LETTER FROM PASTOR

"Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said."

-Matthew 28:5-6

Depending upon when you are reading this, it might be Holy Week right now, it might be Holy Saturday, or it is just after Easter. But regardless of when you are reading this, we are celebrating the joy of the Resurrection, because we do that every single day! We remember and observe the moment that the Marys go to visit Jesus' tomb, only to find an angel seated on the stone that has been rolled away, and Jesus' body not in there. I want to take a moment on the message that the angel shares with them. "He is not here, for He has risen, **as He said.**"

Through the seasons of the church year we work our way through the readings, which do a pretty good job of leading us through the entirety of the Bible in three years. And through those three years we hear of Jesus' entire ministry, and how His disciples were right there with Him along the way. Sometimes we read the parable of Jesus, or some of the various teachings that He does, and we wonder "why can't He just say this plainly?" There are certainly many texts in the Bible and phrases of Jesus that need further explanation from pastors and professors, but let's be clear, Jesus does not keep secrets. Jesus is very forthcoming about His purpose on earth, and what the will His Father has for Him is.

The angel tells the Marys that Jesus is risen from the dead just as He said. Jesus had told His disciples several times exactly what was going to happen. At least three times (Matt. 16:21-23, 17:22-23, 20:17-19) Jesus tells His disciples the plan. We call these, Passion Predictions. Yet, how do the disciples respond? Keep in mind, these men have been following Jesus for quite some time, and have heard Him teach and preach, and have been by His side as He did miracle after miracle. They have even rightly confessed Jesus as being the Christ! But when Jesus tells them the plan, they are in disbelief. When Peter denies Jesus' first Passion Prediction, Jesus famously says, "Get behind me, Satan!"

You can hardly blame Peter and the disciples for their reaction to Jesus' prediction. Who would have thought that the Messiah would come here to die? But that's exactly what He did. And better yet, He rose, just as He said He would. Jesus died that your sins would be forgiven, and now is alive to bring you life everlasting. Listen to Him. So often we are in denial of what God is doing, or what God is not doing. Listen to Him. He has told us how He loves us. He has demonstrated that love for us through Jesus. He has won. Celebrate the victory that Jesus has won for you, and share the best news ever with those around you!

Hello Zion Family,

As we celebrate the resurrection on Easter Sunday, it's important to remember how significant it is that Jesus rose from the dead. I thought this season and month is a good opportunity to review one of the topics we covered with our younger members in confirmation. Our 7/8th grade confirmands have been walking through the gospel of Matthew with our pastors this last year, then I was able to be in the classroom with them looking at why the gospels matter; then at the church and what it means to be a member. We looked at Acts and how early believers gathered together to hear the Word, break bread, pray, and spendtime in fellowship. We looked at 1 Corinthians 12 and how the body of Christ depends on one another, a hand cannot belittle a foot, and a body can't only be an eye. Then we will look at 1 Corinthians 15 and how significant the resurrection is to our faith. It is Jesus' death and resurrection that unites us as a church and gives up hope. When we are baptized, we are baptized into Christ's death and resurrection which includes his church, the body of believers who still gathers for the exposition of the Word, breaking of bread, prayers, and fellowship just as the early church did. This is the body of believers who provides for each other and shows Christ's love to each other because he is our head. If this resurrection had not happened, what then?

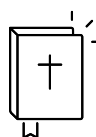
The apostle Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 15 that if we don't believe in the resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised, and if Christ has not been raised then our faith is futile. He's basically saying, "There's no hope! When you die that's it!" Therefore, this resurrection of Christ is pivotal to our faith. We don't just return to the ground, work done, no further purpose or hope.

As the confirmands were challenged to think about, you too can think about how you might live your life differently if you thought this was it, there was nothing after death. Your life might look more like "seize the day", or as Paul says in Corinthians, "Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die." Much of the world does live this way, to their own detriment. Instead of living for service to Christ, using the gifts the Spirit has given us to love our neighbor, and looking forward to the resurrection of the faithful, we would only see ourselves and our one chance to make an impact because that's it. You would instead look to leave your name imprinted on this planet. You would instead look to gain the most for yourself to make your life the most comfortable as possible. But what about those other people and that body you were baptized into?? It would be meaningless.

Instead, we have hope in the resurrection. We celebrate that Jesus was not only born and died, but that he resurrected!! This makes a significant impact on our lives. We are part of something greater than ourselves. The Spirit gives us roles and responsibilities and we use those in unconditional and sacrificial love toward our neighbor. We expect nothing in return because we have been given so much in Christ. This is what keeps God's love flowing throughout humanity. We know we have a final resurrection waiting so we have hope! As we celebrate Easter together as the body of Christ, remember that this is a really big deal! THIS is where our hope is found.

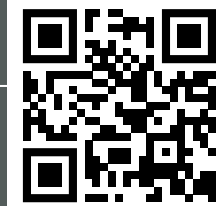

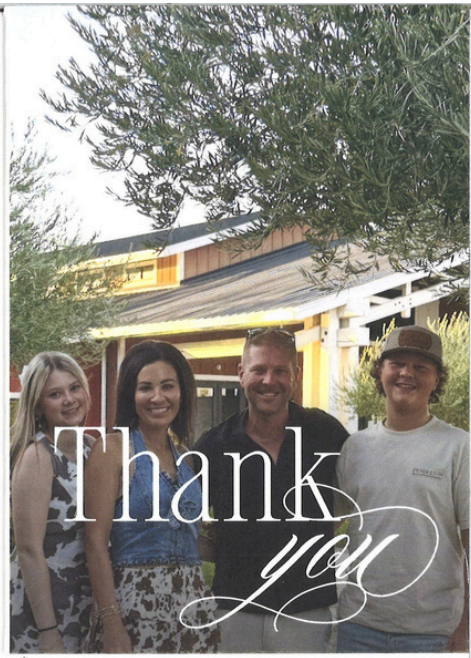

Dear members of Wayside Zion Lutheran Church,

We went, we were stretched, we worked, we played, we worshipped, we shared the love of Jesus in so many ways (often without words).

We held a medical mission/eye clinic and helped 400 people.

We shared messages and activities with a disabled and blind group, with young moms, and at feeding programs and churches. We visited an orphanage and challenged their students to live for Christ. We ministered in both men and women's prisons along with churches and showed the Jesus video in different villages on 5 evenings.

A special moment at the disabled was when we had finished washing their hands, feeding them a hot meal, singing and then did a skit about building your house on a rock – reflecting our faith. Cecilia, the disabled director sitting in her wheelchair told us, "When your mission group comes, you show us respect and love". She said, "we don't get much of that in our community or even in our family". With tears she finished by saying "someday in heaven we want to wash your hands"!

Due to many donations, we were able to support 11 construction projects, purchased sound equipment and instruments for 2 churches, 600 Bibles, 120 chairs, 10 wheelchairs, and 1 walker. We packaged 1000 #s of rice, beans and oil to support 250 families for one week. We gave out over 400 Thrivent shirts, 150 health kits and used clothing. Money was also given to 2 feeding programs which help to feed children with physical and spiritual food throughout the year.

We were so privileged to humbly serve as the hands and feet of Jesus. We were touched by the joy and love of those we served, as well as those we served alongside pastors, drivers, interpreters, and cooks. All praise to God!

Thank you for your prayers of health and your generous support for our Azua Mission team.

Artichoke Crab Dip

- 1 Can Artichoke Hearts (Chopped)
- 1-2 Cups Crab Meat (imitation crab will work)
- 1 Cup Chopped Onion
- 1 Cup Mayonnaise
- 8 oz pkg Cream Cheese
- 1 Cup Grated Parmesan Cheese

Combine all ingredients together in an oven safe dish and bake at 350° for 30-45 minutes or until bubbling hot.

Serve with chips, crackers or bread.

Raspberry Pretzel Torte

1st layer in pan:

- 2 small packages of raspberry Jello
- 2 cups boiling water
- 20 oz. Frozen raspberries thawed (or fresh if you have them)

Combined water and jello to dissolve, add raspberries. Pour into bundt pan sprayed with Pam or a jello mold. Chill to set.

2nd layer:

- 8 oz cool whip 8 oz. Cream cheese 1 cup sugar

Cream all these together and spread over the jello. Set overnight in refrigerator (do not add pretzels until morning) when you are ready to serve scatter pretzels over the cream cheese layer (it will be a crust when turned right side up) . Set bottom of pan in lukewarm water to loosen from pan (about 1-2 minutes) Turn upside down on serving platter...and tada! Raspberry Torte everyone will love!!

3rd layer: (prepare anytime while jello layer is setting)

- 1 ½ cups pretzels (broken into bite size pieces)
- ¾ cup melted butter
- 2 Tbsp sugar

Mix all together and spread on a cookie sheet . Bake at 350° for 10 minutes. Let it cool and then break into pieces

Canada is about to kill its 100,000th citizen through Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) this spring. Not in a war. Not on a battlefield. Not in a medical accident. Killed by policy, by a government that wants them dead. Let's say this by name, call it the truth. A systemic failure dressed up as compassion. MAiD was sold as a narrow option for the terminally ill, a rare mercy. That fiction collapsed long ago. Today, assisted death is a routine outcome for people struggling with disability, isolation, poverty, and mental health challenges, and when the world looked at what we're doing, it didn't nod approvingly. It recoiled. The United Nations Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities didn't mince words: Canada must repeal "Track 2" MAiD, the legal pathway that allows people whose deaths are not reasonably foreseeable to receive assisted dying. It called Track 2 "extremely concerning." It said the law rests on "negative, ableist perceptions of the quality and value of the life of persons with disabilities," suggesting it assumes suffering is inherent to disability rather than a product of social inequality and discrimination. This is not fluff from ivory-tower bureaucrats. This is the authoritative UN body charged with monitoring Canada's compliance with the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, a treaty Canada ratified in 2010. 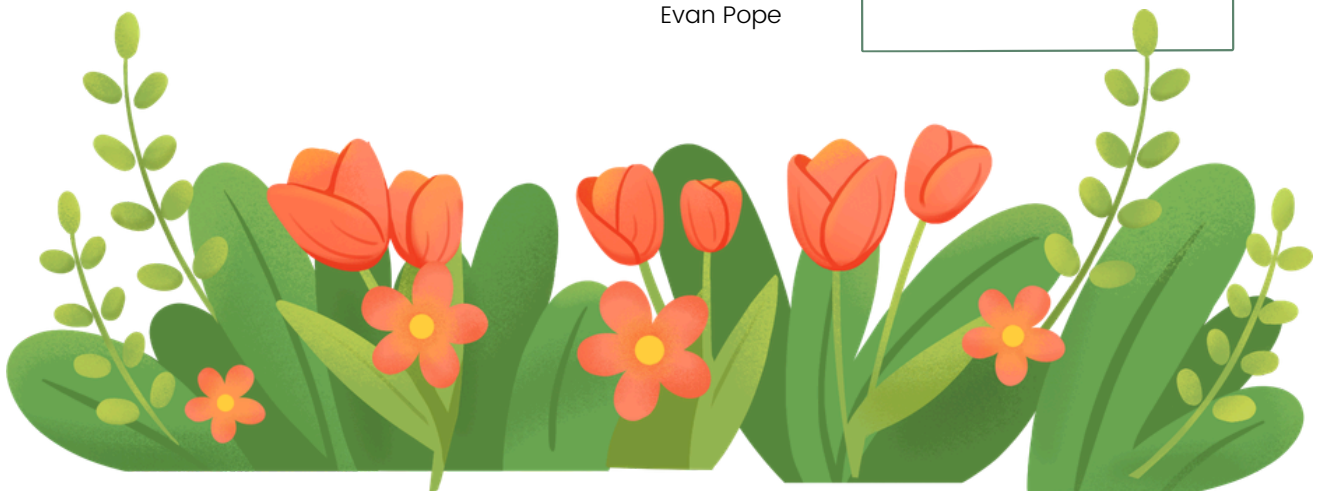
