

#### BACKGROUND OF GDO

Green Dream Organization (GDO) Founded from A group of active youth combined with a dream of a green Sudan, a clean and healthy environment and a community that lives in peace.

Green Dream is Voluntary, non-governmental, non-profit organization. It was established in <sup>2</sup>0<sup>1</sup>8 and registered officially in Humanitarian Aid Commission (HAC in <sup>2</sup>0<sup>1</sup>9.

Since its foundation, GDO has been working effectively among the communities towards spreading its message of the importance of agriculture and its role in developing the national economy, improving the per capita income, reaching the stage of self-sufficiency, and achieving its vision of Sudan Green, increase access to basic services and providing assets of livelihoods. GDO programs emphasize the role of youth, children and women in Sudan.

GDO programs emphasize the role of youth, children and women in Sudan. It works in sectors of Environment, FSL, Education, Health and WASH. GDO targeted beneficiaries from diverse ethnic, cultural and religious backgrounds. Most of GDO members are Youth. The staff members of GDO have received intensive training on organizational management in the framework of NGOs, Project Cycle Management (PCM) and technical issues of GDO field work.

Consultancy Council has an advisory role to oversee the overall progress made and provides directional guidance and advice to the Board of Director members the consultancy council is providing invaluable communication channel to GDO to reach advocacy and fund-raising objectives.

GDO has an installed administrative and financial system which enables the organization to smoothly run its sectors and projects. During the organization lifetime minor changes have been made to the system primarily because ongoing programs did not allow dramatic changes and because in the very most of all times the system was functioning as it was expected.

Due to the expected programmatic horizontal and vertical expansion GDO general assembly has decided to apply administrative development plan to incorporate lessons learnt during the previous period and introduce new flexible advanced system enabling experience sharing and providing the best possible support to the sectors.




#### TARGET GROUP

#### PROTECTION & CHILD PROTECTION

#### TYPE OF ACTIVITIES

- GDO Have great experience working in gender-based violence (GBV) especially for rising awareness on GBV Issues.
- GDO undertake more than seven FGDs with Algnaa community. The sessions were facilitated by specialized facilitators from CVAW.
- Capacity Development for men and women on the GBV prevention.
- Undertaking of women coffee chat handling the issues related to GBV and address the GBV issues among the community.
- Women Empowerment and Provision livelihood assets/ start-up grant spices trade, and Festival renting equipment to encourage women decision-making participation.



- GDO is a part of WNS protection sectors and participated on 16 days Campaign by different activities such as (exhibition reflect community culture, FGD on GBV, sessions, GBV Psychosocial Support session (PSS), open day reflection different trips culture, early marriage sessions, FGM sessions, Child and Women Rights.
- GDO conducted one open clinic days providing technical and specialized doctors, laboratory technicians, Nurses, free medicine and have early detection of breast cancer. In addition to that GDO has full experience in child protection and undertake many of activities
- GDO conduct training in child rights to men, women and teachers.
- Undertaking session on Child right and issue related to child protection such as child Labor, physical and sexual abuse or exploitation.

#### COMPREHENSIVE EXPLANATION OF MINE ACTION AWARENESS

#### TYPE OF ACTIVITIES

OVERVIEW: THE MINE AWARENESS SESSIONS CONDUCTED UTILIZED THEATER ARTS AS A MEDIUM TO EDUCATE AND RAISE AWARENESS ABOUT THE DANGERS POSED BY MINES AND UNEXPLODED ORDNANCE (UXO). THIS INNOVATIVE APPROACH NOT ONLY ENGAGES THE AUDIENCE IN A CREATIVE FORMAT BUT ALSO EFFECTIVELY DISSEMINATES CRITICAL SAFETY INFORMATION TO DIVERSE AGE GROUPS, PARTICULARLY CHILDREN. THE SESSIONS ENCOMPASSED ALL COMMUNITIES WITHIN KOSTI AND RABAK, WITH A SPECIAL FOCUS ON VULNERABLE POPULATIONS RETURNING TO CONFLICT-AFFECTED AREAS.

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

- Raise Awareness: The primary objective was to inform participants about the dangers associated with mines and explosives, focusing particularly on how these threats can affect everyday life.
- Engage Children: Given the heightened sensitivity of children to foreign objects, the program specifically aimed to educate them about the risks and encourage cautious behaviors.
- **Reporting Mechanism:** The sessions included information on how to identify and report mine-related findings, emphasizing the importance of community vigilance and the proper protocols for dealing with suspicious objects.

Target Audience: The sessions were tailored to engage various demographics within the community, including:

- Children: Representing the most vulnerable group, children were taught to recognize and respond appropriately to potential threats.
- Women and Men: The program also aimed to involve women and men, ensuring comprehensive community participation and support.
- **Returnees:** Special attention was given to individuals returning to areas previously affected by conflict, as they are particularly prone to hazards posed by mines and explosives.

#### **POSITIVE OUTCOMES:**

- ENHANCED KNOWLEDGE: PARTICIPANTS GAINED CRITICAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE DANGERS OF MINES AND THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS TO TAKE, FOSTERING A SAFER ENVIRONMENT WITHIN THEIR COMMUNITIES.
- EMPOWERMENT OF VULNERABLE GROUPS: BY FOCUSING ON CHILDREN AND RETURNEES, THE INITIATIVE EMPOWERED THESE GROUPS WITH KNOWLEDGE AND TOOLS TO NAVIGATE THEIR SURROUNDINGS SAFELY.
- COMMUNITY COHESION: THE INTERACTIVE NATURE OF THEATER ARTS PROMOTED COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT, BUILDING A COLLECTIVE SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY FOR SAFETY AND AWARENESS.
- REPORTING AWARENESS: BY EDUCATING THE PARTICIPANTS ON HOW TO REPORT SUSPICIOUS OBJECTS, THE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED A PROACTIVE APPROACH THAT COULD LEAD TO TIMELY INTERVENTIONS AND ENHANCED COMMUNITY SAFETY.

The mine awareness action utilizing theater arts proved to be an effective strategy in increasing community awareness and fostering a culture of safety. The results underscore the importance of targeted educational initiatives, particularly among vulnerable populations, in mitigating the risks associated with mines and unexploded ordnance. Continued efforts in this area will be crucial for maintaining safety and preventing accidents, especially as communities recover from conflict. An ongoing commitment to public education and awareness can significantly enhance the resilience of affected communities.


- Construction/Rehabilitation/Repairr of Classrooms and improving the school environment in general.

- Support Education Sector by involvement in identification of needs and gab, and sharing updates.








#### TYPE OF ACTIVITIES

- Mobile awareness raising by using loudspeaker on COVID -19.
- Focus group discussion on some of gathering places.
- Provision of facemasks and sanitizers to health workers & people
- Disinfection of the hospitals and Covid 19 isolated centers
- Primary Health Care(PHC) that provide integrated health and nutrition services delivered for vulnerable children, adolescents and Women through facility and community levels in development and emergency setting.
- Management of sever Acute Malnutrition (SAM).
- Social and Behavior Change (SBC), prevention and treatment of malnutrition in emergencies depend heavily on nutrition education and encouragement of optimal IYCF activities.
- Early malnutrition detection through MUAC screening.
- · Referral of SAM children with medical complication to nearest stabilization.
- Community mobilization and empowerment through nutrition activities and training of mother groups on IYCF and training community health promoter (CHP).

### WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE (WASH)

#### TYPE OF ACTIVITIES

Project implemented in 22 gathering sites in Rabak locality starting by kick off meeting and orientation of the project by DRC WASH team with defined goals, activities and target areas.in early August GDO WASH Staff conducting meeting with trained hygiene promotion volunteers in gathering sites preparing micro weekly and monthly work plan for each volunteer and compiled with WASH staff plan for all 22 gathering sites in Rabak locality.

Hygiene promotion:

Total of 3013 receiving hygiene promotion awareness session in groups discussions, child groups and general session for them (1336 women), (287 men) and (1390 children under 5 years and over 6 years).

And 401 participating in weekly Clean-up campaigns from them (57 men), (237 women) and 107 children. WASH NFIs distribution:

Total of 738 NFIs kids distributed for 738 house hold in 18 sites, the WASH NFIs kids counting 2 jarcan, one bucked, one basin, washing soap, bathing soap and sanitary.

Distributions of IEC material /stationery and Refreshers:

About 860 IEC leaflet and more the 68 posters of cholera and water chlorination distributed ,300 IEC, donated to Rabak locality health promoter teams to distribute to flood effected IDPs in Aljazeera Aba.

Hygiene Promotion and Mobile Awareness Campaigns and waste collections campaign not done.

**Protection Component:** 

Project implemented in 55 IDPs gathering site between Kosti, rabak and Ad Dwaim, focusing on providing information and sessions on Human Rights Violations and Gender Based Violence familiarizing beneficiaries with their rights and equipping them with needed information, reaching 8,000 male and Female with information and IEC material.

The project also provided Referral to specialized service (GBV, IPA, PFA). Distribution of 500 Dignity Kits to 300 Women, 300 Man.













#### TYPE OF ACTIVITIES


- Conducted Natural resource management through community dialogue and formulate Community Based Resolution Mechanisms (CBRMs).
