Greetings in our Lord and Savior,

A few years ago I wrote several articles about the famous friends of Wayside. Many of you probably listen to the radio while driving your kids to school, church or to work. My family enjoys country music and singing to the radio as we travel down the country roads heading to Zion. Many of you have probably heard the song Famous Friends by Chris Young and Kane Brown. It's a very catchy song that talks about local famous people. We at Zion Wayside have several famous friends that walk the hallways and preach in our church. These famous friends are truly a blessing, take a moment next time you see them and thank our "famous" Wayside friends for their dedication and commitment to serving God and Zion. We have been blessed to add a few more staff members to our already famous group of people. In this article I will feature Debbie Louison as our school secretary, Christine Wyman as our art teacher and Maddie Westrich as our interim daycare director.

Debbie graduated from UW-Stevens Point in 1980 and lived in Lola for 30 years until she sold her house 6 years ago and moved to Denmark to be closer to her daughter Kelsey and her family. At this time she joined Zion Lutheran Wayside Church.

Her kids include Michael who received his doctorate from the University of Illinois and is now a Professor at McKendree University in Illinois. Matthew who received a Law Degree and Masters Degree in Business from UW-Madison and is now a Senior Analyst at a medical insurance company. Kelsey has an Occupational Therapist Degree from UW-LaCrosse and now works at Green Bay Public Schools. Three apples of her eyes are her grandchildren Ruth, Quinn, and Kinsley.

Debbie worked at Central Wisconsin Appraisal as the Office Manager for 18 years then left there to do some caregiving. This rewarding job was for a gentleman who was a quadriplegic because of an accident that occurred 32 years prior. She was with him for 7 years until his death. Her volunteer work has led her in many different directions because of her kids from involvement at Our Savior Lutheran Church and Scandinavia Lutheran Church.

At both of these churches she served on council, was treasurer of SLC for 9 years, and taught Sunday School for 13 years. Other volunteer roles included 13 years as Recreational Director of sports activities from flag football, swimming lessons, basketball, soccer, softball, baseball, and t-ball. This role included getting registration and waiver forms out to students, ordering t-shirts, organizing officials, helping with fund raising for the swimming pool and football field. One role that didn't involve her kids was 4 years of doing meals on wheels where she found new friendships and one of those is Lucille who is 1-5 years old and still living at home. Debbie excited to be part of the staff at Zion and looks forward to her new role. Stop into the office and visit one of our newest "famous friends" at Zion.

Our next famous friend is Maddie Westrich. Maddie graduated from Zion Wayside in 2018 and Wrightstown High School in 2022. She completed an AP psychology course in high school that required 60 hours of volunteer work, which she completed at the Zion Wayside Daycare. During her time at Wrightstown High School she took a course through NWTC that led her to become a Certified Nursing Assistant. After two years of being a CNA she completed a class through UWGB to become a medication administrator. In September of 2024 she began working part-time at Zion Wayside Daycare, and now she is excited to be entering the role of interim daycare director.

Maddie will also be completing several classes from now to January, teaching her the ins and outs of running a daycare, after which she plans to begin working towards an associates degree in early childhood development. Her family has a long history at Zion Wayside which she is happy to be continuing with her boys, Bentley who will be 3 in February and Dean who is 2 months old. Stop over at the daycare and say "Hi" to Maddie.

Our last famous friend is Christine Wyman. Mrs. Wyman - Art Teacher is a proud graduate of Wausau East High School (Go Lumberjacks!) and was confirmed at St. Anne's Catholic Church in Wausau, WI. After high school, she set her sights on attending a college that looked like it belonged in Dead Poets Society - and she found it at St. Norbert College in DePere, WI. While earning her Bachelor of Arts Degree at St. Norbert, she also had the incredible opportunity

to spend a semester studying fine art at Lorenzo de' Medici in Florence, Italy.

After graduation, she began receiving commissions for her artwork, which eventually led to opening Christine's Gallery in DePere. She owned and operated the gallery for 3 years and also hosted "Create a Night Out" painting events -an experience that helped her fall even more in love with sharing art with others.

Christine later took what she fondly calls a "power pause" from her art career to marry her husband, Scott Wyman of Green Bay, and raise 3 children: Chase (10), Parker (9), and Allison (7). While working from home during those years, she discovered a new passion - painting murals, which has become a meaningful extension of her creative journey.

Christine believes in the value of art to her core. Art is not only about the final piece but about the process - creativity, observational thinking, reflection, and resilience - are lifelong tools.

She is thrilled to bring her passion for art and creative problem-solving to Zion Lutheran. Together, we will learn, explore, and maybe even create a few masterpieces along the way - because we certainly won't be made about that!



FRENCH TOAST BAKE

1 (8 to 9-oz.) loaf french bread	1/2 c flour
3 eggs	6 T. brown sugar
3 T sugar	1/2 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. vanilla	1/4 c. butter
2 1/4 c. milk	1 c. fresh or frozen blueberries

Grease 9x13-inch baking dish. Cut bread diagonally into 1-inch slices and place in pan. Set aside. Beat eggs, sugar and vanilla. Stir in milk. Pour over bread, turning slices to coat. Cover and refrigerate overnight. In a small mixing bowl, combine flour, brown sugar and cinnamon. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Turn bread over in baking dish. Scatter blueberries over bread and sprinkle crumb mixture over the top. Bake 40 minutes or until brown in 375° oven.

A new abortion center in Colorado has begun killing unborn babies in abortions up to birth and for any reason. The abortion business operators declare that “any reason you have for needing abortion care is yours, and it is the right one.” The RISE Collective, formed by former staff of the now-closed Boulder Abortion Clinic, which also killed babies in late-term abortions, opened its doors in Boulder and started scheduling appointments for late-term abortions two weeks ago. The facility kills babies up to 34 weeks’ gestation—about 13 weeks after the point of fetal viability—making it one of only a handful of such centers nationwide where babies can be killed in the third trimester without any medical justification required. With thousands of premature babies born at 34 weeks or earlier, that is functionally up to birth in some cases. Colorado’s lack of any limits on abortion has turned the state into a magnet for “abortion tourism,” drawing customers from across the country to end the lives of their unborn children at any stage of pregnancy. The RISE Collective employs 20% of the abortionists in the U.S. that kill babies in late-term abortions, ensuring a steady pipeline for these deadly procedures ... Pro-life leaders, who initially rejoiced at the Boulder Abortion Clinic’s closure ... expressed outrage at the swift resurrection of its gruesome mission under new management.
