## LETTER FROM PASTOR

*Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,*

Prayer is a very important aspect of the Christian life. Scripture is littered with commands and encouragement to pray and to do so frequently. In Philippians 4:6 the Apostle Paul encourages us "do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." Also in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Throughout the Gospels we see Jesus teaching his disciples how to pray setting an example for them when he withdraws to pray on his own.

While we certainly have been commanded to pray, at the very same time, prayer is a gift. God, through Jesus Christ, has given us the opportunity to approach him directly and speak to him. What is even more amazing is that he has promised to hear us and answer us (1 John 5:14-15)! Our Heavenly Father cares about us. He cares about what is happening in our daily lives and is eager to hear about our joys, struggles, wants, and needs. Whatever is happening in our lives, good or bad, great or terrible; we should bring these things before the Lord. Just take a look at the Psalms and the wide range of prayers David offers. Among many other things, David laments (Ps. 3-7, 13), repents of his sins and asks for forgiveness (Ps. 22, 32, 51), and praises God for his mighty deeds (Ps. 8, 103, 145).

With all of this in mind, we encourage you to make prayer a part of your daily routine. If you don't know what to say or what to pray about, just open up the Psalms and start reading. There are 150 ready-made prayers that you can use to talk to God each and every day. Additionally, we will be making prayer a regular part of our church newsletter! Keep an eye out for our new "Prayer Corner". The Prayer Corner is a place where we will offer a short prayer each month that you may pray with us when you read the newsletter or even use throughout the month in your own personal prayer time.

We also welcome you to submit prayers for inclusion in the Prayer Corner. We are looking for short prayers that might be focused on God's Word, his community here at Zion, the wider community, or the world. If you would like to submit a prayer for the Prayer Corner you can email either one of us pastors or the church office with your prayer included. You may also write our prayer and drop it in the drop box outside the church office or just hand it to one of our staff. Be sure to label your prayer clearly so that we know it is ok to include it in the newsletter. We look forward to collectively strengthening the prayer life of our community and living out God's will for us through the Prayer Corner!

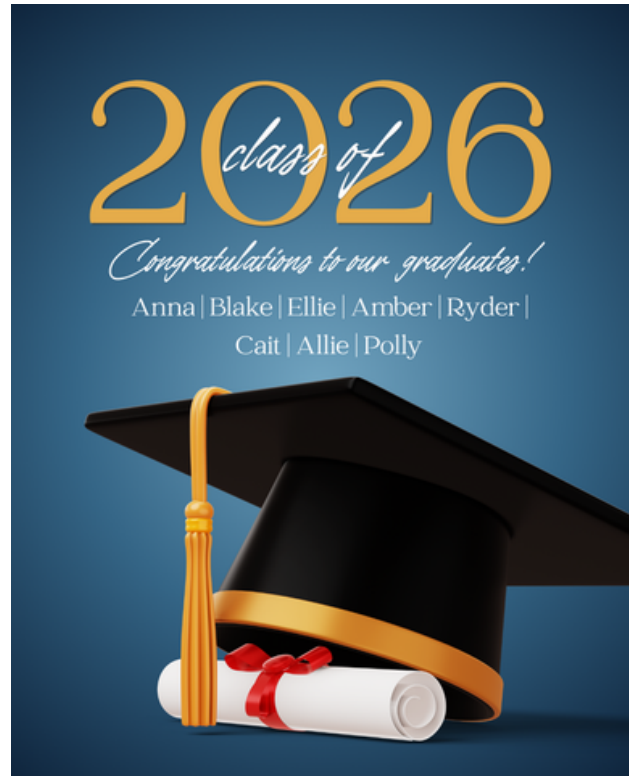
Greetings in our Lord and Savior,

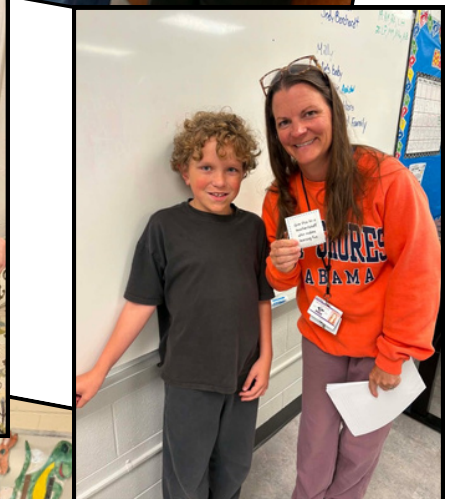
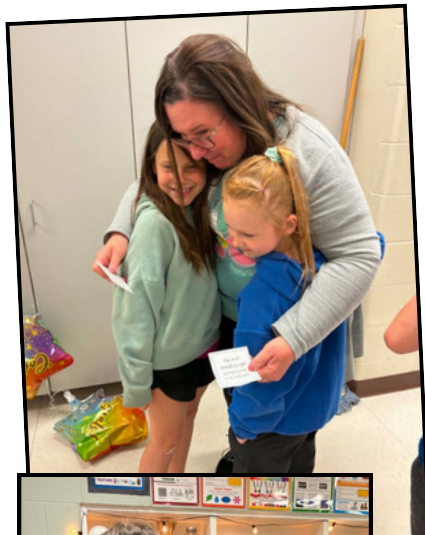

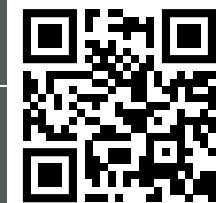

## Pineapple Chicken & Rice

### Ingredients

- 1 pt. Chicken breast, cubed
- 1 TBS olive oil
- 1 cup pineapple, cubed
- 1 onion, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 Red bell pepper diced
- 1 cup jasmine rice
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1 TBS soy sauce
- 1 TSP ginger, grated
- Salt & pepper to taste
- 1/4 cup green onions, sliced
- 1 TBS sesame seeds (leave out for Rachel)

### Directions:

In a large skillet, heat the olive oil over medium heat. Add the chicken cubes and cook until golden brown & cooked through. Remove the chicken and set aside.

In the same skillet, add ~~the~~ onion, garlic, and red bell pepper. Cook until the vegetables are softened. Add the pineapple and cook for an additional 2 minutes.

Stir in the jasmine rice, chicken broth, soy sauce, ginger, salt & pepper. Bring to boil. Reduce the heat to low, cover, and simmer for 18-20 minutes, or until the rice is cooked through. Return the chicken to the skillet, mix well, and heat through.

Serve garnished w/ green onions & sesame seeds.

Prep time 10 minutes | cooking time 30 minutes |

Total time: 40 minutes

Servings: 4 servings

## Cherry Topped Cheesecake

- 1 pkg. deluxe cake mix (yellow or white)
- 2 T. oil
- 2 pkg. - 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 4 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 3 T. lemon juice
- 3 t. vanilla
- 1 can (1 lb. 5 oz.) cherry pie filling

Preheat oven to 300 deg. Reserve 1 cup of dry cake mix. In large mixing bowl combine remaining cake mix, 1 egg & oil. Mixture will be crumbly. Press crust mixture evenly over bottom & 3/4 way up sides of greased 9x13 pan. In small bowl, blend cream cheese & sugar add 3 eggs & reserve cup cake mix. Beat 1 min. at medium speed. At slow speed slowly add milk & flavorings. Mix until smooth & pour in crust. Bake 300 deg. 45-55 min. till center is firm. Cool. Top with cherry pie filling. Chill. Serve.

**Abortion up to birth is now the law of the land in England and Wales.** What supporters call a “landmark moment” actually represents one of the most far-reaching and controversial shifts in abortion law in decades—done with minimal legislative time and scrutiny. Under changes introduced through the Crime and Policing Act, women who end their own pregnancies at any gestational age will no longer face investigation, arrest, or prosecution. Historic provisions under the Offences Against the Person Act of 1861 have effectively been set aside in this context, and those previously convicted are set to receive pardons. Tonia Antoniazzi, the Labour MP behind the amendment, acknowledged the backlash surrounding the change, including being targeted by protesters outside her office ... Peter Kearney, from the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC), said, “While proponents of this vile legislation are up in arms at the hostility directed at them, there is comparatively little acknowledgment of the real victims of violence—the babies destroyed in an abortion. 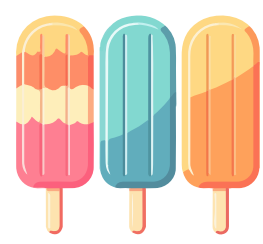

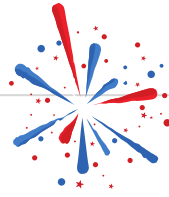

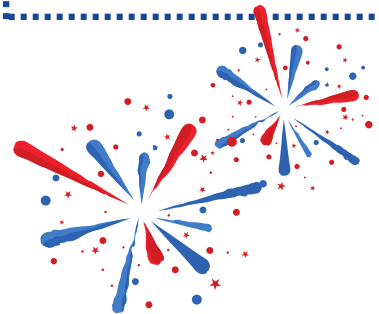
