of our fantastic food and beverage stalls - or just sit back and enjoy some of the diverse and vibrant array of entertainment on offer at this uniquely traditional celebration. It's a truly special day that's guaranteed to spark joy in the hearts of young and old alike.

Beyond the laughter and the lively banter, lies a deeper purpose too. The profits of the Fair are a vital support for an array of local charities and good causes. Each year, the beneficiaries change, but our commitment to nurturing the community remains steadfast.

We invite you to step back in time today and experience all the charm and eccentricity of a traditional English fête at this uniquely special incarnation of Rottingdean Village Fair; a beloved annual celebration that's been a local favourite since 1925.

100 Years of Festivities & Fun

The village of Rottingdean has held public festivities for as long as anyone can remember, with royal celebrations being a favourite.

The earliest recorded event was a jubilant affair held in 1789 that marked King George III's recovery from insanity, complete with dazzling illuminations and fireworks that lit up the village in joy!

Another memorable event was Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee in 1887. Villagers gathered for a grand lunch, followed by a lively sports day on Beacon Hill. Aside from the usual sack and flat races, the real star of the show was an animal race which was somewhat bizarrely won by a parrot!

In 1911, King George V's Coronation provided another excuse for a magnificent pageant, vividly described in Colonel Moens' book "The Story of a Village." Later celebrations such as the 1935 Jubilee and King George VI's Coronation were somewhat more modest, but they still held a special place in village history.

The Ancient Order of Foresters also hosted an annual Fete Day that drew considerable crowds, and the Victorians held an annual event in November where a certain Miss Matilda Beard would distribute pennies to crowds of local children. The first charity fair as we know it today was held in 1925 on 'The Green' - and the following year at 'The Elms', with the Prime Minister's wife, Mrs. Stanley Baldwin, doing the honours by opening the proceedings. Raising £392, the event supported both the Church and School. By the 1930s, the Fair had moved back to The Green, paused during WWII, and was later revived by a determined Miss Jessie Seymour and her sister.

Over the years, a star-studded lineup has opened the Fair, including Arthur Lowe, Lawrence Olivier, Vera Lynn and Fred Perry; famous faces of the time who added a touch of glamour to a beloved tradition.

Beyond all the fun, the modern Fair has always been about supporting the community. Funds raised have been a crucial lifeline for local projects, helping the church and our schools, many local charities, and even helping to restore our iconic windmill when it's sails almost fell off again back in 1935!

A special tribute must also go to the late Miss Winifred Hoyle, who devised and managed the 'Opening Cavalcade' - a spectacular opening feature of the Rottingdean Village Fair for many glorious years. We also pay tribute to the recently departed Valerie Toft, who organised countless joyful maypole and other dances to entertain us.

THE GREEN

Once again this year on The Green there are a host of intriguing stalls to explore, fabulous food outlets to sample and fun games to play.

There's also a diverse range of entertainment on the banks of the pond - where one of our two stages is situated. It's the perfect location to sit back and relax with a drink and enjoy the pot-pourri of talented local performers and entertainers who are listed overleaf.



KIPLING GARDENS

Be sure not to miss out on visiting these truly beautiful walled gardens to discover even more stalls and other things to do and see-including the opportunity to try your hand at bowling, croquet or a bit of wacky golf!

To entertain you is a second stage to the rear of the gardens with lots of fabulous music and entertainment throughout the entire day and listed overleaf.



ST. MARGARET'S CHURCHYARD

This year we've created a new and special area for the kids to the front of St. Margaret's Church where you can enjoy a variety of fun stalls - and we are most grateful to the Church Wardens for enabling this. We've even laid on a 'Lollipop Person' to help ensure everyone's safety when crossing the road to get there!

Kazam Parties will also be located there too, to delight and entertain the youngsters with mini magic shows, balloon modelling, bubbles and more; half past the hour, every hour!



There'll also be special performances at 12.00 and 14.00 of the amazing Punch and Judy show from the talented Troubadour Tales, who proved to be so very popular last year.

On the other side of The Green, the bouncy castles and slides are also back - and you can grab yourselves a delicious ice cream from the van on your way there!


By way of homage to this remarkable success story, we are delighted to host The Rottingdean Drama Society's fabulous new Murder Mystery devised by David Rumelle;

Rottingdean Village Fair 2024



Last year, the Rottingdean Village Fair welcomed some 4,000 visitors on the day and the village, and its shops, restaurants and bars were all buzzing with life. Equally importantly, our stalls also reported unprecedented takings.

Highlights of the 2024 Fair included sixty-six highly diverse community, charity and commercial stalls, an extended food and beverage offering of three food stalls and two bars, two entertainment stages featuring a host of local talent and performers, and the ever-popular dog show!

The feedback we received from visitors and stall-holders alike was extremely rewarding, and we are delighted to report the following headlines:



- £8,000 raised by community and charity groups
- £7,000 raised on the gates and at the bars

Our Lady of Lourdes School was able to purchase two balance bikes and St Margaret's School bought some much-needed sensory equipment.

Other contributions were made towards a youth outreach initiative for PARC and the memorial restoration for the Royal British Legion.

With our financial reserves thus restored, we were able to afford the additional expense of this year's special celebrations as well as helping to secure our future thereafter

The Rottingdean Twiddlers!

The Rottingdean Village Fair is delighted to be able to announce the launch of an exciting new local initiative which has been fully funded by ourselves in conjunction with Rottingdean Arts and the Parish Council.

'The Rottingdean Twiddlers' is a newly-formed group of professional sound technicians who are coming together to provide public address sound services and equipment, free of charge, to the organisers of local events for registered charities and non-profit making organisations.

The idea is to save these worthy organisations many thousands of pounds in the long term, as hiring in these services otherwise is an increas-

ingly expensive burden for groups with limited funds and resources. Going forward, we are also hopeful that our initiative will encourage organisers to stage some entirely new local events too; yet to be imagined!

The sound you are hearing today, and the people that are operating it (Colin, Nick, Kieron and Rowland), are all part of 'The Twiddlers' and we would like to take this opportunity of thanking them for their time and contribution.

Moving the Fair indoors would not only be disappointing for everyone concerned, but also rather challenging too as there simply isn't enough room to accommodate all the planned stalls and activities. But at least the Fair would still happen 'come hell or high water' - as was proven in 2023.

Let us hope for the best and keep our fingers crossed!
