


REVIEW OF LESSON 4: HOLY SPIRIT AND PRAYER

"What we are proving is that there is more required for a useful apprehension and understanding of the mind of God in the Scripture, than the mere objective proposal of it to us, and our diligent use of outward means to come to the knowledge of it. Yet, as we will show, this is from the Holy Spirit also. The denial of this, by just consequence, voids the principal means by which we may come to such an understanding — namely, frequent and fervent prayers for the aid and assistance of the Holy Spirit. So too, no tolerable account can be given of the mind of God and the meaning of the Scripture in the passages insisted on."










GOSPEL/REDEMPTIVE

- How does it lead the reader/hearer to consider their salvation and the salvation of others?




DEVOTIONAL Increase our love, gratitude and devotion to Christ. If we only look for the things to do and the things not to do in a passage, then we are not seeing the awesomeness of God, the wonder of Jesus, and the power of the Spirit. Devotional application cuts to the heart. It is necessary.




DISCIPLESHIP How then shall we live? "for teaching ... and training in righteousness, that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." How does this passage encourage obedience and service to Jesus Christ? Does it instruct the hearer to seek and save the lost?

DISCIPLESHIP Does it instruct the hearer in how to worship God? Does it instruct in how to live each day for the glory of God? Does it instruct the Christian how to live in a world that is lost? Does it help the reader to understand that discipleship is difficult? Does it encourage disciples as they undergo trials and temptations?
