

## Leadership Pipeline Framework

This framework supports workforce agencies in intentionally identifying, developing, and preparing future leaders from within, reducing reliance on external hiring and improving long-term organizational stability.

- 1. Identification:** Focus on leadership potential, not just performance. Consider initiative, influence, and values alignment.

Key questions to guide identification:

- Who demonstrates initiative beyond their current role?
- Who positively influences peers and team culture?
- Who consistently aligns with mission and values?

- 2. Development:** Provide structured growth opportunities such as stretch assignments, cross-functional exposure, leadership training, and shadowing.

Effective development strategies include:

- Stretch assignments that push individuals beyond their current scope
- Cross-functional exposure to broaden perspective
- Shadowing current leaders to observe decision-making
- Targeted leadership training aligned to agency needs

- 3. Coaching & Support:** Use regular coaching conversations, competency-based feedback, mentorship, and clear expectations. Leadership growth requires guidance—not guesswork.

Support mechanisms should include:

- Regular coaching conversations focused on development
- Feedback tied to leadership competencies, not just tasks
- Intentional mentoring relationships
- Clear expectations and accountability



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**4. Readiness & Transition:** Prepare individuals before vacancies occur. Look for judgment, adaptability, and mission alignment.

Readiness indicators include:

- Demonstrates sound judgment and decision-making
- Leads others effectively through change
- Manages complexity and competing priorities
- Aligns decisions with organizational goals and mission

**Outcome:** A sustainable leadership pipeline that strengthens retention, continuity, and resilience
