HB 426	John MacDonald	Title: relative to property tax exemptions for charitable organizations for the prior tax year. HB 513	Schamberg	Title: relative to snowmobiles and trail connectors. The committee amendment narrows the bill to the trail connector impacting the Sutton Ridge Runners snowmobile club and was agreed to by DOT. HB 573	Love	Title: relative to the funding for search and rescue operations of the fish and game department and making an appropriation therefor.  Seeks to establish a Fish and Game Search and Rescue Fund, which would receive an additional fee of \$1 for each private boat, OHRV, and snowmobile registered. Additionally, the bill appropriates \$50,000 for purchasing technology to enhance donation collection efforts for search and rescue programs. HB 625	Bolton	Title: relative to enabling municipalities to levy payments against non-profits at a percentage of their assessed property values.  Would enable municipalities to impose a payment in lieu of taxes (PILOT) on certain non-profit organizations based on the assessed value of property they own. It would mandate those non-profits pay 25% of the municipal property tax rate if the municipality adopts the provision. HB 629	Leishman	Title: funding the operation maintenance and repair of state dams. HB 683	Ouellet	Title: relative to off-highway recreational vehicles. Would eliminate the requirement for petitioners to cover the costs of verified mail notifications to property abutters when seeking authorization for OHRV use. Additionally, it expands the list of counties where OHRV operations on designated highways are permitted, now including Carroll, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack, and Sullivan counties, alongside Coos and Grafton counties. SB 35	Innis	Title: making an appropriation for rail trail project matching funds. The Senate passed the bill and then tabled it as they always do to consider it during the budget process. There is no guarantee it will be funded. Would appropriate \$600,000 to the town of Warner as matching funds for a section of the rail trail in Warner. SB 54	Gannon	Title: relative to refusal of consent to testing to determine alcohol concentration and penalties for aggravated driving while intoxicated. SB 239	Watters	Title: requiring the general fund to cover the costs of the fish and game department retirement contributions and technology services.  It would require the general fund to cover the costs of the fish and game department retirement contributions and technology services. SB 274	Fenton	Title: establishing a 4-year pilot program with potential for statewide expansion to improve rail trails in New Hampshire through federal, state, and private funding	Senate Transportation	Introduced
