LETTER FROM PASTOR

And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. - Revelation 21:3

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I've spent some time recently reading through the beginning of Genesis. This tells us of how everything came to be in creation. How God made everything, including us! What stands out to me is how close God is with His creation. Especially in Genesis 2, we hear that God walks in the garden. God Himself planted the garden. God used His hands to form Adam out of the earth. God used His hands to form Eve from Adam's rib, and God brought Eve to be with Adam. He is very close and very involved in His own creation.

Our Bible verse above from Revelation 21 paints a very similar picture, however, this is not about the beginning, but about the end. Christ is Risen! And there is no greater joy than knowing what He has accomplished for us, dying to forgive our sins, and rising to give us everlasting life! But now, He goes with us. He works through His Word and through Baptism and Holy Communion in the church, strengthening the faith that He has given to us and forgiving sins.

Before Jesus ascends to His throne, He meets His disciples in Galilee and gives them what we now call The Great Commission. Jesus is *teaching* them how to go out and make disciples of all nations. Jesus *teaches* that there are two indispensable pillars of making disciples: Baptizing and *teaching*. Baptism is clearly demonstrated as such in our worship service. When we have a Baptism, we begin our service with that and celebrate what God is doing through that water, while also highlighting the responsibility now given to the parents, godparents, and congregation. What is that responsibility? To *teach*!

Baptism is only done one time in the life of an individual. God's work is good and sufficient. However, being taught is quite the opposite. The teaching never stops! There is never a point in the life of a Christian that we have learned it all. We are **always** being taught! However, we are also being taught by our culture, society, and the world around us. Our schedules continue to be packed from sunrise to sunset, day in and day out. Suddenly, our yearning to learn has been satisfied not by the church, but by the world. Dr. Jeff Gibbs, a professor emeritus from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, puts it this way, "Somehow, the church will need to recapture the truth that once a disciple has begun to be such, there is an entire lifetime of teaching and learning that must happen in order to be Jesus' disciple."

I am so proud to say that Zion Wayside takes the making of disciples, and our own growth in discipleship so seriously that we are taking the steps necessary that we might better be prepared to *teach*! The change in service times allows us to have a full-on education hour in between services for every member of our congregation. Together, we can gather and learn more about who our God is, what He has done for us, and how we can now continue to make a difference in our community to glorify Him!

Starting **Wednesday, September 3rd, 2025**, Wednesday night worship will be at 6:30pm, and **Sunday, September 7th, 2025**, Sunday worship services will be **7:45am & 10:00am**, with an **education hour from 9am-9:50am**. The education hour will include Adult Bible Study, Sunday School, Donuts & Devos for our high schoolers, and Confirmation for our middle schoolers. 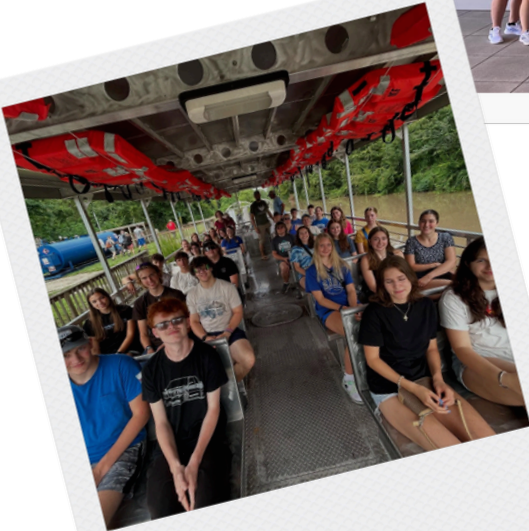

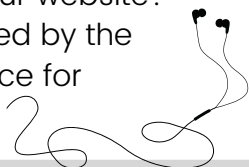

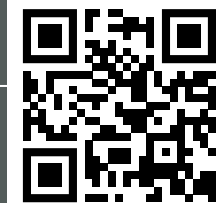

Chicken Azteca

MAKES: 10-12 SERVINGS

PREP TIME: 15-20 MINUTES

COOKING TIME: 2½-3½ HOURS

IDEAL SLOW COOKER SIZE: 7-QUART

2 15-oz. cans black beans, drained

4 cups frozen corn kernels

2 garlic cloves, minced

¾ tsp. ground cumin

2 cups chunky salsa, divided

10 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves


2 8-oz. pkgs. cream cheese, cubed

rice, cooked

shredded cheddar cheese

1. Combine beans, corn, garlic, cumin, and half of salsa in slow cooker.
2. Arrange chicken breasts over top. Pour remaining salsa over top.
3. Cover. Cook on High 2-3 hours, or on Low 4-6 hours.
4. Remove chicken and cut into bite-sized pieces. Return to cooker.
5. Stir in cream cheese. Cook on High until cream cheese melts.
6. Spoon chicken and sauce over cooked rice. Top with shredded cheese.

Don't lift the lid on the rice pan before it's time.

 1 tsp. vanilla

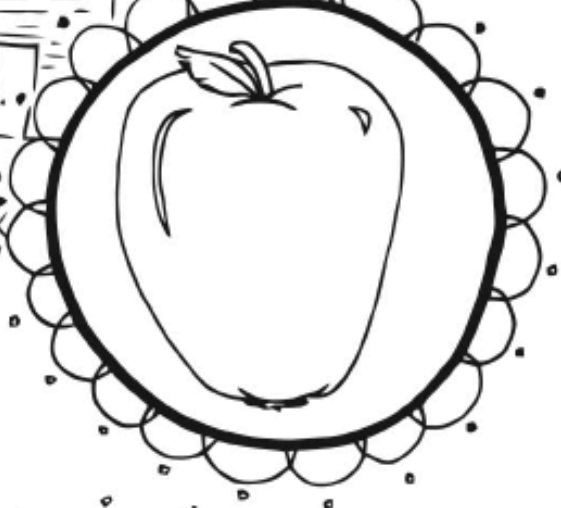
Stir in { 1 cup flour

64% of Americans Support Defunding Planned Parenthood – When it comes to federal funding, Americans are speaking loud and clear: They don't want their tax dollars bankrolling gender ideology — or abortion, for that matter. A poll from Life Leadership Conference (LLC), first obtained by Breitbart, revealed 64% of registered voters oppose their hard-earned tax dollars going toward "an organization that provides puberty blockers, hormone therapy, and other gender transition treatments for minors." Of those in opposition, 76% were Republicans, 71% were Independents, and Democrats were evenly split, 44% to 44%. The poll's findings gain added context from a recent Live Action investigation, highlighted by Breitbart, which alleged that Planned Parenthood — known as the nation's largest abortion business and second-largest distributor of gender transition drugs—has been offering hormone treatments to minors as young as 16 with minimal parental consent or medical oversight ... David Bereit, executive director of LLC, emphasized the public's stance, stating, "The overwhelming majority of Americans strongly oppose their tax dollars bankrolling organizations that target minors for irreversible, sterilizing sex-change treatments and abortions—especially without parental involvement or consent."
