LETTER FROM PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Perhaps you don't think much about the decorations in our sanctuary on a given Sunday, but if you pay attention to the paraments on our altar and pulpit, you will notice that the colors change depending on the season of the church year. Green is the most common color we use, but you're probably also familiar with blue during Advent, purple during Lent, or white during the season of Easter. Red, however, only comes out a couple times a year. This is because red is the color for special celebrations, sometimes called feast or festival days. You will see red on special occasions like Reformation Sunday, Confirmation, ordinations or installations.

I bring this up because at the beginning of June, our altar will once again be donning those bright red paraments as we celebrate Pentecost. Pentecost is an incredibly significant day in the church year. It is essentially the birthday of the church as we know it. It is the day that Jesus' command to make disciples of all nations by baptizing and teaching is kicked off in earnest and the Holy Spirit does so in a spectacular and miraculous way.

The tongues of fire from Heaven and the miracle of the Apostles' words being heard and understood in many languages grab our attention on Pentecost, and rightfully so. The miraculous work of the Holy Spirit among his people in such a vivid and tangible way is awe-inspiring. This Pentecost, however, I would encourage you to pry your eyes away from the tongues of fire and really try to focus on Peter's Pentecost sermon.

It is Peter's sermon which truly cuts to the heart of why Pentecost is such a significant day of celebration. The sermon itself is short and simple. Peter uses King David, the greatest king Israel has ever known, as his primary illustration. Peter says, ""Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day" (Acts 2:29). David was a great king, certainly, but he could not save his people. David, just like all of God's people from every time and place pointed to and hoped for the promised Savior. Peter says, "he [David] foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ" (Acts 2:31).

This message of hope proclaimed by David (see Psalm 16, 22, and 23) is the exact same message Peter proclaimed on Pentecost, and it is the exact same message of hope we cling to and proclaim today. "Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know— this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it...This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses" (Acts 2:22-24, 32).

Throughout every season and every special celebration of the church year, this is our hope. Jesus Christ is Alive!

How do you receive your information? The daily news, church announcements, family updates? You may say through the newspaper, especially if you're reading a paper copy of this newsletter. You may watch a local TV station, or exchange emails (or snail mail) with family members, maybe you're more techy and visit websites or Facebook to see what's happening. I'm sure you wouldn't be surprised to hear that Gen Z (born 1999-2015) uses social media to stay informed and connected. A Barna Group poll in 2020 showed that 80% of teens/young adults 13-21old either years "somewhat" or "strongly" that they use social media as the way to be informed. That means, in order to reach them, you need to be up front and center where they get their information! If you aren't a social media user yourself, maybe you aren't familiar with some of the apps that young people use, so you may not know or see some of our social media campaigns, and I may lose you when I start talking about Instagram and hashtags.

This summer, I'm putting on my "communications" hat and making an effort for our church to be more "present" on social media in hopes that we show up in the news feeds of our younger members. (The news feed is like the front page of a newspaper.) You'll see Zion Wayside more present on Instagram with Bible verse of the week, sermon recaps, Bible Study recaps, song of the week, and answering questions about why church matters.

I'd invite you to share our page with a young person in your life so that they can be exposed more frequently to God's Word and hear of his love for them and desire to have them present in the church. I also invite you to tell me what content you find valuable as you scroll through social media for information. Is it prayers? Mini-devotions? What helps you feel connected to Zion Wayside? Don't worry, this doesn't mean we won't communicate in other ways as well. We'll still use our traditional forms of communication. Think of it as branching out and trying to reach more people. As trends change, we'll probably be talking about a totally different social media platform by next summer. Until then, I look forward to seeing you on Sundays and online!

Christ is Risen! And there is no greater joy than knowing what He has accomplished for us, dying to forgive our sins, and rising to give us everlasting life! But now, He goes with us. He works through His Word and through Baptism and Holy Communion in the church, strengthening the faith that He has given to us and forgiving sins.

Before Jesus ascends to His throne, He meets His disciples in Galilee and gives them what we now call The Great Commission. Jesus is *teaching* them how to go out and make disciples of all nations. Jesus *teaches* that there are two indispensable pillars of making disciples: Baptizing and *teaching*. Baptism is clearly demonstrated as such in our worship service. When we have a Baptism, we begin our service with that and celebrate what God is doing through that water, while also highlighting the responsibility now given to the parents, godparents, and congregation. What is that responsibility? To *teach*!

Baptism is only done one time in the life of an individual. God's work is good and sufficient. However, being taught is quite the opposite. The teaching never stops! There is never a point in the life of a Christian that we have learned it all. We are **always** being taught! However, we are also being taught by our culture, society, and the world around us. Our schedules continue to be packed from sunrise to sunset, day in and day out. Suddenly, our yearning to learn has been satisfied not by the church, but by the world. 




Dear Zion Community.

Roman Apple Cake

Bake 350 degrees, 35 minutes

1 cup sugar

½ cup margarine/butter

1 egg

1½ cups flour

2 cups diced apples

¼ teasp. salt

½ cup milk

1 teasp vanilla

1 teasp soda



Cream sugar & margarine/butter. Add egg & mix well. Add dry ingredients with milk. Stir in vanilla. Fold in apples. Pour into a well greased 9x13 pan.

Struesel

3 Tbls. margarine/butter

½ teasp. Cinnamon

1 cup brown sugar

3 Tblsp. Flour

Mix & sprinke over cake batter. Then bake.

Cool off with these colorful Cran-Banana-Blueberry Ice Pops. They're refreshing and taste amazing!

Ingredients

- 2 cups fresh blueberries
- 2 ripe bananas

134 cups cranberry juice cocktail, divided

2 tablespoons honey (optional)

Instructions

Combine blueberries, bananas, and ¾ cup cranberry juice in blender; blend 20 seconds. Pour mixture through a fine-mesh strainer, pressing with spatula, to remove blueberry skins, if desired.



Life Project: Life Shines in Art

*

This project is presented by members, staff, and students of Zion Lutheran Church and School, Greenleaf, Wisconsin. Thank you to our Life Team at Zion Lutheran Church for sharing this project.

"Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them" (Romans 12:6).

Now, gifts are not just spiritual gifts. The two projects in this edition of *Directions* involve a gift from God that we sometimes overlook: artistic talent! The first project involves graphic arts and the second involves textile arts.

Life Theme Mural Art Project

Lisa Kalscheur, Christine Wyman, and Hillary Krahn, members and staff at Zion Lutheran Wayside Church and School, enlisted the help of their first through eighth grade students to create a "stained glass" mural that is ... are you ready for this? ... twenty feet long by three-and-a-half feet wide!



Between all the classes, this example of graphic art took about ten hours to complete. The process started with cutting paper...lots of paper. The "glass" is made up of colored card stock. The students cut the paper into geometric, "sort-of-triangular" shapes of different sizes, being careful not to have rounded corners on any of the pieces. The backboard is made of six pieces of black mat board, 32" x 40" each.

As the first step in the construction, Christine Wyman, their day school art teacher, freehanded the outlines of the words of John 1:4 across the mat boards. (Note: if your church(es) is interested in doing a project like this, Zion staff can provide size-appropriate letter templates if you give them the dimensions of your planned mural.)


