Government Takeover and Expansion (1970-1980)

Kanyakine's A-Level Stream was an instant success that had many students admitted to University of Nairobi Law School and Kenyatta University College, the only University facilities in the country then! Kanyakine went on to produce the Best Student for the Kenya Advanced Certificate of Education (KACE) of 1985, a one former CS Keriako Ole Tobiko!

The 8-4-4 Era and Beyond (1980-1989)

The 1980s were a period of significant change for Kanyakine High School. In 1982, the government once again took over the Harambee class, and by 1987, the school had expanded to a triple stream. The introduction of a second 'A' level class on a Harambee basis was a clear indication of

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the school's ambition to offer diverse educational opportunities. However, with the advent of the 8-4-4 system of education in 1989, the 'A' level stream was phased out. This transition was a challenging yet necessary step in aligning the school with the national education system. Nevertheless, Kanyakine High School once again was the celebration of the Nation and produced the Nation's Best Student for the KCSE Exam of 2002 where Dr Bundi Karau was the Best Student national wide!!

Present Day: A Legacy of Excellence

Today, Kanyakine High School stands as a five-stream Extra County school with a total enrollment of about 1000 students, 43 teachers, and 30 members of supporting staff. The school's growth over the years is a testament to the unwavering commitment of its stakeholders, including the Alumni Association.
