



## Headlines

**The Governing Body of WYTON ON THE HILL PRIMARY SCHOOL met on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> September 2025 at 18:00 for 1 hours 35 minutes. The meeting was held at the school and below is a note of the key points to emerge from that meeting.**

**The Head teacher** reported the results from the KS2 SATs which were below the national average for both reading and writing. With such a small cohort, the performance of each child adds a significant weight to the overall percentage and if one result had been better, both areas would have been close to both the national and LA average. There were also two children who were disapplied due to significant SEND however they were still included in the overall figures. There were two other children with SEND, both of whom were one mark off achieving the required level and the school appealed. One child had included the correct answers but had a small melt-down during the test and had put a line through it. The appeals were rejected for both children.

The EYFS results were close to national and LA as were the phonics. The times tables results were not at the level the school had hoped and measures are being implemented which should drive an improvement.

There is new legislation linked to food safety. The Deputy Head gave governors a summary about the Early Years Statutory Framework which came into effect from the beginning of September. Much of policy was centred around food safety and supervision. The school have made some minor changes to ensure that staff are always sat facing children eating. The guidance suggests what can be eaten and what needs to be avoided. A few minor changes to the menu were required.

The School Improvement Advisor recently visited and was pleased with the progress made with the SEND processes. The aim is now to apply the systems and rigour to other areas.

Subject leadership needs revisiting in light of the new Ofsted framework and this will continue to be a priority along with standards and how monitoring and evaluation is driving improvement.

Writing will be a priority for the coming year due to the new framework that was published in July.
