




Just a reminder that end of year reports will be sent home next Friday, along with information about your child's class for September. Children's end of year reports will also include information about their class for next year and an option to arrange an appointment with their current class teacher to discuss any queries, comments or concerns you may have about the contents of the report.

Following the appointment of two excellent new class teachers for KS2 September, we can confirm

that as well as our Pre-School, we will continue with a five class structure in September, despite our diminishing budget.

The class structure will be as follows:

- Seahorses Class Pre-School
- Angel Fish Class Reception
- Rainbow Fish Class Years 1 and 2
- Salmon Class Years 3 and 4
- Blue Tang Class Years 4 & 5
- Koi Class Years 5 & 6

Although I have very much enjoyed teaching my class this year, I have taken the difficult decision to step away from class teaching in order to concentrate on ensuring that our school improvement plans and SEND processes remain on track.

Children will have an opportunity to meet their new classes and new class teachers on Thursday 10th July, when the whole school will take part in a 'move up' session in the morning.



Please note that as a school we are not permitted to provide credit to parents for services such as school meals, uniform and wraparound care.

This year, we are finding that an increasing number of families are not paying their lunch bills and this not only puts a strain on our already diminished budget, but also puts us in danger of being accused of mis-spending public funds to benefit a small number individuals, rather than ensuring that funding is spent equally on all our pupils.

Perhaps more importantly than that, we have a duty of care to ensure that we do not allow families to run up large debts that they are then unable to pay, which is why we ask that all services, including school meals are paid for in advance via ParentPay.

In order to manage this issue, the Governing Body have written a 'School Meals Payment Policy' which outlines the steps the school will take in order to balance a child's needs to access a nutritious meal during the school day with the responsibility of their parents to pay in advance for that service. You can access the policy here.



This half term, our Governing Body has been working hard on recruiting two new teachers to ensure that our school can deliver a curriculum that is right for all our children next year.

They have also continued to review our performance data and SEN processes across the school to ensure that plans for school development in these areas are on the right track.

They met as a council to decide on questions to ask our candidates and then two smaller groups took part in the interview processes by giving tours and forming a pupil interview panel. We were delighted that in both cases, the children's choice of candidate for appointment matched the staff choice.

Our School Council sub-committees continue to work on our three main projects for this year: developing our school garden, keeping our school environment free from litter and making sure our school toilets are the best they can be for everyone.



It was great to see so many families here on a Saturday afternoon, despite the heat! We are fortunate to have so many strong supporters of our school.

In particular, thank you to our fantastic WSCAs team, for their hard work and determination in preparing and holding the event, which raised just over £1,400.
