from affected countries The Health officials are isolating even mildly symptomatic individuals as a precautionary measures. Samples of minor fever headache are being sent to the National Institute of Virology for testing. One patient,his two associates and a doctor who came in professional contact with him,have been placed under observation ss a precaution.

Fluoride contaminants in groundwater, a threat to public health

DeraBassi : Fluoride habitation carrying water contaminants with the fast depletion of ground water and distant access to safe drinking water has been evolving a serious concern with the ministry of Jal Shakti. As public health his been the intimate concern of Punjab Pollution Control, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, steps must be initiated to eradicate flow of untreated sewage, effluents into the ground water.

The community water purification plants need to be augmented. The control over expansion of fluorsis need to be endemic, sources revealed. The accessibility to safe drinking water has been eloping with the discharge of untreated chemicals, effluents into the ground water, and depletion not halting for a cause. The multiplying cases of cancer are not being contained duo to the surge in bacterial growth.

Pathogens like bacteria and viruses are being experienced as a very common hazard with the rural public life. Afflicted several health issues might be arthritis, infertility, hypertension, neurotoxicity and increased risk of skeletal cancer, reveals an official.

Additionally prolonged exposure can damage organs like liver, kidneys, lungs and testis. Water contamination has been posing immediate and chronic health threats, needs seriouses contemplation, medication and panacea.
