LETTER FROM PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The wise king Solomon teaches in Ecclesiastes chapter 3, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." He then goes on to list the timing and the rhythm of life that God has ordained for his people beginning with "a time to be born, and a time to die." Solomon understands and gives voice to the reality that the things of God are eternal while the things of man are temporary and fleeting. He says, "All go to one place. All are from the dust, and to dust all return."

In just a few days, you will hear those words as a cross of ash is smeared across your forehead. "You are dust, and to dust you shall return." This Ash Wednesday tradition, in stark contrast to the normal more hopeful tone of our worship, is our entrance into the season of Lent. To use a fancy theological term, Lent is a season of penitence. In other words, Lent is a time in the church year when we focus on our sinfulness, the result of our sin (which is death), and our need for a savior. It is a time of deep reflection and prayer as we prepare to celebrate the death of Jesus Christ on Good Friday and his resurrection on Easter morning.

Although the season of Lent may be more somber in tone than much of the rest of our church year, the reflective nature of the season prepares us for the utter joy of our Easter celebrations. The black cross that you will receive on your forehead on Ash Wednesday serves as a dual reminder for you. Because of your sin, you will return to the dust of the earth in death; but because of your Savior, the dust is not your final resting place. The work of Jesus Christ on the cross saved you from your sin and his resurrection won for you eternal life.

As Solomon says, "For everything there is a time... a time to be born, and a time to die...a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn and a time to dance." The Lord has appointed a time for all things. He has appointed a time for each of us when our days in this life will cease. He has also appointed a time when our Savior will return to the earth. A time when, although we are dust, Jesus Christ will call us out of the grave. A time when time will no longer be a concern for us because we are living with God in his kingdom for eternity.

So, this Ash Wednesday, as you hear those solemn words "You are dust, and to dust you shall return" and as you feel the cross traced on your forehead, and when you are reminded of the cross a couple hours later when you accidentally smudge it across your shirt sleeve, I pray that you find hope in the fact that the Lord has appointed a time for all things. He has given us this Lenten season as a time for reflection and spiritual growth. He has given us forgiveness for all the times when we slip into sin. He has appointed a time when we will return to the dust. And there will come a day when the Son will return and we will be raised from the dust to everlasting life.

Especially how moms are even more influential than dads. Sorry dads, moms just are the nurturers in the house! How much more equipped would you be as a parent if you are having your cup filled as well, and getting your faith questions answered by your church? It would be great to receive the tools you need

to nourish your children's faith life right? Then when they ask you the hard questions about what we confess as they're learning in confirmation, you'll be able to have a meaningful, faith-driven conversation with them. That being said, what do you need in your life as a parent to help you be a teacher of faith in your house? Are those transitions in life a struggle? I've been through a few myself, and it was hard! Especially the latest with my oldest becoming a full-fledged middleschooler, cell-phone, voice change and all. Or, is it questions about what we profess as confessional Lutherans? Maybe you're rusty on what you learned in Catechism. Maybe it's simply starting a devotional or prayer life as a family. Let me know, I look forward to hearing from you.

That being said, our initial plan is a general Adult Bible study. Which, trust me, as someone who sits in on Thursday Bible study, you will enjoy the mix of ages more than you would think. Each generation has different experiences, but we are all united in Christ when we go to the Word together. No question in Bible Study is ever wrong, discussion is always welcome! Our Zion members have proven to be loving and respectful, and I think that's amazing! I would like to hear from you in the meantime about what you would like, so that in the future, I can be helping our pastors work toward equipping **all** generations for life in Christ.



YIELDS 10

{Recipe} Weight Watcher's Frozen Cappuccino Pie



One serving is 8 PointsPlus with Weight Watcher's.

20 min 20 min

Ingredients

- 8 oz low fat cream cheese, softened
- 14 oz fat free sweetened condensed milk
- 6 Tbsp chocolate syrup
- 2 Tbsp instant coffee
- 1 Tbsp hot water
- 1-1/2 cups fat free whipped topping, thawed
- 6oz pie crust, chocolate flavored or regular

Instructions

- Place cream cheese in a medium bowl and beat with an electric mixer until fluffy. Add in the sweetened condensed milk and 4 tablespoons of the chocolate syrup. Beat mixture on low speed until blended.
- In a small bowl, dissolve the instant coffee in the hot water. Add to the cream cheese mixture. Stir in the whipped topping mixture and pour into the crust.
- 3. Cover and freeze overnight.
- 4. Serving Let sit out about 10 min before serving. Drizzle with the remaining at checklate syrup 10pcs.



SLOW COOKER CREAM CHEESE CRACK CHICKEN CHILI

Author: <u>Plain Chicken</u> Yield: 8 people

Prep Time 5 mins | Cook Time 6 hrs | Total Time 6 hrs 5 mins

Slow Cooker Cream Cheese Crack Chicken Chili - this stuff is AMAZING! We've made it 3 times this month! We can't get enough of it!!! Chicken, corn, black beans, chicken broth, diced tomatoes and green chiles, cumin, chili powder, onion, ranch seasoning, bacon and cheddar cheese. We served the chili with some cornbread and Fritos. PERFECT! This is already on the menu again this weekend! YUM! #crockpot #slowcooker #chicken #chili

Equipment:

- <u>6-qt Slow Cooker</u>
- Cutting Board
- Rotary Cheese Grater

Ingredients:


- 2 boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 1 (11-oz) can corn, drained
- 1 (15-oz) black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 (10-oz) diced tomatoes and green chilies, undrained
- 2 cups <u>chicken broth</u>
- 1 cup cooked chopped bacon
- 1 (1-oz) package ranch dressing mix
- 1 tsp cumin
- 1 Tbsp <u>chili powder</u>
- 1 tsp onion powder
- 1 (8-oz) package cream cheese
- 1 cup <u>shredded cheddar cheese</u>

Instructions:

- 1. Place chicken at bottom of slow cooker.
- 2. Add corn, black beans, diced tomatoes and green chilies, chicken broth, cumin, chili powder, onion powder ranch seasoning and bacon. Stir together. Place cream cheese on top of chicken.
- 3. Cover with lid and cook on LOW for 6-8 hours.
- 4. Remove chicken from slow cooker and shred with 2 forks. Return to slow cooker. Stir cheddar cheese into chili.

Notes:

- · Philadelphia brand cream cheese melts best in this recipe.
- If needed, use a whisk to fully incorporate the cream cheese.

Alex Schadenberg: On December 11, 2024, Canada's Ministry of Health released the Fifth Annual Report on Medical Assistance in Dving, which found that there were 15,343 reported euthanasia deaths, representing 4.7% of all deaths in 2023. The number of Canadian euthanasia deaths was up from 13.241 in 2022 and 10.092 in 2021. Based on the 2024 MAiD data from Ontario and Alberta, I predict that there were approximately 16,600 Canadian euthanasia deaths in 2024. How did I make my prediction? The Office of the Chief Coroner of Ontario released the December 2024 MAiD data, which indicated that there were 4,957 reported euthanasia deaths in 2024, which is up from 4,641 in 2023 and 3,934 in 2022. Ontario represents almost 40% of Canada's population. The data indicates that, as of December 31, 2024, there have been 23,333 Ontario euthanasia deaths since legalization. The city of Alliston had a population of 23,253 in 2021. Alberta Health Services released their MAiD data, indicating that there were 1,116 reported euthanasia deaths in 2024, which is up from 977 in 2023 and 836 in 2022 ... [We] will be trying to obtain the provincial euthanasia data to provide insight into Canada's experience with killing.
