#### **Present modal: Must, can't, may, can, might**

	must	Certainty	Look at Tom. He has just bought another new car. He must earn a lot of money.	
Present	can't	Impossibility	Barbara hasn't got her passport yet. She can't go with us to France.	
	may; can; might	Possibility	It may rain tomorrow. We aren't sure.	

## <u>Modals of deducation:</u> <u>Certainty, Impossibility, Possibility</u>



	must have + past participle (pp)	Certainty	We haven't seen Bob for a long time. He must have changed his job.
Past	can't have + pp	Impossibility	Barbara can't have asked for the visa because she didn't have her passport at that time.
	/could may/can/might have + pp	Possibility	The Browns weren't at home yesterday. They might have gone out for a picnic.
