

WWI results in a stalemate of trench warfare and a brutal naval blockade by the British Ordinary people at home live off next to nothing, and turn to protest against the Kaiser & his government.



1919

The Treaty of Versailles pushed Germany into a debt trap with reparations of £6.6 billion. The army reduced to 100,000 men and German territory reduced by 13%. The Weimar politicians (November Criminals) were blamed.




1923

Failure to meet reparation payments results in the Invasion of the Ruhr. President Ebert pays the workers to go on strike, then prints money to keep the strike going.

Hyperinflation results in turmoil for all!



Stresemann's actions (Rentenmark & Dawes Plan) results in a new Golden Age for Weimar, especially seen in Berlin, where cabaret becomes popular. Conservatives look on with suspicion and disapproval.



The Wall Street Crash triggers the Great
Depression. Factories close, businesses shut,
and up to 6 million Germans are out of work.
Anger sets in and they blame the Weimar
government.



The Nazi Party use a range of tactics to gain the majority votes in the Reichstag. They then use the Enabling Act to eliminate key enemies, such as the Communist Party, before introducing terror tactics.




NAZI ECONOMY

The Nazi party promises to rebuild Germany.
They invest heavily in building projects, such as autobahns and hospitals. Strength through Joy promises great leisure time. But nobody is allowed to question the Nazi policies!



RURAL LIFE

The Nazi party paint an idyllic image for farmers and those living in the countryside. They promise to keep grain prices high, and a return to traditional values. But nobody was allowed to question how this was achieved.



WOMEN IN NAZI GERMANY

During the Weimar years, women were given the freedom to go to University and seek a career. This was taken from them in 1933 and instead they were given medals for how many children they could produce.



THE YOUTH (GIRLS)

The Nazis used the German League of Maidens to teach girls to become traditional wives. They needed to produce the next generation of Aryan children... and then watch them march to war.



THE YOUTH (BOYS)

The Nazi Party appealed to young families through programs like the Hitler Youth, where boys could go camping and learn essential skills. But there's a sinister motive – training for the upcoming war!
