Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Just a few minutes before sitting down to write this newsletter article, I stopped in our meeting room to drop off some cookies and banana bread (made by our wonderful deaconess intern, Lisa) that were leftover treats from our ZYP group's Sunday morning Bible study. Our 6th grade class happened to be in the meeting room when I went in and they informed me that it was National Banana Bread Day. I had no idea that such a day existed. Upon doing a little more research, I learned that (depending on what website you follow) every day is a "holiday" for about 20 or 30 different things. Take February 23rd, the day I am writing this, for example. After all, it can be difficult to find joy and excitement in our daily routine. Day after day,

and week after week we are often filling our days with essentially the same activities. Having a steady routine is not a bad thing, but it certainly can lead to a lack of energy, excitement, and joy as we face each new day.

Do celebrations like National Dog Biscuit Day (I promise I'm not making this up) really inject much joy into our lives? Maybe if you're a golden retriever. For the rest of us, we have a much greater source of joy that is able to fill every day with energy, excitement, and meaning. Psalm 118 is a song of thanksgiving to God for the many great things he has done for us, things that should give us joy every day. In fact, verse 24 says, *"This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."*

Each and every day is a gift from God, a new opportunity to serve our neighbor, praise God, and live with joy. Throughout the month of March, as we walk through the rather somber season of Lent, we are inching closer and closer to the joyous celebration of Easter, that great new day when Jesus Christ rose from the dead. Hello Zion Family,


There are a lot of shows out on TV and streaming that pit contestants against each other to be the greatest, fastest, hold out the longest, etc. One show we watch at our house is called “Alone”. The premise of “Alone” is that 10 people with extreme survival skills are dropped into an unforgiving wilderness to see how long they can survive in an attempt to win a half million dollars. They have to hunt, fish, build a shelter, survive cold temperatures, weird illnesses, and loneliness. Each contestant is allowed to bring 10 items to survive. These items usually include axes, paracord, utility knives, a tarp, etc. The season we just watched had a winner that survived 84 days in the arctic circle!

When I think about a long stretch of time that we want to be prepared for in our own lives, my mind goes to Lent and the 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter. 40 days of reflecting on sacrifice, perhaps giving up something in our own lives. 40 days of watching Jesus at work, seeing his agony of trial and crucifixion, and then rejoicing as the 40 days is over and he is risen! Like the Alone contestants, we can have a kit prepared for Lent as a reminder of what it’s all about and the prize we have at the end. What would you pack in your 40 day kit for Lent? Here’s my list of 10 items that I’d bring and why:

1. Heart - John 3:16
2. Candle - John 1:5
3. Shell - Matthew 3:16-17
4. Sand - Matthew 4:1-2
5. Ashes - Genesis 3:19
6. Palm - John 12:13
7. Coins - Matthew 26:14-15
8. Purple - Matthew 27:28-29
9. Cross - John 19:16-17
10. Rock - Matthew 28:2

As we go through Lent, have your kit packed with reminders of why we observe this season. As we get to Easter, we can all celebrate our victory! We win because Christ won! His victory over death is our victory over death! What we have won at the end of the 40 days is much greater than anything the winners on TV are awarded. We don’t need the half million dollars (though it would be nice) because we have the award of everlasting life. Blessings on your season of Lent. May it be a time of reflection and at the end, celebration.





Combine all these and put in a percolator.


To the basket of percolator:

Gma's ginger Crinkle Cookies

3/4 cup vegetable oil
 1 cup granulated sugar
 1 egg
 1/4 cup light molasses
 2 cups all-purpose flour
 2 teaspoons baking soda

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 Granulated sugar

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. In large bowl, whisk together oil and sugar. Add egg and molasses; mix well. In separate bowl, sift together flour, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves, ginger and salt; add gradually to sugar mixture, mixing well. Shape teaspoonfuls of dough into 1-inch balls; roll in sugar. Place on parchment paper-lined baking sheets. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes. Cool on wire cooling racks. Makes about 4 dozen.



Approximately 10,000 people, many of them young adults and families, gathered in Paris, France, on January 18 for the annual March for Life to publicly oppose abortion. The participants also spoke up against euthanasia amid ongoing bioethical debates in France. The peaceful demonstration began at Place Vauban in front of the Invalides palace and proceeded through the streets of the capital. Organizers described a family-friendly, resolute atmosphere, with participants carrying signs promoting life and a banner reading “Treat and support, never suppress.” The march came two years after France became the first country in the world to enshrine abortion as a constitutional right in 2024. That amendment, incorporated on March 8, 2024, followed a 780-72 vote in a joint session of parliament. Pro-life advocates viewed the change as elevating abortion to a protected status, shifting it from a once-criminal act to a fundamental right. This year’s event also highlighted opposition to pending Senate discussions on legislation that would legalize euthanasia and assisted suicide, which organizers framed as a “licence to kill.” Marie-Lys Pellissier, the 24-year-old spokeswoman for the March for Life in France, said, “It is the only moment in the year when we can publicly express our opposition to abortion and euthanasia and propose concrete solutions.” (Read more: tinyurl.com/59ekc4ky)




