Are there any combustibles stored along the escape routes					
Are all escape routes are clear of obstructions and are immediately					
available for use					
Are all fire doors free of obstruction					
Are Fire doors wedged or propped open					
Are the escape exits visible and easily opened					
Are there any warnings or faults showing on the fire detection and					
alarm panel					
Are floor coverings, rugs and mats are fixed or laid so that they do not					
present a trip or slip hazard during an evacuation, and are not used to					
prop open doors					
Are external areas at, or near, exit doors and external escape routes are					
kept free of obstructions that might impede escape to a place of safety					
Are escape routes adequately lit up by the main lighting and emergency					
lighting					
Are all fire extinguishers and other fire fighting equipment in proper					
place					
Are Staff aware of where hydrant is situated.					
ASK Are vehicles blocking fire hydrants or access to them?					
Are PEEPS Accessible to all staff					
Have residents been included in this CHECK LIST					
Are there new staff on duty today that may not be aware of the fire					
procedures.					
Is everyone feeling ok today in relation to fire safety for residents and					
themselves					
Are there any new staff /what support they do need					
Have we any fire risks today, do the staff know who to speak to					
What is working well for us as team in relation to fire safety					
What is not working so well					
Is there one thing there we can do to improve fire safety in the centre					
today.
