



OLD TESTAMENT NARRATIVE

- A pericope is defined as a smaller unit of the Biblical text with a unifying thought or theme.

- What clues exist within the structure of the account help the reader to understand what is really happening?
- Look for Textual Markers

- What does the author says about the event. How does the author interpret the event?
- Look at examples like 1 and 2 Kings where "the king did what was right" or "the king did evil in the eyes of the Lord."
- Remarks like these are clear indicators of how the reader should view the person or action in questions.
