### Equity Indices

Major indices are digesting a mix of strong earnings and cautious macro commentary. U.S. indices have formed clear short-term support and resistance zones, offering identifiable order blocks for session-based strategies.

### Institutional vs. Retail Positioning

One of the core pillars of our methodology is comparing retail sentiment with institutional positioning. In many cases, retail traders crowd the wrong side of the market, creating contrarian edges.

- FX: Retail remains heavily short on EUR/USD, while institutional flows indicate accumulation, suggesting a potential rally in the short term.
- Indices: Retail sentiment is moderately bullish, but institutional money is concentrating around key order blocks, offering a guide for intraday trades.
- Crypto: Retail FOMO remains high, but institutional hedging suggests cautious entry zones and well-defined risk levels.

## Key Macro Themes This Week

- Central Bank Caution: Fed, ECB, and BoJ statements indicate stability but are watching inflation trends closely. Traders should monitor bond yields and policy rhetoric for sudden volatility spikes.
- Liquidity Events: End-of-quarter portfolio rebalancing is expected to increase short-term volatility across FX and indices.
- Geopolitical Developments: Energy markets and trade discussions continue to influence correlated markets, particularly EUR/USD and major indices.

## Trading Implications

For session-based traders like us, these macro trends suggest:

- Focus on short-term order blocks formed around key macro levels.
- Monitor retail vs. institutional sentiment divergences for high-probability setups.
- Close positions before the session ends, as liquidity events and macro headlines can trigger sharp reversals late in the day.
