LETTER FROM PASTOR

And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. - Revelation 21:3

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I've spent some time recently reading through the beginning of Genesis. This tells us of how everything came to be in creation. How God made everything, including us! What stands out to me is how close God is with His creation. Especially in Genesis 2, we hear that God walks in the garden. God Himself planted the garden. God used His hands to form Adam out of the earth. God used His hands to form Eve from Adam's rib, and God brought Eve to be with Adam. He is very close and very involved in His own creation.

Christ is Risen! And there is no greater joy than knowing what He has accomplished for us, dying to forgive our sins, and rising to give us everlasting life! But now, He goes with us. He works through His Word and through Baptism and Holy Communion in the church, strengthening the faith that He has given to us and forgiving sins.

Before Jesus ascends to His throne, He meets His disciples in Galilee and gives them what we now call The Great Commission. Jesus is *teaching* them how to go out and make disciples of all nations. Jesus *teaches* that there are two indispensable pillars of making disciples: Baptizing and *teaching*. Baptism is clearly demonstrated as such in our worship service. MAKES: 10-12 SERVINGS
PREP. TIME: 15-20 MINUTES
COOKING TIME: 2½-6½ HOURS
IDEAL SLOW COOKER SIZE: 7-QUART

2 15-oz. cans black beans, drained
4 cups frozen corn kernels
2 garlic cloves, minced
¾ tsp. ground cumin
2 cups chunky salsa, divided
10 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves
2 8-oz. pkgs. cream cheese, cubed


shredded cheddar cheese

- 1. Combine beans, corn, garlic, cumin, and half of salsa in slow cooker.
- 2. Arrange chicken breasts over top. Pour remaining salsa over top.
- Cover. Cook on High 2-3 hours, or on Low 4-6 hours.
- Remove chicken and cut into bite-sized pieces. Return to cooker.
- 5. Stir in cream cheese. Cook on High until cream cheese melts.
- Spoon chicken and sauce over cooked rice. Top with shredded cheese.

64% of Americans Support Defunding Planned Parenthood – When it comes to federal funding, Americans are speaktheir tax dollars bankrolling gender ideology — or abortion, for that matter. A (LLC), first obtained by Breitbart, revealed 64% of registered voters oppose their hard-earned tax dollars going toward "an organization that provides puberty blockers, hormone therapy, and other gender transition treatments for minors."
