<b>HB 2</b>	Weyler	Title: relative to state fees, funds, revenues, and expenditures. The House passed version of the budget trail bill now recommends adding language for another two year GIA 80/20 match in the budget as DNCR is unlikely to have the new rules finalized in time. They also have included language to implement a 5% administrative charge on all dedicated funds which would impact all Fish and Game funds. <b>HB 87</b>	Love	Title: prohibiting the posting of land not owned by the poster. Will become Enrolled. The Senate amendment adds a very minor technical amendment for clarity. Specifically, the words “for which”. This bill would make it a Class B misdemeanor to post land not owned or leased by the poster.	House Concurred with the Senate Amendment on 05/08/2025	<a href="#">Version adopted by both bodies</a>
<b>HB 127</b>	Ouellet	Title: extending the closing date of the OHRV trails on the Connecticut River Headwaters property from September 30 to Columbus Day. Will become Enrolled. The Senate amendment makes it clear the extension is “through” Columbus Day and for “existing” OHRV trails.	House Concurred with the Senate Amendment on 05/08/2025	<a href="#">Version adopted by both bodies</a>
<b>HB 165</b>	Judy Aron	Title: relative to the maximum amount of disaster relief funding provided to municipalities after a natural disaster. Will go to the Governor’s Desk. Legislation seeks to increase the limit from \$25,000 to \$100,000 the amount a municipality can receive in extra disaster relief funding per year for roads/bridges.	Enrolled on 05/08/2025	<a href="#">Version adopted by both bodies</a>
<b>HB 404</b>	Darby	Title: relative to information on the hike safe card. Will become Enrolled. This bill amends the definition of “family” for the purpose of purchasing a “Hike Safe” card to include domestic partners and their children. <b>HB 426</b>	John MacDonald	Title: relative to property tax exemptions for charitable organizations for the prior tax year. <b>Will go to the Governor's Desk. This bill would create a grace period to allow charitable organizations to receive retroactive property tax exemption if they did not file for the abatement before the end of the 2024 tax year.</b>	Enrolled on 05/01/2025	<a href="#">Version adopted by both bodies</a>
<b>HB 513</b>	Schamberg	Title: (New Title) allowing the department of transportation to execute a right-of-way use agreement, subject to Federal Highway Administration approval, for snowmobile operation along Interstate 89 in the town of Sutton, from NH Route 114, traveling south for one mile. <b>Is Enrolled and heading to the Governor's Desk. As amended by the House, replaces the bill to allow the department of transportation to execute a right-of-way use agreement for snowmobile use alone I-89 in Sutton, from NH Rt 114, traveling south for one mile.</b>	Enrolled on 05/01/2025	<a href="#">Version adopted by both bodies</a>
<b>HB 655</b>	Spillane	Title: (New Title) relative to fish and game violations, permits, and licenses. <b>Will become enrolled. Would increase penalties for habitual offenders including the ability to suspend a license for repeated violations for certain hunting related offenses.</b>	Senate Energy and Natural Resources  House - Adopted with Amendment on 03/13/2025  Senate – Adopted with Amendment on 04/17/2025	<a href="#">As Amended by the Senate</a>
<b>SB 54</b>	Gannon	Title: relative to refusal of consent to testing to determine alcohol concentration and penalties for aggravated driving while intoxicated. <b>The non-germane amendment would require DOE to create or adopt standardized firearms safety training for mandatory instruction in schools. Attempts to increase the penalties for DWIs and refusing to consent to alcohol testing.</b>	House Criminal Justice and Public Safety  Senate - Adopted on 03/06/2025  House – Committee Report: Ought to Pass with <a href="#">Amendment #1756h</a> for 06/05/2025	<a href="#">Introduced</a>
